



Since this interview with Paul Bailoff was conducted, EXODUS canceled their tour with EXC-ITER in Canada because EXCITER has disbanded.

MT: WHY THE TITLE CHANGE FROM "A LESSON IN VIOLENCE"?

PB: The cover for "A Lesson In Violence" was like totally screwed up and it was Gary's idea to have the babies but we didn't have our artist draw it we had another one and they fucked up too.

MT: DO THOSE BABIES SYMBOLIZE ANYTHING IN PARTICULAR?

PB: Not really.....they're just bonded by blood!

MT: WAS IT HARD TO PICK THE SONGS TO INCLUDE ON THE L.P. CONSID-ERING THAT SONGS LIKE "HELL'S BREATH", "DEATH ROW", AND "IM-PALER" WERE ALL LEFT OUT AND WILL THESE SONGS EVER BE ON VINYL IN THE FUTURE?

PB: That's a good question. No it wasn't hard because songs like "Hell's Breath" and "Impaler" have riffs that were written by Kirk Hammett that METALLICA are using right now so we'd have to change the song and take out the parts Kirk wrote. "Death Row" will probably be on vinyl, though.

MT: WHAT WILL IT BE ON?

PB: It might be on an e.p. coming up.

MT: HOW DO YOU FELL ABOUT ALL THE POSERS THAT GO TO YOUR GIGS?

PB: Well to make money you've gotta have some posers because there's not enough metalheads in the world to make any money. So if the posers go they're gonna get beaten on, you know. What fun would I have if posers didn't go?

MT: HOW DO YOU FEEL ABOUT PEOPLE THAT YELL "PAUL IS GOD!"?

PB: Take their money, take their drugs, and laugh!

MT: GARY SAID IN METAL FORCES THAT THE NEXT ALBUM IS GOING TO BE MORE COMMERCIAL.

PB: Wrong!
MT: WRONG?
PB: Wrong!
MT: GOOD!!!!

PB: I've been apologizing for that for the longest time. Everytime someone gives me an interview they give me all this shit. No way it's gonna be way heavier.

MT: DO YOU HAVE A FAVORITE PLACE TO PLAY?

PB: I dunno, for real fuckin' thrash show's I like Ruthie's Inn and for killer shows I like the Kabuki.

MT: WHAT DO YOU THINK ABOUT THE KABUKI SECURITY?

PB: I think we should take their money and take their drugs!
MT: DO YOU FEEL THAT THIS EXODUS RIGHT NOW IS THE ONE THAT WILL

BE AROUND FOREVER?

PB: Yeah we definetley feel that for sure. Unless somebody broke his leg or got a haircut, we don't know if we could go for that or any thing. Barring any outrageous circumstances we're totally happy with it.

MT: TELL US ABOUT YOUR UPCOMING TOUR.

PB: We're starting off playing with EXCITER up north in like Washington and Oregon then we're going to Canada and we'll have like 13 dates there. Then we'll go over to Boston and New York and stop to record an e.p. in New York.

MT: ANY NEW SONGS?

PB: Yeah, the e.p. will probably have two live songs. And you know ANGELWITCH? We're gonna do a cover of that song "Angel of Death".

MT: WHAT'S THE E.P. GOING TO BE CALLED?

PB: Probably "Violence Breeds Violence".

MT: WHY DON'T YOU PLAY VERY MANY OLD SONGS LIKE "ENDER" AND STUFF?

PB: Cause they smell like poo poo!

MT: NO WAY! "DEATH ROW" IS MY FAVORITE!

PB: "Death Row" is cool but "Ender" sucks! It sounds like JUDAS PRIEST!

MT: HAS THE L.P. BEEN SELLING UP TO YOUR EXPECTATIONS?

PB: Yeah it's been selling phenominally. I'll be makin' a lot of money!

MT: IS IT SELLING MOST IN THE U.S.?

PB: It's just about even between Europe and U.S.

MT: WHO THOUGHT UP THE IDEA FOR THE "SLAY TEAM" T-SHIRTS?

PB: That's our artist, my girlfriend. She does all this real gnarly shit. You should see some of the crap in my room! It's all bloody blades and disgusting putrid garbage, I love it!

MT: WHAT ARE YOUR FAVORITE BANDS?

PB: METALLICA, SLAYER, MERCYFUL FATE, LEGACY, DEATH ANGEL and all the cool local bands.

MT: AFTER THE NEXT ALBUM ARE YOU GOING TO GO LIKE PROMO EVERY-THING? POSTERS AND VIDEOS AND STUFF?

PB: Yeah we're gonna have posters before the next album. We took some shots for it a couple of weeks ago. And there is a live video of us in New York with SLAYER.

MT: HAVE YOU BEEN WRITING ANY NEW SONGS?

PB: "Pleasures of the Flesh" is new and we've already played that.
Also "Parasite" and "Speed Freak" are new.

MT: IS THE EAST COAST AS VIOLENT AS THE BAY AREA?

PB: No way!!! No way, I mean they yell real good, they're good at that but they don't have any violence in them at all! I mean you don't see no pit, nobody gets killed, no blood up on the stage!

MT: DO YOU FEEL THAT THE BAY AREA THRASHERS MADE EXODUS WHAT

THEY ARE TODAY?

PB: Definetley. Those are the people that will stick by us no matter what. The stupid posers won't go if it's not at the Kabuki or the Stone they won't go because they're too scared.
MT: TELL US ABOUT THIS HOTEL ROOM THAT YOU WRECKED WITH SLAYER.

PB: Well it's like they were there and they're like really good friends of ours and once they left they gave us permission they said we could destroy the hotel room and they didn't have any idea we'd destroy it nearly that bad! We took the walls off and made like tunnels from the bathroom to the living room. It was real fun!

MT: WHAT'S YOUR FAVORITE WAY OF KILLING POSERS?

PB: There's so many good ones! I guees a plain knife to the head real slow, put a few slits and then let him bleed to death then start hacking him up mercifully. Leave him in pieces!

MT: ANY LAST WORDS?

PB: Yeah, just kill all posers, every last one of them and I'll be happy!

CORROSION OF CONFORMITY was born in June of 1982 in lead guitarist Woody Wallerman's basement.

"Yeah, we thought what the fuck let's start a band. We were pretty bored and it seemed like a fun thing to do at the time."

When C.O.C. started they were a four piece with one of many singers.

"None of us really knew how to play that well, but we managed to come up with some pretty cool stuff" said drummer Reed Mullin.

They were influenced by early D.C. bands (BAD BRAINS, MINOR BLACK SABBATH, BLACK

THREAT, etc.), FLAG. CIRCLE JERKS.

In 1982 C.O.C. was on "No Core Compilation Tape", a four band compilation which they had 16 songs on.

In early '83 they started playing a few shows in Richmond and later during the summer they did a tour with NO LABELS (also from Raleigh).

"Woody and I (Reed) were in NO LABELS, so that made it real easy to tour with them." On that tour they played with SUICIDAL TENDENCIES, FAITH, and YOUTH BRIGADE. When the tour got back to North Carolina NO LABELS decided to call it quits which left C.O.C. alot of space.

Since then they have been on another compilation: "Why Are We Here" and they have produced and marketed "Eye For An Eye", their debut album. Recently they were feature on Pushead's (Maximum Rock 'N' Roll) compilation "Cleanse the Bacteria" with the song "Kiss Of Death" from their just released album "Animosity". They were almost going to be on "Metal Massacre Vol. 6" but instead Brian Slagel ended up saying "Let's do an album".

"We had five songs already recorded and we went out to California to do five more. We got a sound that we really like, it sounds alot better than that first thing."

"Animosity" was just released on Death Records.

"I think it will appeal to both crowds" says Woody.

"Anyways if anyone is into SLAYER (who kill everybody), META-LLICA, EXODUS, VENOM, DISCHARGE, TROUBLE, MOTORHEAD, or POSSESSED write me (Reed) or Woody."

ROBBIE WEIS

WHIPLASH was formed out of the ashes of JACKHAMMER, when Tony Portaro (guitar), T.J. Scaglione (drums), and Rob Harding (bass) decided to leave the band and form WHIPLASH. Soon after vocalist Mike Orosz joined the band. They soon went into the studio to record the band's first demo entitled "Full Force".

Tony and T.J. decided to dump Rob and Mike and look for a new bassist and lead vocalist. After numerous auditions the duo could not find the right people and finally decided to do a new tape themselves. The new demo, entitled "Thunderstruk", was recorded in 11½ hours at Reel Platinum Studios in New Jersey. Tony handled guitar, bass, and vocals and T.J. on drums. Both produced the demo as well. After it was finished Tony Bono joined as a bassist. Here is a short interview with T.J.

MT: HOW DID YOU COME UP WITH THE NAME WHIPLASH?

TJ: We are all really into METALLICA, but the name really came from a cartoon character called Snydley Whiplash. He was from some Underdog cartoon, but the name really fits us!!!!

MT: WHAT DOES THE RECORDING SITUATION LOOK LIKE?

TJ: We are now recording our first e.p. called "Looking Death In The Face". All I can say is that it will blow your head off! It should be out by late September. Some of the tracks are "Last Man Alive", "Thrashing Death", new version of "Spit On Your Grave", "Respect the Dead", and "Stirrin' the Cauldron".

MT: ARE YOU PLANNING ON DOING A TOUR?

TJ: We are planning to do a small tour after the e.p. is out. Maybe to Chicago, Cleaveland, some dates in New York, and then we hope to go to San Francisco where the true thrashers are.

MT: WHAT IS THE AVERAGE AGE OF THE GROUP?

TJ: Tony Portaro is 24, Tony Bono is 21, and I am 18.

MT: ANY FINAL COMMENTS?

TJ: Yes, when there is no room left in Hell the dead will walk the Earth.

LAIN ANGEL

IRON ANGEL were formed by Mike Matthes (drums) and Thorsten Lohmann (bass) from the ruins of a band called METAL GODS in the year of 1983. Soon guitarists Sven Struven and Peter Wittke joined the band and became known as IRON ANGEL. Yet the line up was still incomplete as none of the members had any talent to sing. After a short time a friend of the band named Dirk Schroder came to watch the band reherse. He was so filled with enthusiasm that he picked up the mike and began to sing with a raging passion rarely heard in their home of Germany. Without hesitation Dirk was named their lead singer. With great energy they began to study some songs and decided on their musical direction which was to be Thrash Speed/ Black Metal. By the end of '83 the band were ready for their first gig which they played with two groups from Hamburg. The small crowd didn't let the band off the stage until they had completed five encores. In January of '84 the band recorded their first demo which contained the songs "Intro: Open the Gate", "Devil's Gate", "Rush of Power", "Maniac of the Night", "Sea of Flames", "Wife of the Devil", and "Hounds of Hell". After a short time IRON ANGEL recorded their second demo entitled "Legions of Evil" that included more raging thrash like "The Metallian", "Legions of Evil", "Church of the Lost Souls", "Sinner 666", "Heavy Metal Soldiers", and a live version of their stage classic "Rush of Power". These two demos were met by great approval espeacially in the US where they recieved great airplay by underground radio such as WBCR in New York. On December 1st IRON ANGEL played for the first time out of Hamburg. They played in Essen with SODOM and DESTRUCTION and again with DESTRUCTION in early '85. In Febuary the band was offered a contract with Steamhammer Records which they immediatly took. The album will be out by the time you read this and is entitled "Hellish Crossfire" and contains six songs from their demos as well as "Black Mass", "Hunter In Chains", and "Nightmare".

MT: WHEN DID DARK ANGEL FORM?

EM: The nucleus of DARK ANGEL

was formed in early '83.

This consisted of Jim

Durkin, Rob Yahn, and Don

Doty. A steady drummer and

second guitarist are what kept the band from being

huge a long time ago. Jack Shwartz was (drums) was replaced by Gene Hoglan about 3 or 4 months ago and I joined in May 184.

MT: WHERE DID YOU GET THE NAME?

EM: The boys were just trying to think up a name and that's what they came up with.

MT: WHO ARE THE BAND'S MEMBERS? EM: Eric Meyer, Gene Hoglan, Jim Durkin, Rob Yahn, and Don Doty.

MT: WHO DID YOU PLAY YOUR FIRST GIG WITH?

EM: DARK ANGEL gigged alot in the old days when they first for-



med but then they went into hiding to get things better organized. We played our first gig after recording the album in Berkeley at Ruthie's Inn with POSSESSED, AGENT STEEL, and BLIZZARD.

MT: DO YOU HAVE A FAVORITE GIG AND IF SO WHAT WAS SO SPECIAL

ABOUT IT?

EM: It's hard for me to pinpoint a favorite gig because there e so many variables involved. Like a good line up of bands, our performance, the crowd, the pay, etc. We played at Radio City with SLAYER and POSSESSED. That was sold out and about 200 degrees inside, but it was kinda fun. Playin' in 'Frisco was pretty fuckin' rad, too.

MT: WHAT ARE THE BANDS INFLUENCES?

EM: We are obviously influenced by the faster metal bands too numerous to mention. Now we really don't concern ourselves that much with other band's music in terms of influence, we're just really going our own direction which is way fuckin' radder than the album.

MT: WHAT BANDS DO YOU ADMIRE?

EM: I personally have admirationand envy for bands that are farther ahead doing the same kind of music that we are, like METALLICA or SLAYER.

: WHAT ARE YOUR GOALS AS A BAND?

4: Our goals are to play the raddest fuckin' music we can, while still giving it some musical value. So many of the newer Speed Metal bands I've heard (and don't care to mention) are just a pile of fuckin' garbage that are going to ruin Speed Metal.

MT: IS INTERNATIONAL SUCCESS VERY IMPORTANT TO YOU?

EM: International success is great for us, or any band obviously. Royalties from the album will be a fantastic boost for keeping the band alive, and hopefully we'll be able to make it overseas soon.

MT: DO YOU FEEL THAT DARK ANGEL IS A BAND THAT CAN BECOME VERY POPULAR?

EM: I feel DARK ANGEL can become very popular. We play hardcore Speed Metal, but everybody in the band are very capable musicians. Our songs aren't just a thrown together binch of shit with everybody trying to play as fast as they can so that we can be the "fastest metal band". To me that doesn't mean fuckin' anything. Bands now are playing so fast, and some even have incompetent musicians. It's like punk rock was years ago, with everybody throwing together a band to jump on the bandwagon. We have more and more fans at every show, and their dedication is fuckin' unbelievable. With their support tow DARK ANGEL will have a promising future.

and a half ago by


guitarist Mike Torrao (21) and drummer Mike Sus (20). They soon aquired

Brian Montane as a second guitarist and Jeff Baccera (17) on bass


who then took over the vocals after the band was unable to find a singer. Songs were written by Torrao (the band's chief songwriter) like "Swing of the Axe" and "Death Metal". "Yeah, right from the start we had always wanted to be a Death Metal band", says Jeff.

In March and April of 1984 the band entered Stone Lake Studios in Richmond to record what was to become a classic three track demo among the Death Metal underground. The demo featured the songs "Death Metal", "Evil Warriors", and "Burning In Hell". The highlight of this tape was the unrelenting throat noises of Jeff, this guy puts all other

Death Metal singers to shame!









POSSESSED played

their debut gig in May of that
year with BLIZZARD, SLAYER,
and EXODUS. Shorly after that
Brian was kicked out. When
asked why Torrao replies "Brian
was an asshole. He didn't want to do

what the band wanted and he had a really negative attitude.

He didn't like any of the Satanic crap, he was into like CULTURE CLUB. So we gave Larry Lolonde from BLIZZARD a try because he seemed to really want to do the same thing we wanted to. In a way we didn't want him because we really didn't want another young guy in the band (Larry is 17) but he just worked out really well and learned all the songs in like a week".

"I recorded two demos with BLIZZARD", says Larry, "but they really didn't get anywhere. BLIZZARD was just your average ME TALLICA/EXODUS kind of band".

"I'd say we're basically influenced by VENOM and EXODUS with the METALLICA thrown in" says Torrao. And why don't they to be the "heaviest metal band in the world" like so many hands do? "Most bands that say that just sound like a bunch se" replies Jeff, "they just sound like crap. We just want to let people judge us for themselves".

As far as 1985 goes, the band were featured on Metal Blade's "Metal Massacre Volume 6" compilation with the song "Swing of the Axe". They were also signed by Combat Records this year.

"Yeah Combat came to us." explains Torrao, "They got in touch with us through our old manager Peter Schnell. Apparently they wanted to sign another San Francisco Thrash Metal band like they did with EXODUS". Are you sure they wanted you and not just any San Francisco band? "Oh yeah they definetley wanted us" responds Mike, "because there are a few other bands they could have taken. They set up the contract with our new manger Debbie".

That album, entitled "The Seven Churches", should be in the stores by the time you read this, judging from the advance tape I must say that it will be one of the most intense pieces of Death Metal vinyl ever released. "But the album will kill the advance tape!" exclaims Mike.

Earlier this year the band went down to Southern California and played a couple dates, one being with SAVAGE GRACE, DARK ANGEL, and CORROSION OF CONFORMITY. In late August the band played some shows with SLAYER in Sacramento and in Oregon. But will they embark on a major tour soon? "Hopefully. Right now we just want to get the album out" says Larry.

And what does the future hold for POSSESSED? After the l.p. is released their next step will be to tour and then begin work on their next album. "We have some new songs that will be on the next album like "No Will To Live", "Turbulation", and "Beyond The Gates". We have another one, but we don't have a name for it yet" Larry says.

A young band with this much going for them must have a lot to say to the world. After a long pause of deep concentration Larry bursts out "don't listen to MOTLEY CRUE!!!!! I hate them more than anything!".

Don't worry, Larry, don't worry.....

The METALLIC THRASH crew recently had the extreme pleasure of meeting with some of the nicest guys and coolest people in Thrash today at the prestigious Prairie Sun Studios. This interview was conducted with the band and their manager Alexis Olson.

MT: WHO ARE THE BAND'S MEMBERS?

ZT: I'm Zetro on vocals, Eric Peterson on rhythm guitar, Greggy Christian on bass, Mike Ronketti but his real name is Rotweiller cuz' a Rot is the toughest dog in the world and he is the toughest drummer in the world, and finally Alex "Skullwrecker" Skullneck on lead guitar. Ah, Rot. Look at that mug growl, just look at that kid! What you see here is just the ultimate weapon, there is no changing any part of this at all. This is just an arsenal like you would t believe. And now we have Alex and Rot who have made 150% contribution and Alex is only 16 and we can honestly say that he is the best guitarist around for his age. He's been playing since he was 5!

MT: WHAT WERE THE REASONS OF THE OLD DRUMMER'S DEPARTURE?

AO: He hadda baby.

ZT: Well he had a kid and a girlfriend that he had to take care of. You know he could'nt play heavy met'l anymore. And it was too bad that he had to leave, but you know I think it's better now because we would'nt be able to do projects like this and now we have Rotweiller on drums and Rotweiller just overkills on the drums so I think we're more pleased with Rot.

MT: WHY COULD'NT YOU DO PROJECTS LIKE THIS WITH LOUIE?

ZT: Well he had like a responsibility at home and he was a real fuckin' cry baby. It was like "the kid man, I gotta go. I gotta go change the diapers. Anna would trip, I could'nt leave." I mean if we had to go leave for three days for a tour or go to L.A. or do something, you know he would'nt be able todo it if he was with us. In the demo deal he would already be home because Rot has already finished his drum tracks up here since we've been here and if it was Louie he would have already been home and Rot is just stayin' up here to get drunk and pilliage with us.

MT: SO WHY ISN'T ROT WITH BLACK ANGEL?

RT: Um well that's just a big head trip, man. They just all fuckin' lost interest after I sold my set because I was plan-ning on buying a new kit. And then they just all split apart man, lost interest so I said fuck you I'm going my own way and you know we left it at that.

MT: WHAY HAVE YOU BEEN OUT OF THE SCENE LATELY?

ZT: Well other than that Ruthie's show we just played. Louie left the band in late January. We had like three killer parties at our studio and it was like "see ya' later" and then in like three months we could'nt find a studio and we had no where to practice and we didn't want to come out and just play shit, so we cracked down in the beginning of April, got in a studio, pounded out, wrote another new tune, pounded out all the rest, and we worked over a couple of

old songs that we used to play that are just fast as fuck, you know 150 mph songs here, and we're working in those and the next time we come out on the 27th at Ruthie's, the demo release party, with CONTROL is going to be thrashing mayhem.

MT: WHAT SONGS ARE ON THE DEMO?

ZT: "Raging Waters", "Burnt Offerings", "Alone In The Dark", and then "Reign of Terror". It's going to be a very pounding demo.

MT: ANY PLANS FOR A VINYL RELEASE AFTER THIS?

ZT: Well of course we'd love to get signed, but we don't want to get screwed on a label. You know, like "Okay here's what we're gonna give you. I'm not going to give you a tour or anything else.

MT: KINDA LIKE A LAAZ ROCKIT DEAL. ZT: Beautiful example, beautiful.

MT: WHERE DO YOU HAVE A STRONGER FOLLOWING, BERKELEY OR S.F.?

AO: Berkeley.

ZT: Berkeley but I think that our S.F. shows don't show. Like we've played with LAAZ three times in the city and then one time with MORDRED. The times with LAAZ the real thrashers loved us, the mediocre people that were there to bang or pose hated us. The show with MORDRED was a late night at the Mab and it drew pretty well but I think it

drew more for MORDRED.

MT: WASN'T THAT SHOW WITH TECHNICAL DREAM?

: TERMINAL SHOCK!

ZT: TECHNICAL DREAM???? Good call! That was close! I like that a lot better, I think they should change their name.

AO: Our main problem was that we were up against POSSESSED and SUICIDAL TENDENCIES at Ruthie's.

ZT: POSSESSED was supposed to play with us but then they called and said we can't play with you because they knew the draw was going to be at Ruthie's. We still brought in three hundred in on a late night show with like still two other gigs going on so we were pleased.

MT: HOW LONG IS YOUR CURRENT LIVE SET?

EP: 45-60 minutes. It's growing every time and we threw in "Johnny Be Good" last time.

ZT: Which with did after like two days of practicing. And the crowd was back at us "go, go, go". It was like Chuck Berry eat your heart out!

MT: WHAT ARE YOUR INFLUENCES?
