I heard that he's also member of Infernö....).* Pazuzu's (Austria) second CD is out when you read this.*Bifrost splitted up, but their singer is still active with HAMMERHEART Records though. * Graveland are working on their follow-up album for "Thousand Swords"... hope those guys will change their image to the better with their new album.* Martyrdom are going to record their debut album soon.... remember "Especially for the old Headbangers and Thrashers"! I'm curious...* Inner Sanctum had some line-up problems, but they are still alive.* Kampfar have signed to MALICIOUS Records for two CDs,* Usurper released a MCD on NECROPOLIS Records, and will probably tour Europe this year, so I hope to see them.*
Cultus Sanguine broke their contract with Full Moon Productions.* Amon Goeth seem to have serious line-up problems, but I hope that they won't cease to exist because of this. Their new CD "The Worship" will be out very soon, and relating to the advance tape that I heard I can promise you that their new material is much better than "Call The Master" was. Expect nothing but original Czech Black/ Death Metal art! * Enslaved will release their new LP "Eld" very soon. *Pazuzu (US) had (have ?) a lot of line-up problems , but Tony keeps this band alive. * Destroyer 666 released their album which especially fans of sheer brutal Black/ Death Metal (with touches of dirty Thrash) will enjoy. This album is dedicated to old Beherit, Burzum and Destruction....says it all! Get the LP version as it includes one bonus track! * Mark Mackay, the maniac who did the CELTIC FROST report in #3, had a good year in 1996 as he went to see a couple of Kiss-reunion shows... and that meant a lot to him as he's a big Kiss fan. * Everybody is shouting at UNISOUND from Greece. I was told (by several people) that this label isn't as honest as it used to be... who knows? But be careful, ok? * Sadistic Intent's album "Second coming... Of Darkness" is delayed, but I heard some advance-tracks for it, and their stuff is deathlier than ever. Real morbid stuff, so dark Death Metal lunatics should be ready for it! * VOICES FROM THE DARKSIDE magazine takes a break, but I'm sure that Frank will release his 10th issue sooner than we think, because I know that he's a workoholic... Beside his magazine, he now also runs a label, and started to work and write for ROCK HARD and the E.M.P. mailorder catalogue. * Gehenna have released their third CD now with "Malice", and have developed to one of the most beloved acts from Norway. * Asphyx have released their very first, but unreleased album "Embrace the Death", and all Death Metal people should have their copy of it. It's a KILLER-CD !!! * Bathory's new (old ?) album is announced to be released in August, so be warned. Let's hope that we shouldn't expect another album à la "Octagon" to be released! The Quorthon solo -stuff will be out soon as well. * Holocausto of Nuclear Vengeance, the mastermind behind the once so mighty Beherit declared this Black/ Death Metal legend as dead. But for all those who missed to buy Beherit's "Messe De Morte" 7'inch should look forward to buying its re-release on CD. * Emperor prepare their return. The first messanger is a new 12'inch/ ?'inch, but their new songs are different from their old ones, so be warned !* Countess are still alive and will tour in May through Germany together with their mates from Barathrum and the old Japanese Black Thrashing Death Metal horde Sabbat (!!!). Those who are tired of most of today's Black/ Death Metal shows should try to go and see this package, because I'm sure that they won't see usual bands. Countess will also release a new MCD after this tour. *Another German tour that will probably turn into reality in June is the one with Mortuary Drape, Unpure and Decayed... Three bands that are not unknown to in depth-reading TALES OF THE MACABRE readers. Perhaps another tour worth to see ?! * More tournews: Absu will tour Europe very soon together with Enslaved. * STATIC AGE will release three different 7'inches with several bands that join the motto "HEADBANGERS AGAINST DISCO", and the first 7'inch is already out, including cool bands like Bestial Warlust, Sabbat, and two Scandinavian projects Infernö and Gehennah. The other 7 inchjes will feature songs from Nifelheim, Unpure, Usurper, etc, and the best thing is that most of the songs are unreleased ones, so you won't get "old news" only here. You'll read about those three 7'inches in the next issue... so already pre-order your copy of issue five, hehe !*

A split CD with Abigail and Funeral Winds should be out on WARMASTER Records. Beside this, Abigail also released their debut album on MODERN INVASION. Talking about more split LPs: Funeral Winds share one LP with the Norwegian Demoniac. Unfortunately I haven't heard any of these mentioned releases until now, so I can't say anything about the music, sorry!* Pentacle released a great PicMLP which offers cool thrashing Death Metal in the old vein. Those who know the band from their previously released stuff will be surprised! * Gorgoroth's third album is already recorded and will be entitled "Under The Sign Of Hell". Expect more pure Norwegian Black Metal.*

It's official now that GRDER FROM Chaos, one of the best American old fashioned Black/Beath Metal outfits, is history for several reasons. But their fans shouldn't cry too many tears, because Pete was clever enough not to sell his instrument but join a new band instead, namely ANGERCORPSE! Ausical parallels between those bands can't be denied, both forces are extreme Black/Beath Metal. Although I'm sure that you will read something about this new band in future. I wanted to get a bit of info from one of those three extremists ... and Gene finally made this possible. There's no doubt that this band is not just another Black/ Beath Metal outfit ... they are the kind of force that will prevail in future (in case they won't split up or wimp out), because their violent, massacrous music is not made for trendy individuals but for real lovers of extremest metallic storms...

Order From Chass is dead, and Angel Corpse rose from the ashes. But what has changed? Is it a completely new beginning? Gene, the band's axeman answers: Yes, the band Order from Chaos is no more, even though a final album is to be released in early 1997. It was recorded over a year ago. Angelcorpse did not rise from the ashes, or whatever... It is simple, I'd been in touch with Pete for some time, he was familiar with the fact that I was looking for people to start a band with for a long time. And when it came that Order from Chaos broke up, it didn't take much imagination as to what to do. This band is not a new direction at all. Angelcorpse is it own entity.'

With such an extremely wicked and violent deathrash style I wondered what the musical roots for Angel Corpse are? Gene again: Mostly old school Black Death Metal. However, we all have other tastes. I'm into obscure classical music from the 20th century. Pete is into some odd stuff like Non. 'Yes, your style is definetely sounding old-school without losing a 90stouch, that's something I like. But being different from most of the other Black/ Death hordes I wanted to know from Gene how and where he sees band in the Black/Death Metal scene ? He replies: I think we are definitely what people would call "real" Death or Black/Death. There are no mosh parts and weepy interludes, keyboards or acoustic guitars. Only pure ripping Metal! I think a lot of what people are being fooled into believing is Metal is actually the farthest from.' So what about their label mates? What does Angel Corpse think of Herve's bands? Do those US. devastators think that their band fits into the OSMOSE band-list ? ...: To be honest, I'm not very fond of many of the bands on the OSMOSE roster. However, some of the newer bands are kind of interesting, I can't say whether we fit with other OSMOSE bands. It is simply the label we are on, nothing more.'

Such an intensive Black Thrashing Death Metal sound like Angel Corpse has I'm only used from exotic bands (Brazilian, Singaporean, etc).... are they an influence ? ...: I thought some of the Brazilian bands like Vulcano, (very early) Sepultura, Sarcofago, were great bands. I can't say much for Singapore except maybe Abhorer.' Well, not exactly an answer to my question, but anyway, at least they appreciate some of the leading exotic metal forces.

The album "Hammer of Gods" is out now... I prefer their demotape to be honest, because it doesn't sound as clean as the album, but the Lp is cool anyway. Read the review for more info.



Tyrant, Hellbutcher and Demon, the pack of NIVECHEIM, managed to surprise me a lot with their merciless "in your face"-like album. It's straight ahead thrashing Black/Death Metal with a lot of aggressions and wicked feelings, an original album indeed in a time where 90% of all bands sound equal.

I knew that there's not much to unlock at Hellbutcher's address, but I confrontated him with my questions anyway. Well, unfortunately he really hadn't too many exciting words to say, ...

What differs NIFELHEIM from most of the other Scandinavian "old fashioned" bands like AURA NOIR, BEWITCHED, etc.? Is NIFELHEIM a real band or just a union of Black Metal musicians who like to make some extra money with the new "old Metal" trend?

'We started 1990 and at that time there was no fuckin' trend to play old school Black Metal, and you should have known that most of the tracks on the album were made in 1990, under the period when Gore Death Metal was a fuckin' trend! We have never claimed that we are playing oldschool Metal as the new trend, we just play the music that we think is the best and most evil. In the beginning of the 90s, everyone told us that we would never become anything as long as we play that unfashioned old trash shit. Now everyone says they were the first to play old school Metal. Fuck off to all old school bands... they are just Nifelheim Rip Off III'

What are you current faves when it comes to newer bands? Are there also bands you'd like to see to perish in flames?

'I want all bands to perish in flames I'

A tour is announced by NECROPOLIS... what should we expect when NIFELHEIM enters the stage? Any special

effects? With which bands would you like to tour?

'We are not planning to go on tour yet, perhaps in one year or something. About our stage show, you won't survive. A band we would like to tour with is Dissection.'

What kind of relationship do you have with DISSECTION? I think they sound like a glam-band in comparison to NIFELHEIM...

The members of **Dissection** share the same thoughts as

About your next LP: Will there be any major changes in comparison to your debut album? By the way, isn't it difficult to compose original Thrash /old Death Metal riffs without ripping old bands' riffs off?

'As I said, we will always play the same type of music, so there will be no major changes compared to the Nifelhelm album. I don't think it's hard to compose original riffs. We are planning to record the new album in the end of this year.'

On your debut LP there's a song called "Possessed by Evil" I Some old die-hard thrasher might curse you for this title as it is an old cultrack of a certain German Thrash band... Do you know which band I mean?

'I suppose you mean the track from a demo with Necronomicon.'

Hmm, I don't know if it's from a demo, but it's the best track of their debut LP. Your opinion about Black Metal 1996?

'99% of all Black Metal bands are wimpy poser crap. I hate It III'

Your opinion about Black Metal fans 1996?

'I want to kill all of them I'

Your wishes for Black Metal 1997?

That all posers in the scene die and only the true evil remains."

Why do you think are the Scandinavian people total wimps when it comes to drinking Beer? You go down very easy...
'You have never met Nifelhelm. That's all I have to say.'





he best thing to start our interview is to ask you about your new The Third Storm..."... It seems that it will sound even more oldashioned styled.... so what should we expect? Pure thrashing aggression? Equitant Yes, the new album from Absu will be "The Third Storm of Cythrual". We began recording in June 1996, and it will have around nine ongs on it. And yes, it will be more old sounding, pure hellish Speed Metal !!! On this one the songs are faster, and a bit shorter from the songs on the 2nd album "The Sun of Tiphareth", all but one song called "Of Celtic Fire we are born". This is an epic song influenced very much by celtic myths of steel and honour... It's in the vein of the songs like "Apzu" and "Feis mor tir na nog from our second LP, very long with lots of changes within the song and effects as well. This time we entered a new studio, for a different production and sound, more of a big sound this time, and very heavy. Its the same studio w did some of our first recordings in with Absu (early '91), but it changed alot since then, better recording equipment, etc. So yes, we feel good about this LP. It's the first time I myself have liked every song that will be on the LP. Plus they are just better writing, with more feeling and power behind us. This will be or est album for sure! Hell Speed Metal!!! MANUA. We are also doing another song of the Texas Deathkult Morbid Screan (R.I.P.). The song called "Morbid Scream", this was written in '88 and we will give the song life once again... as we did with "The Coming of War" on the ".... Tiphareth" album. Some of the other new songs I can tell you and Leather", "The Winter Zephyr", "Highland Tyrant Attack", "A Magician" Lapislazuli", "Intelligence towards the Crown", "Customs of Tasseomancy" and the song from our Tinch EP "And Shineth unto the cold Cometh" re-recorded. After the LP, we'll do another EP called "Thrashstorms" and begin to work on the 4th epic celtic concept album called "Toldanach: Legends of Fire and Steel". ABSU is one of the few dark U.S. bands that get some international attention... Why is the American scene so weak (in comparison European countries) when it comes to Dark/Black Metal? Is it a lack American Black/dark/occult metal roots ? Equitant: 'I don't know. In the 80s the american Metal wa Possessed, N.M.E., Manowar (still going strong !!!), Von, Necrovore Death, Morbid Angel, etc., etc. Today I don't care nor fallow it... it's nor existing. Texas had two great bands in the 80s, Necrovose and Morbid Scream... they were the kings !!! Why is the american scene Nothing but idiots are here... not everyone, but most ! All the good bands an fargone today!' can bands in general ? Did you What's your honest opinion on Ameri have any problems with any kind of bands? Equitant: 'As I said before I don't fallow the american scene... a few good

back to your new LP: Tell me about your ide concerning the album layout (cover)... Is it OSMOSE who takes care that or do you have absolute freedom when it comes to the pre of your releases !

Equitant: "The album "The third Storm of Cythrual" (Cythrual) coming fro he ancient celtic/caeltic name for abyss or hell, and the "Third Storm" standing for our 3rd LP and the three of us! The cover concept with this will be a storm, containing very dark clouds, shores of Ireland and a dark sea below it with lightning, etc. Other than that we are still working out all ideas for the byout. It will for sure be a better byout from "The Sun of Tiphareth" and will

e painted by Kris Verwimp again. OSMOSE did not use the original cover art for "The Sun of Tiphareth". It w originally a (no colour) scetch. Same concept, different artist. It had no ecolour, to it was not used. But the art was very good and fit the whole image and music a bit more than the cover by Kris Verwimp. Though we are pleased with the work by Kris. So yes, we have the freedom to do what we want. OSMOSE just did not want to use black and white pencle scetch covers... and we understand this now. In the past we have had so many problems with covers, so the new one will be a very good cover, and it will once again be gatefold on the LPformat (Thanks ! -ed.) with photos of us, etc. Other than that we are still thinking and planning every detail for this third storm...

Was "The Sun of Tiphareth" a success? I'm asking this, because it asn't just another typical trendy album...

Equitant: ' A success ? Ha! Yes, I guess it was. The album has sold very well all over the world...and this is good! I'm not sure of the full-am or numbers. I lose track of that... we are very pleased on how it has sold. That album was a real rebirth LP for us. Our style changed for the better plus w were doing the whole LP with just the three of us. If all the dedicated fans of us re happy with it, it will make us feel good about what we are doing. I gues you can say that it pushes us to the better with each recording (Yes, I total agree! -ed.). I think about this all the time... and miss it everyda grand time for us, we can't wait to return again to Europe. It's hard to tell yo how it feels for an American coming to Europe. I'm sure it's not like as European coming to America. It's very different for us. We received what we were expecting from that tour, good shows people and I can tell you its a hell of better place to tour from America. cnowledge and brains, the other half are fuckin' drunk idiots! waitsing flesh... know nothing about us or anything else for that m American fucks !! And I hate that more than anything. The U.S. tous nainly because we were doing this tour in the summer time every place you go...even the northern states were hot! But it with our brothers of the north Enslaved, we had such a good t

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crushing North America and Canada. A lot of the shows were great, and others were not so great. We had tons of problems with money and getting things stolen out of our bus by idiots !!! More american fuck wits! So it was a hell on earth at times, driving all night with no sleep at all! It can break you down fast. Yes, we will tour Europe again this year, and it will be with Enslaved as soon as both of our LPs are out. Perhaps a winter tour, and it could also be with a new OSMOSE band, Gehennah from Sweden. So if this all goes right it will be one of the best tours to hit Europe! A gaelic/norse/sverige storm tour?6!!!!

Yes, Germany was great on the last tour of Europe! It was good for myself and Shaftiel to go to Germany, 'cause we are both half German blood. So it was good to see the home land our ancestors came from.'

Was it easy to tour with the other two bands! It's no secret that SADISTIK EXEKUTION, IMPALED NAZARENE are not just "normal"

母子 ands... Equitant: Ha ha, yes, it was easy to tour with them. At first, things were a bit strange. But, after a few days we all started to become good pals, you know, after a few shows getting drunk off Vodka and Jack Daniels, with a lot of Beer to ad to it. And smoking hash, Dave Slace from Sadistik Exekution would always find some good hash for us to smoke! Ha ha! So with the first shows on the tour being great ones, we all became friends fast... Those bands were good guys to tour with for sure. They are both crazy and insane bands. The only problem was the tour bus. At times it was so small for three bands plus soundman, promotor, and two bus drivers. Some days you could not even walk down the hall way of the bus, so much stuff was in that bus. Then we had a flat tire in Germany one night, so we had a dead tire to walk over every time you got on the bus. That tour was a time we will never forget!!!'
Proscriptor, I heard that you had the wish to meet Mille Petro CHANGE OF THE PARTY OF THE PART (KREATOR) at the gig in (Alten)Essen, one of the centres of the dorious German Thrash movement, but unfortunately he didn't show up. What is so fascinating at German Metal (especially thrash)? Of course I love these bands, too, but I think that people from English-speaking countries must have laughed a lot as the images of German bane (old DESTRUCTION, SODOM,...), "over the top" intion was had and so were the lyrics, etc...But the foreign fans st love(d) it! Your comment (would be nice to know)? Proscriptor. First of all I'd like to start with a remarkable quote from the Sovereign of German Thrash Metal. "The posers on this Earth have no right to live - We're gonna split their brains, torture is what we give!" (Mille Petrozza). The above statement is so, oh, so very true. During the infamous era of the 80s. Germany was a country to actually advance in the so-called Thrash movement like no other country, yet for reasons unknown. At the same time America was very strong and powerful as well (Slayer, Possessed, Necrovore Morbid Scream, Rigor Mortis, Necrophagia, Blood Feast, Metallica, Incubus, Nasty Savage, Exodus, VON, ...). I think the reason why I, along

with the others in Absu, like German Death Trash so much is due to the fact that it had a sound, an electrifying power like no other bands created. The guitars were brighter and more animated than usual Thrash bands that I had been listening to at that time; this goes for the drum production as well. For example, just listen to Ventor's drum mix in the masterwork of "Pleasure to Kill". Since Ventor did not use bottom drum heads on his toms, Harris Johns decided to push a lot of mid-range and high-end to give the toms a rather "ringy" or should I say an open vault sound. I mean, every time I listen to "Pleasure to Kill", the drums literally run my corpse over like a bunch of goddamn blazin' chariots in zee night! This goes for Destruction as well! Schmier's voice is like a heretical commander sending his troops straight to hell (Well, I think he just wanted to imitate "Cronos", didn't he? -ed.) !!! He is a rather unique and decorative voice like none other. I guess listening to other thrash and Speed Metal bands was very enlightening, but once I discovered bands and cults from your country roughly 10 or 11 years ago, I knew this was a hateful direction I wanted to partake in, in thy musical carrier of course. You know what bothers me? I don't know anyone who gives a shit about bands like Minotaur, Poison, Necronomicon, Darkness, and especially the legendary DEATHROW !!!!!!!! (I don't think they are "legendary" ... they were good but their drummer had a strange style! But what about bands like Vio Force, Exumer, Living Death ? -ed.) I have never really picked up a zine and seen an interview with a band member saying, "Deathrow is a big influence of mine!"... you never see this in reality! Well, minus the exception of Japan's Sigh, which I think is one of the better bands in today's episode of extre Metal music. Anyway, your commentation on poor English sung by godzz Schmier and Angelripper... I think this is another reason why I luxuriate in this style of German Metal so much! Oh, I laughed when I first heard some of the words coming out of their mouths, especially like "Thrash", "Death", etc. It seems they had a difficulty with the "v" consonant sound and the endin "th" sound, but it's ok, I fucking love it man !!! Now in today's ceaseless compensation of sodality, you don't see many new bands from Germany, excepnotable ones like Desaster, Fulgor, etc...' Is your admiration of old German thrash bands the rea the word "trash" instead of "thrash"? That's exactly the way the Go did it...

Proscripton ' Yes, I do believe that is correct! However, when a very enigmatical and hateful mid-paced tempo change arrives in an Absu song, I have to say "trash" to command on following lyrics. It's the only way.'

You were in another band before you joined ABSU...Please tell us about

it as I heard it must have been a Thrash-band, too.... Are there any recordings still existing?

Proscripton 'Oh that band...mmm ... I was in a cult band called Magus before I had joined forces behind Absu. Actually, it was a very, very fast death metal band, yet on the other hand, we played this kind of symphonic doom as well. It was totally dedicated to the dominion credence of Thoth and esoence.

of How many the band ROOT? I guess not too many, but this band was around for a being long time, formed in the late 80s, having recorded 3 demos (as far as I know), and four LPs. Their first unholy LP "Zievenie" was released after the communistic system fell in Czech Slovakia, it was the year 1991, but their previous demos had already raw Black/Death sound (mixed with some thrash riffs), and I dare to say that Grishnackh's first 那姐张芝姐州 album did have some from influences ROOT, like the simple

drumming and especially the riff of the ROOT song "Pisa Pro Satana" which is very similar to the Count's "War" (well, it's also similar to MATHORNO'S "Necromancy", I must admit). However, I know from old interviews that Vikernes mentioned this Czech force as one of his influences.

ROOT's second album, "Hell Symphony" is much more variable in comparison to the

Their third, in 1993 released album, "The Temple in the Underworld" shew ROOT from their epic side, having a strong late epic BETOORD sound, mixed with some old influences and again, slavonic vocalmelodies, very cool! Just listen to the incredible "Voices"!

The fourth LP I haven't heard yet unfortunately, but it must be very different... anyway, with the help of people like Opyros and especially Dr.Fe an interview with Jiri "Big Boss" Valter, the band's vocalist, was made possible. I'm very happy to have this great band included here, especially because I've never read any interview or even a review about ROCC so far. Well, check out yourself what Big Boss has to say....

First I'd like to know, why the fourth ROOT LP isn't released yet. It is already ready, isn't it?

The fourth Root album, "Kärgeras", is out and was baptized at the concert in Praha, together with Anathema and My Dying Bride. We have recorded the album in November/december 1995 in Shark Stufio. For the Western market, the English company

CACOPHONOUS has bought the rights, here in Czech Republic the album was released on BLACK HOLE.'

Please tell us about the

It is about a monothematical story, and it is necessary to read the preface on the cover. Root's style has changed completely. Now I'm singing all with completely clear, normal vocals. The fans and the critics have highly appreciated this record, and we are very happy about it!

Why have you left MONITOR Records? Did you have problems with them?

'MONITOR now only has bands under contract which have golden records, etc... and this is not really the case at Root.'

Haha, not really! Although especially the Norwegians are responsible for the Black Metal trend (especially Dark Throne's "A Blaze in the Northern Sky" anno '92), the Czech scene was much earlier into Black Metal with bands like TÖRR, MASTER'S HAMMER and ROOT. But the fans don't realize this as it seems... Don't you think that the Czech scene should receive much more recognition from the interbational underground? After all, LPs like "Zjevenie", "Armageddon " and "Ritual" have already been released before anyone knew about Norwegian Black Metal...

When we have already played Black Metal in Czech Republic, the Norwegians have still shitted into their pants, that's the problem. But I don't want to talk deeper about this subject!

Why were there so many Black/Death Metal bands around in your country anno '90? What is the reason for this admiration for occultism / satanism?

I think that the best reason to play Black Metal is that bands are able to find out everything possible and are able to attack anything possible, including the holy church, etc. You can easily talk about subjects which are usually taboo for normal people. But now I'm not interested in the fantasy-side of the story. All the other stuff is my life-style!

Do you still regard ROOT as a Black Metal band? How would you describe your current musical style?

Thate to part music into any directions, everyone can label our music like he wants. I don't care at all!

ROOT are hardly known internationally... No interviews, promotion, etc. can be found. Why do you isolate from making the band more popular with the help of interviews, advertising, etc. ? Don't you want

every headbanger to have one ROOT LP in his collection?

Everyday I receive letters from Columbia, Mexico, U.S.A., Malaysia, France, Germany, Portugal, etc., and I think that we are famous! But I don't want to do interviews for any zines that I can't read later on. This is the only reason! I'm convinced that 2/3 of all interviews are just mean deceptions, and that's a pity for my time. I only do this interview, because Dr. Fe, the singer of Amon Goeth, has guaranteed me that this is not a rip off.'

Is it true that you have refused a proposal for a deal from AVANTGARDE? Why?

It is true! The reason for this is that the persons behind AVANTGARDE just promised and blathered a lot, again and again... and the whole thing went down the toilet...'

Big Boss, can you still identify yourself with the old ROOT stuff like the demos, the first two albums?

I'm asking this, because your third LP ("The Temple in the Underworld") was musically completely different with its epic BATHORY-styled stuff...

I strongly stand behind every song of us, from the demos, LPs, from the beginning until this time. Although we change our music on every record, although we sound different, this really can't change my philosopy, my view of life.'

Some people call you the KING DIAMOND from the East (side of the old iron curtain)... what do you think of this? Did you once have contact with King Diamond? Or is it just Anton LaVey who makes you compareable with the Danish king?

Well, if the fans call me like this, then they can call King Diamond as "Big Boss from the West"... am I right? (well, yes, but he's much more popular than you are, don't you agree? -ed.) We are certainly very close when it comes to the human point of view, and not only because we are both members of the Church of Satan. We know each other from letters and a couple of telephone conversations. So we are friends...'

What is especially conspicious at ROOT are your vocals, because you use your own voice. Do you have a special training? Your voice is very flexible (very deeep, melodic, etc.)!

Thave the theory that every vocalist should be able to sing. If he can't, his ass should be kicked! But I don't need any special training. I can work very well with my voice and I try to use all possibilities of my voice. Just listen to our new record, and you'll shit in your pants! I guarantee this to you!

Fuck, I still haven't, but the whole thingshould be very rocky as people have told. I adore your laughter on the first two records... how came the idea? Why haven't you used this effect on your third LP as well?

T use my laughter to stress our lyrics better, but only if it fits! This effect is again used on the new album. And again very nice!'

A lot of Czech musicians are already a bit older, i.e. Franta Storm, Dr. Fe, or you, etc. Why is it like this? Has communism made fanatical people of you?

The reason is probably that we couldn't do anything in times of communism, and we had to wait. And times floads and floads... But I don't feel old. Man is as young as he feels himself.'

You also released a Solo CD, right? What was the reason for this? Isn't ROOT attractive enough anymore?

The reason is not that Root isn't attractive anymore for me. But we needed four years to make the last album, and I had my very own ideas for it which didn't fit to Root. So I made my solo-project "Q7".'

Will there be a clip for the new LP? You once did a clip for the song "Upaleni" some years ago for the TV as far as I know...

There has to be a video-clip, of course, but I don't know when. Until now we have made 8 clips (!), and five of them have already been broadcasted on TV!

What do you think of the many young Czech Black Metal bands? I read that these guys don't take you for serious...

I only know one orthodox Black Metal band from the Czech Republic, and that's Amon Goeth. Others don't interest me, because they are all assholes, they only want to be important with the help of Black Metal. When they come home, then their fathers beat their asses with a stick and send them to church. And that's it with Black Metal... And if those people don't take me for serious, I don't care, because they are only assholes anyway...'

Well, I do not know too many new Black Metal bands from Czech Republic, so I can't really say what to think of them. Haven't you received any offers for a ROOT tour? Aren't you interested in touring in Germany or anywhere else?

Of course we have offers, but I always refuse them all. I don't want to play in foreign countries for Beer and sausages only, and to dress in the toilet-room. The promoters jut regard us as assholes from the east, and this is not what we need! I know really well that we have at least the same qualities as My Dying Bride... and especially this band gets a lot of money here for gigs

and have everything possible secured. If there's anyone willing to do this kind of stuff with us, then it's no problem. Then we could of course play anywhere in foreign countries. We will probably play in Germany together with Anathema and Pyogenesis ... but this isn't sure yet. I don't want to make this for the mentioned reasons. I love comfort and in addition I'm lazy as a pig.' ROOT shows used to be very dark in the past... how is a ROOT concert nowadays?

I think it's even darker than before, if we play at all. We cancel our gigs, and our manager gets headaches because of us. In addition we have split up after the recordings, and have reformed, but with a different line-up.'

What do you think of the new MASTER'S HAMMER CD, "Slagry"? Would you like to try anything like that? Or will ROOT always remain a METAL band?

I think NOTHING of this new Master's Hammer album, it doesn't interest me at all. I never want to make something like that. Franta Storm is probably completely insane!"

In the meantime there are some people around searching your LPs... Why aren't their any liscences for your LPs like there is for the first MASTER'S HAMMER LP? Your records are hard to get...

This thing doesn't interest me at all.

What does ROOT mean for you? Is it just a hobby or is it more?

Root! It is my baby, my lifestyle, the way of self-realization, simply everything! Music has always been my hobby, and if that's not the case, that you can pack up your shit. When we formed Root with Blackie (Blackosh, guitars -ed.), it was a longing for the whole life! And we don't want to step back from it!

Should every ROOT album sound different on purposal or is it just a normal development as a musician? Could you imagine to make a harder LP again, with darker vocals, more laughter, etc.?

It is of course development. If a band doesn't develop anymore and only copy themselves, then they can fuck off! (Really? Would you like to see i.e. Motörhead dead? -ed.) All our records are very hard, we never have swom ourselves to any trends, and if there's a song which sounds a bit soft, there's nothing we can do about it.'

Which are your favourite LPs? How came your love for Heavy Metal?

'All records from King Diamond, Ministry, Type O Negative, Slayer, Jimi Hendrix, Beatles, etc. In my case it is the love to music in general'
Your plans?

We work on the next record, with Blackie, and we want to enter studio in Spring

1997. And I work for my next solo-project. Everything else is top secret!'


Ok, thanks for the interview... it's great to have ROOT included in the mag Any last words?


Last words? I believe nothing ends! ... and if you mastrubate your cock in the evening, then remember me ...'

Some time after the interview was made, I got the sad news that ROOT are history, so there will not be a fifth LP recorded! It seems as if this interview is the last one Jiri Valter did, so take it as kind of "farewell"... Check out the first three ROOT LPs if you have the chance to lay your hands on it. "Zjevenie" got finally re-released through CACOPHONOUS, but with English lyrics (the album is called "Revelation" now). Try to get the Czech version instead, because I'm sure that the old vocals are much better, they can't be beaten!

It's sad that ROOT never managed to become a known force in the international scene, because they're too good to be ignored. So go for their albums and get a taste of real Czech Metal quality!!!





Infernät Mäjesty.



The news that INTERNAL MAJESCO's grave is open, and that its corpse seems to have risen came like a hammerblow !!! I couldn't believe that these supreme ruling wicked Thrash Metal gods from Canada decided to return with a new album..... As too many rumours just pissed me off during the last time, I had to contact Kenny (guitarist) myself, and was full of hope to find out that it

iguitarist) myself, and was full of hope to find out that it all wasn't just an illusion.

Those who know their debut LP/CD "None Shall Defy" will know that it's more than a honour for me to feature this band in the magazine... "None Shall defy" is definitely a true classic, a must for all people into Thrash Metal the way it was meant to be: Dark, fast, violent, aggressive and full of metallic Power!!! Those who have not heard the album yet should leave all new releases in the dust and spend their money for this album (it has been re-released, so it's no rare item anymore). To me, 3ff Cafiat Miggesty are still a lot darker than 95% of all those Black Metal bands that are around today... Well, let's start with the interview...

I was more than just surprised to hear that mighty INFERNÄL MÄJESTY returns with a second LP... Please tell us about this album, especially in comparison to your immortal "None Shall Defy" LP.... what will be different?

"I guess a lot of people were surprised that we had recorded another album. We did it about a year and half ago. We recorded all of the music but have not yet recorded the vocals. We had wanted the album to come out awhile ago, but we had major problems with our last singer Vince. The album was recorded with Scott Burns in Toronto and we are all happy since now we know that Chris Bailey (the unholy brother of Tom Araya, haha -ed.) will be doing all of the vocals. Right now we are putting the finishing touches on all lyrics since we had to re-write most of them after Vince left and Cris came back. The songs are in the same vein as "None Shall Defy" and "Anthology of Death", so don't expect nothing to be overly different. They sound just like what you would expect Infernal Mäjesty to sound like since our writing style hasn't changed much.

I'm very excited to hear the album, believe me! Especially because Chris is back ... why had he left the band years ago?

You're right... Chris Bailey is back with Infernal Müjesty and we are extremely glad that he is. He was the voice that made the album sound so good. We always got along but over time you run into problems that can't be avoided. But shit, he's back in the band now and that's all I care.'

Thrash Metal seems to return as people seem to long for this special old (almost forgotten) Thrash feeling. Wouldn't it be a good chance for you to show all the headbangers what Canadian steel is all about? By the way, it would be interesting to know how many copies you've sold of the re-released version of "None Shall Defy" until now.

Right now we are really working hard with promoters for a European tour and we will be there for the Summer of 1997. We will be playing at least three festivals

(Belgium, Germany, Holland) and a lot of clubdates in-between. I think we will be playing with Dawn and Altar on the tour (I would like to see you with Razor! -ed.). We have never been to Europe as a band and we are looking forward to it. As far, as sales go, "None Shall Defy" is selling well, I guess a lot of people had the album and wore it out or because it has two new songs on it. ROADRUNNER Records are keeping track of it for us, so I won't know exactly how many were sold until the new year.'

Who will take care of "Unholier Than Thou"? Again DISPLEASED? Some people say that this label is not trustworthy...

We have giving that a lot of thought and aren't going to worry too much about it right now. We put all our money into "Unholier Than Thou" and if we have to, we will release it on our own or license it out to other record companies. We have had offers from other labels that have shown interest in signing us but as of now have not committed to anyone. We want someone that wants to back Infernil Müjesty 100%, anything less would be a waste of our time as we have gone down that road before.'

So, hope things will turn out to be great for you! "None Shall Defy" was, together with HOBBS' ANGEL OF DEATH debutLP, one of the last satanic Thrash Metal records in the last decade... Why has real Thrash Metal disappeared? Who are the ones to blame? How has Infernil Mäjesty changed through the years? Do you still like your work on "None Shall Defy"?

I don't think Thrash Metal has disappeared at all, there are new bands coming out all the time, sure they may play it differently but that's what you want, the last thing I want to hear is a band that sounds exactly like Slayer or Infernal Müjesty (Well, I don't share your opinion !-ed.). A lot of people thought that we sounded like Slayer when we first came out (Definitely, you fight with the same "weapons", but that's great !-ed.), and people are going to compare you to other bands but I know that Slayer and Infernal Müjesty have their own sound even though it's the same style of music. I really don't think our music has changed that much (I hope so !-ed.), Steve Terror and I have been together for a long time and we write pretty much the same way, but the lyrics have changed because Psycho is no longer in the band and he wrote a majority of our tyrics. Ine tyrics are still on the dark side because that's we like to write about and the new album will branch out a lot more than "None Shall Defy" did. Even after playing "None Shall Defy" for years, I still like it. It's one of those albums that you can put on your stereo and not get sick of, just like the old Mercyful Fate album "Don't Break The Oath", I never got sick of it either.'

Talking about Canadian bands: It seems as if your country's bands can't be killed as EXCITER, ANVIL, RAZOR, VOIVOD, INFERNÄL MÄJESTY are still alive. What's the reason for this survival? Is it probably because you never got the full attention which all of you deserved? I mean, Canadian forces have never been promoted/supported as much as U.S. bands, right?

'We know the guys in Razor very well and I guess that since we all like playing so much we are still alive. It's a lot different in Canada than anywhere else I know, because most clubs want bands that play top-forty shit, so it makes it a lot harder to play live gigs. We have always had to put together our own tours just so we could play live. But if you are a band from the U.S.A. or Europe, then promoters love to book you.'

In an interview (THAT'S IT mag) you said that you played together with Sheepdog McLaren of RAZOR. Have you ever recorded anything with him? It would be fuckin' interesting to hear an INFERNÄL MÄJESTY kind of music combined with the original vocals of Stace. What is he doing nowadays? It would be a shame if he retired from Metal... no one sounded like him!

'Steve and I have known Stace for years, we were with him when he first got the job with Razor. After he left Razor he would come down and jam with us, he did know a few of our songs, but we never did do any recording with him. Stace is living in the north of Toronto and I don't know what he's up to these days, but you're right... it would be a shame if he has given it all up!

Definitely, Stace is ace! But back to your band: A thing which I do not understand is why it takes about nine years to release another album. Was it due to a lack of motivation? I can't imagine that it would have been a problem for a band like you to find a good label...

'If we had our way we would have 5 or 6 albums out now, but we had no real support from ROADRUNNER Records so we had to do everything ourselves and believe me it ain't easy. Sure we got real discouraged, but we kept on going... that's

A cool interviewclip was made for your titlesong "None Shall Defy"... how many bucks did it cost, and who paid all the expenses? Are you thinking about doing another clip for one of your new songs?

'The video was shot in Toronto and we hired the guys to film it for us. I forgot how much it cost, but it was around \$5 - 6.000 (!!! - ed.) and we paid for it ourselves (!!!!! -ed.). We got this real cool song called "Gone away of all Flesh" that we want to put to video after the new album is done because it's got a great story that would make it a great video.'

About your live-performance: How does your show look nowadays... will it look like the old clip,... black leather, spikes and fog?

'We always liked bands that put on a good show, so we decided from the start that we would try and have a big stage set up. On our first tour we hired a guy by the name of "VooDoo" to paint backdrops that featured our album cover and a drum riser with medieval airbrushed graphics (Yeah, I noticed the great "lightning" airbrush on the drums! -ed.). We also used lots of fog and pyro. The over all look was there from the start, we were all into leather, studs at the time and it was a bit over the top (only your old hairstyle was really "over the top", haha! -ed.), but it's funny because a lot of the new bands are wearing leather and studs again instead of jeans and T-Shirts (hmm...), but we hope to have a real good stage show together for the tour, that will never change!

Have you followed the happenings / development of the Metal scene through the years? What do you think of the return of Black Metal? Have you picked up any bands in the last couple of years which you really find interesting?

'I've always kept an eye and ear on what's happening with Thrash and I'm glad that it's alive and well, and I don't think it will ever die. I don't give two shits about what's on the radio (what's that? -ed) because 95% of it I don't care for anyhow. I 'm glad to see that so many bands are making it back on to the scene because without them it would all die. I'm listening to a lot of new stuff, and the band that I really like is Altar, I think these guys have great potential and I'm looking forward to touring with them.'

You can't deny that "None Shall Defy" sounds a lot like SLAYER, which is not a bad thing! Have you ever played with or met Tom Araya & Co.? I guess they weren't too happy to hear a band like you which was even stronger than their own one during that period of time ("South of Heaven" LP)....

'To tell the truth, if people compare us to Slayer, that's great because they are the finest Thrash band in the world. I really don't think that they have to worry too much about Infernal Majesty. Our road manager Ray Moss is good friends with Slayer, but we have never played on the same bill together... yet.'

Use your chance to speak some words to all your faithful fans who still have Metal in their veins...

'We are all very surprised that people even remember us and are very grateful for their support over the years. Right now our main goal is to play everywhere in Europe, finish the new album as well as to meet as many fans as possible. We are not one of those bands that stays backstage the entire time. We like to get out and mingle with the crowd. So, if everything goes according to plan we should be seeing you all in near future.'



What do you know about Canada (beside being the land of mounties and elcs) when it comes to newer Black /Death Metal bands? Yes, BLASPHEMY come from this country, but they have ceased to exist if I have to believe the latest OSMOSE news. But there's a new band following the footsteps of that and other Canadian bands, and their name is CONQUEROR, like the old SODOM song!

They released a demotape called Antichrist Superiority" which contains fuckin' bad produced but very hard and merciless Black / Death Metal which reminds me a lot at the first BLASPHEMY album "Fallen Angel of Doom". This LP is certainly not everyone's favoured release, I know, but I think that no one can deny that this music is not dark, malicious and violent. If you prefer to read stuff about the 5035th band with the same trendy sound (you certainly know what I mean, don't you ?), then you have to pick up other zines but not this one here. Read the following interview with Ryan Forster if you want to read something about a "different" band ...

What differs you from other Black/ Death Metal bands in your opinion?

When we write songs, we don't try to compare them to other bands, we write them only to please ourselves. We're into the most violent of Metal. The current Black/ Death Metal trend is to play soft and melodic as it seems. Conqueror plays bestial Black/Death!'

I heard that you're planning to release / record a CD... please tell us about it. Do you think you have progressed since the badly produced demotape?

'Actually the demo sound came out exactly as we planned it, raw and underground! We could have easily stayed in the recording studio and overproduced the tape, but we prefer it like this. If you listen to the tape you can still hear all the music, but we didn't clean it up the holocaustic hoise that gives us a savage atmosphere. Yes, a CD is to be released early 1997 and we are going to get a raw sound again. Akhough it will be more professional as we'll have more tracks to work with this time.'

You said in your letter that you're inspired by real Death Metal... what do you mean with this

To us, real Death/Black is raw, unholy and extreme! We include all these elements in the Conqueror sound.'

As a kind of tribute to old Canadian bands you covered an old SLAUGHTER song on your demo... will you continue to honour old bands from your country on your future releases?

"The Curse" by Slaughter will again appear on the CD. We also plan to do a Razor cover (great!ed.) and a Sacrifice cover in the future if we can." Why have especially Canadian bands never got the full attention which they deserved? You can't deny this fact, can you?

The Metal scene in Canada is very small. What little bands there are, they don't know how to promote themselves in the underground, because we are not exposed to be like in Europe or U.S.A.! Records by Infernal Majesty, VoiVod, Sacrifice, Razor, etc. were just as godly as other LPs by European bands and U.S. bands... Anyhow, it's great that we don't have an overcrowded scene that is mostly populated by idiots anyway...'

You are probably right with this! You hail BLASPHEMY, right? Do you know those guys personally? Why have they finally split up?


Blasphemy live 3 hours travel away from us, so we don't know them personally, but we've contacted them before. Blasphemy's activities out of the band were very extreme. Perhaps their lifestyle prevented them from continuing the band seriously.'

Would be interesting to know more about the mystery behind this dead band! But back to Ryan: Which kind of people do you want to reach with CONQUEROR's music?

'All people into brutal, underground, bestial Death Metal should contact Conqueror! Our "Antichrist Superiority" Demo is still available for US\$ 6!

I just have to add that the band officially signed to EVIL OMEN Records for their first CD, which should be entitled "War... Cult... Supremacy". It's no surprise that labelboss Lejeune "Evil" Ludo likes CONQUEROR as he used to be the chief of the European SARCOFAGO/BLASPHEMY Fan Club.

music itself is extreme enough, even with a good production?

'Actually I thought that there could been more of those rawer parts on "Eerie", I like "Hailstorm" the way it is, the same goes for "Eerie". I don't want to write about the ideas for "infernal" here, because this might cause some kind of "rules" for me to work in the studio. Your new songmaterial seems to be the strongest that you've done so far. Especially "War Metal" and "Deliver a Battle" sound great and carry a special wicked feeling... in which kind of mood have you been while creating these tunes? When you compose songs, do you have any plans already or does it just happen?

unes? When you compose songs, us you have any property just happen?

"Warmetal" track was written in 92/93, so actually it is not our newest material. I think that 多强强反映设施。 music has always been quite (or not just quite, but extremely) powerful with the basic structures that I have created for my music.

When I'm working on new Hell unes of 多强强强强争战机, it just happens, everything happens spontaneously. I don't TRY to make new tunes, they just "born" from my wicked and dark mind !..... Fortunately I don't have any problems with creating new material - actually I have tons of riffs and lyrics that aren't used for any tunes yet. You know, I just record every riff that comes to my mind and later I use them for my new songs.

The most respectable bands for me have always been those who have their own
original style. It's very easy to steal riffs and ideas from others, but to create
something from your own mind, that's really something that subhumans aren't able

As your style is very extreme I'm sure that you received a lot of different reviews/reactions to your music, right? Are their any good/bad ones branded in your mind? Does it affect you?

I know a lot of main-stream clowns who just hate PREMEDREM's music. I just think that HATE is one of the feelings that support me to continue! Our music is not for the main-stream; it hasn't and will never be!

Which of today's bands do you adore?
'As mentioned earlier, I just keep myself out from the influences of other artists.
Only influences that I surely accept to take are the influences from nature, sometimes I just wander in the woods or graveyards or hills, rivers or lakes, etc. just to clear my thoughts. By that I usually get a lot of fresh ideas for my music.
About the music that I listen to when I'm alone... well, as you might guess I do listen to a lot of music! Eg. now I'm listening to BREDERD! debut album. When I'm alone I usually always listen to music (being alone is the major part of my life I think).

think).
Here comes the part that I really enjoy doing in interviews; the list of my faves (to name just a few of them)...: Venom (old), Sodom (old), Bathory (not "Requiem" and "Octagon"), Poison (Ger), Sarcofago (old), Manowar, AC/DC, Manilla Road, Paul Chain, Rainbow, Angelwitch, Demon, Black Sabbath, Dio, Hellhammer (Celtic Frost (old), Voivod (old), Black Widow, Witchfynde, Solitude Aeternus, Candlemass, Pentagram, Witchfinder General, Mercyful Fate /King Diamond, Hawkwind, Motorhead, Brocas Helm, Saint Vitus, Uriah Heep, Mayhem, Sacred Crucifix (R.O.D.-demo'89), Master's Hammer (exclusive "Slagry"), Ghost Rider ("Mayhemic Destruction" demo'84), Sabbat (both Japanese and English), Treblinka / Tiamat (especially older stuff), Unholy, Von, Törr, etc. etc. etc.

Some bands of today I like: Countess, Ancient Rites, Alastis, Samael, Drowned, Unpure, Bewitched, Necromantia, Sorcerer, Mortuary Drape, Amon Goeth, Mayhemic Truth, Morningstar, etc. etc.'
You planned to use a third bassist, but I can't find him on your albums. Didn't it work out or has a third bassguitar left your rehearsalroom in ruins?

It's not a secret that I've always had some trouble with the line-ups. We had three hears have the life's hat for too long. Our graper line-up coassists of only one

bassplayers, but it didn't last for too long. Our current line-up consists of only one bassist (me), but in the studio there'll be several basses (and has been on both albums). There was talk about some European dates with BARATDRAM, DECADED and COMPLESS... what went wrong? A lack of interest?

'Well, perhaps it was a lack of interest, but not from BARATDRAM, but from gigorganizers and for club-owners or others. I really don't know why it wasn't possible to do those dates.

Anyway, we're still interested in playing shows abroad and I hope that we can play some shows in Germany, Holland, Belgium, etc... If there's a possibility to do that, of course we'll do it. And I just advice everybody who digs original Black Metal to check out our live-shows, 'cause they really are something special... even worth of some travelling. Just to experience the show of BARARDARM!!! Dark and Evil!!!'

You are one of the oldest Black Metal bands from Scandinavia... and you experienced the growth of the Neo Black Metal movement since the beginning. What do you think of its development? Are you happy with the current situation?

situation? I've seen the birth of many bands, and I've usually seen them dying after a while... not only in Scandinavia, but elsewhere, too. At the moment I feel that BARANDARM exists 'til my time has come to die! I have experienced a lot with my band, some losses but mostly victories... and afterall almost every loss I face turns into victory afterwards. For example the members that I kicked or lost from the band. Usually afterwards I realize that ex. members weren't strong enough to be the true warrior-mates of mine. And I really believe that if there's a cancer it has to be eliminated, because otherwise that rot can polute the healthy parts. I've always said that time shall tell who're the true winners! Losers shall fall after a while, they are not strong enough to be among the survivors!'

Do you have any special wishes for BARANDARM's future? What are your 'I just hope that I can accomplish.

goals!

'I just hope that I can accomplish my art in future at least as well as I have done before. To name some practical goals in future: Well, to finish our first video, to record our third album, to write some new material, and of course to play as many gigs as it can ever be possible. But main goals are still to frighten main-stream-slaves and to crush the fakes by our musical BlackMetal Hammer!

You don't seem to care about album sales (otherwise way would play a more

gigs as it can ever be possible. Dut main goals are still to inghten main-stream-saves and to crush the fakes by our musical BlackMetal Hammer? You don't seem to care about album sales (otherwise you would play a more popular style), and I think that's a sign for being uncommercial. But don't you feel a bit betrayed when kids are playing trendy black metal and sell albums like hell, while you are sticking to your principles to play real obscure and extreme music without getting your wage?

'If our albums sell well, it's really ok, but I think it's not the most important thing. Yes, it is a bit frustrating to listen to these neo-clowns, like last weekend, when we played in a town called Parikkala, there were some morons who told us that Venom hasn't ever been Black Metal. and that Black Metal has been created in Norway. I just feel pity for subhumans like those morons were.

When you play on stage, is the sound as extreme as on your albums? Are there any special visual effects that add some darkness to your music? Or do you just get on stage and start to play without any "show?? Black Metal needs a show in my opinion when it is played live (as a kind of tradition)....

'Our shows are as extreme as our music is. I agree with you that Black Metal needs special shows when it comes to Live-appearance. There's a lot of fire in shows of BRRINGSRIMM. We're still testing pyros to create even more extreme shows. Only bad thing is that these effects do need some space to work and usually we are



playing our gigs in small clubs. But even in clubgigs there're some stery effects when presented plays.... candles, torches, sire breathing and stuff. And our shows are quite Raw and Filthy in other ways, too. You should see our show to know what I mean.... Black Vomit, Blood, Blasphemy, Darkness.... to name just a few elements

mean... Black Vomit, Blood, Blasphemy, Darkness... to name just a few elements that we have in our shows.'
Holocausto of #EMERIS once dreamt to do an even bigger liveshow (with pyros, darklights, etc.) than #EMEM, but he finally changed his attitude towards everything as it seems. As you are a friend of him: What's the reason for him to retire from his raging Black Metal style !!! We shouldn't forget that #EMERIS was one of the forces that brought Black Metal back...

'I don't know for sure what made him to do that quite dramatic change for his music. Perhaps it's just provoving that he can do whatever he wants to do, because as far as I know Holocausto, he lives in the way of the ideology of Aleister Crowley: "DO WHAT THOU WILT SHALL BE THE WHOLE OF THE LAW". I really remost his views, because he knows what he's doing.'

Your latest BRRETEREM logo reminds me a lot at the POSSESSED logo with all the flames and stuff. Why have you stopped to use the old one which looked cool as well?

'The new logo satisfies me more than the older ones. The basics have always been the same - Black Flames!!!!!'

'Can't you see that I am a dictator? Everything I do, I do to satisfy myself, same it is with my warrior-brothers in BARALBARAM.

REAL Black/Deathmetal doesn't need anything to be changed. Fakes should invite different names for their pseudo Black/Death Metal, but probably they're impotent to do so, due to their low-capacity in mental activity...'

STORM OF NEBIULA (Nebiula)

5 bands from the East....Riusgnal (or better said Langsuir), As Sahar, Voiciferation Eternity, Aradia and Sil Khannaz. 12 songs are on this CD, and it's an interesting experience to hear what all those bands have to offer. Riusgnal are the best band on this compilation and should not be ignored! This CD gets sold for a special low price, so keep your eyes open.

A TRIBUTE TO CELTIC FROST... (Dwell)

I'm more or less disappointed with this tributeCD, especially because of Slaughter's contribution. But also the other bands sound very weak in comparison to the original Celtic Frost and especially Hellhammer versions (13's version of 'Triumph of Death" is supposed to be a bad joke, am I right ?). Only Sadistic Intent know to convince ! Don't get blinded by names like Enslaved. Emperor, etc this tribute CD is not really great (most tribute CDs are shit except for the Slayer tribute in my opinion). But if you are an open-minded and flexible guy, then try this.

SLATANIC SLAUGHTER Volume Two -(Black Sun)

12 bands hail Slaver and do their best to cover their songs. All do a good job in my opinion except for Disaffected. Biggest surprise for me is Anathema's contribution, because their version of 'Read between the Lies" is truely cool because of the great vocals which have this special Araya-like pronunciation of the words. The other bands Vader, (Necrophobic, Sinister. Benediction, etc.) also know to convince, and I think that this second Slatantic Slaughter compilation is even better than the first one.

This is finally a great Tribute CD, and all Slayer fans should lay their hands on it !!!

THE HOLY BIBLE (Holy)

The special thing at this CD is that all 10 bands play unreleased songs, so people get something new for their money. This CD comes with a 24-(full-coloured) pages booklet with info and stuff. Bands included? Nightfall, Sceptic Flesh, Elend, Tristitia and all the other HOLY bands. This looong CD gets sold for a very cheap price, ... this is really a fair offer from this hard working

NORDIC METAL A Tribute to Euronymous' (Necropolis)

The Euronymous cult sells! With the help of names like Abruptum, Emperor, Mayhem, Marduk, Thorns, Enslaved and five more bands, I'm pretty sure that this compilation sells pretty good. But I have to that there are six unreleased songs included, so this makes this compilation at least a bit interesting.

"Bengeance of Bell"

(Mausoleum/Earthshaker)

"Vengeance of Hell" was Germany's first (vinyl) answer to the U.S. Speed/ Thrash Metal movement which invaded Europe in those days. Back in 1984, Living Death haven't found their very own style yet, and you are able to find out their influences in every song of their debutLP. "You and me", the opener, heavily sounds like Metallica during and the the period, the instrumental "Labyrin" reminds me a lot at MSG's great "Into the Arena", and here and there you'll find riffs that sound like old Iron Maiden, Judas Priest, Mercyful Fate and those kind of bands. But I think that doesn't matter much as Living Death do their job well, "Vengeance of Hell" is a real Heavy/ Speed Metal album with good riffs and powerful arrangements. The only thing that may annoy you are Totto's vocals which sound very insane and out of control, just listen to "Riding a Virgin"! But fuck you, I really like them as they have a very own character! Unfortunately this album was badly produced which is a shame, but good songmaterial can't be ruined by a weak production, right? This album was re-released with a remixed sound in 1986 as far as I know, so there are two different LP versions existing. Anyway, "Vengeance of Hell" is one of the rarest LPs from the German T(h)rash scene, and if you see it for a cheap price, then check it (in case you like old sounds !).

Living Death changed their sound on the following releases, and was regarded as one of the "Love us or hate us" thrash bands, again due to the vocals which really had an extreme style, especially on "Back to the Weapons' ('86) and "Protected from Reality"('87). And this is the reason why the band never has been too successful in contrary to their neighbourbands like Sodom and Kreator. The band ceased to exist in the 90s, and I don't know what happened to the members except for their drummer Atomic Steif (who left his cool band Violent Force in '86 to join Living Death). He played in Sacred Chao and Sodom later, but left both bands again.

The early 80s was a good time for British Heavy Metal. Remember: Venom was born in those days. Beside the birth of Black Metal, there were some other bands with a dark attitude, well worth checking out, even today.

Demon is one of them, at least their first two albums. "Night of the Demon" was released in 1981. The cover artwork is quite extreme, sowing hands ripping apart a gravecross with innards gashing out. Nevertheless it's kind of aesthetic and far away from some childish and distasteful Death Metal artwork. The music of Demon's first album is energetic and melodic Heavy Metal without being commercial. The vocals are rough and the guitar play is catching, both unique components of Demon. The lyrics should be interesting for the readers of this magazine, too, for they are well written.

Demon's second album, "The unexpected Guest", came out in 1982. The musical style is nearly the same, just a bit tarned down. There are more calm but also atmospheric songs. The quality of the lyrics increased to a more serious level, same goes for the coverartwork.

The next two Demon albums went more and more experimental, influenced by Pink Floyd kind of stuff. Not uninteresting. Mal Spooner, guitarist of the band, died during the recordings of the fourth album. After that, Demon changed back to sophisticated Heavy Metal. Not bad but beyond the quality of the first two albums. Check em out if you want, to relax from an overdose of temporary Black Metal.

CIRITH UNGOL "King Of The Dead"

Talking about real cult-bands in Heavy Metal history you certainly have to mention Cirith Ungol from the U.S.A.! They are one of the few bands who never got full-attention, even if their music is undoubtly timeless and more original than 90% of the stuff that got released back then. But this is most likely the reason for Cirith Ungol being an eternal insiderband but nothing more... "King of the Dead" is the band's second album (the first one is called 'Frost & Fire'), and is a milestone of epical but still classical Heavy Metal. The band's trademark were Tim Baker's vocals... you can't describe them... you have to hear them... but all I can tell you is that they sound 100%ly over the top. For me they sound demonic, as if they come from an extremely obscure mind. Songs like "The Black Machine" or "Death of the Sun" are good examples for this. Beside their own compositions the band has covered the most popular Bach composition ever... you know it when you hear it (the Horror-movie classic !). Their third album "One Foot In Hell" is almost as strong as "King of the Dead", especially the titletrack and "Doomed Planet", and the last album "Paradise Lost" Ive never heard unfortunately.

At the end I just have to mention that Clrith Ungol are probably the band with the greatest fantasy-covers in Heavy Metal history... it would be great to have them as giant posters dressing my walls! It's a pity that this band ceased to exist due to endless number of disappointments in their carreer... but I think that knowing that one's albums are very rare and expensive items nowadays probably make those guys feel a bit proud in the end, hopefully. These guys deserve their cult-status!

Witchfynde

Witchfynde is another early 80s band from England. Unlike Demon, the music of Witchfynde is more influenced by Black Sabbath. It is more heavy and dragging, although the vocals are more melodic. The band's attitude towards occultism and things appears more serious and is directly expressed on the cover of "Give'em Hell", showing a goat and a pentagram.

My favourite album is Witchfynde's second,

My favourite album is Witchfynde's second, "Stagefright". It is very melodic with great hooks and a moody feeling. The style differs from straight forward Metal ("Would not be seen dead in Heaven") to pure ballad ("Madeleine").

Later on, Witchfynde changed their vocalist. Unfortunately, as far as I'm concerned. The musical style went back to a more slow and heavy way while the black attitude stayed. Witchfynde's final album "Lords of Sin" has a nice gatefold cover and contains a live EP with old songs. The cover photography and the line-up pics inside could have been from a today Black Metal album.

Witchfynde may not be a root of the recent Black Metal musical movement, but they could have been . I think their albums are hard to get nowadays (although the last two were on Belgian MAUSOLEUM), but for those who are rummaging London's record exchange shops from time to time, it may be worthy to look for.

SLAUGHTER "Strappado" (Diabolic Force)

To be honest with you I find it not necessary to write about this cult-LP, but I noticed that this album gets more and more forgotten... and this is something that should not happen! Slaughter from Canada admitted in their early days being influenced by Hellhammer/ Celtic Frost, Slayer and a touch of Punk...and yes, that was indeed the band's style! After two successful demotapes ("Bloody Kamage"/ "Surrender or Die"), they recorded their one and only album in 1986, but due to some fuckin' problems, it wasn't released until 1987. "Strappado" is certainly one of the best releases in that particular year, it was the perfect album for people who still were faithful to the harsh side of Thrashing Death Metal, ... and we should keep in mind that bands like Anthrax, Helloween, Overkill, Testament, etc. ruled the scene back then. "Strappado" was hardly known by the European headbangers due to its very bad distribution, so interested maniacs (like me back then) had to pay high import prices for this LP.

But the record is worth every penny /pfennig, because you seldomely hear such classics as the slow and cruel



"F.O.D.", the neckbreaker "The Curse", the pure nightmare "Nocturnal Hell", the powerful "Incinerator" and of course the ultarheavy "Tales of the Macabre", a song about Charles Manson. This LP is very heavy and intense, it has such a raw 'n' dirty guitarsound, and it's great to listen to both vocalists Terry and Dave... both of them know to convince! Every fan of Black/ Thrash/ Death Metal should definitely have this album in his collection, even if you have to pay more than \$30/\$40 for it... the album is still worth the money, and even more...



EXORCIST "Nightmare Theatre" (Roadrunner/Cobra)

A mystery still surrounds this band and its members. Some people say that the guys from Virgin Steele hide behind Exorcist (at least the album was produced by one of the guys)... and I can't rid of the feeling that the Piledriver guy had his hands in Exorcist. Just listen to "Nightmare Theatre", and you'll detect some parallels to Piledriver, both lyrically and musically... Both Exorcist and Piledriver know to combine obscurity with (a touch of) humour.

When it comes to the metallic style of Exorcist I would say it's Black Power / Speed Metal with great traditional Heavy Metal riffs. Listen to the opener "Black Mass"... pure straight ahead pounding Metal! The voice is deep, almost Death Metal like, and is quite dark for my taste. You hear that no amateurs are playing the instruments in Exorcist... good drums, great guitarsoli, etc... Songtiles like "Death By Bewitchment", "Megawatt Mayhem", "Execution of the Witches", speak for themsleves, and so does the (quite amusing and cool) cover! "Nightmare Theatre" is a rare album nowadays, because not many headbangers did pick up this LP back in "86. Go on a second hand LP market and buy this LP instead of three/ four ordinary Black Metal CDs... in case you find it. Good hick!

CARNIVORE "I" (Roadrunner)

Yeah, a lot of horny girls get a wet underpant when looking at Pete Steele, and his new band Type O' Negative managed to be one of the best-selling bands in the Metal / Goth-I don't know what-scene.

But how many of the new fans know about "Lord Petrus Steele" 's scandalous past, about Carnivore? This was one of the most controversial and boycotted bands around. Their debutLP was released in the beginning of '86, and was one of the harshest offerings known to Metal maniacs back then, especially because of Petrus' ugly and hateful vocals. They probably were comparable to the vocals of Venom's Cronos ("Bloodlust"/"In Nomine Sathanas"), but were even more extreme. The music was a sort of powerful Speed Metal with doorny parts, and even today I think it's still great stuff. Nuclear hymns like "Predator", "Male Supremacy" (the first and still best song where Steele uses his deep sung voice), "God Is Dead", etc. still make me bite on my teeth for they are full of anger, simply fantastic! The worst (or best ?) thing at this metallic messenger of world war III and IV were the lyrics which really are below the belt... pure violence without any sign of taste... no boundaries of extremity seem to be

This first LP remains a classic and is certainly a pain in the ass for all wimpy, Metal hating Type O' Negative fans!

"Blood On Ice" was released in May this year I guess, since then I have had a nice Summer off duty so to speak. In August I entered the studio to record my second solo album. It'll be released at start of 1997. It'll be a double album containing 22 songs ranging from brutal Punk stuff to acoustic pieces of unplugged style..."

what was the reason to release "blood on ice" † In old interviews you did not like to release it, because the fans/ critics would say "it sounds like manowar" anyway. Why your change of mind † I mean, the album is great, and it is not a negative thing being compared with manowar, is it †

I guess I have explained the whole situation behind releasing "Blood On Ice" quite well in the CD booklet that follows with the CD (it's dual language English/German). The demand from the fans to release the album was so powerful and the whole project was such a great challenge to me, I felt I really should have a go and try to make a good album out of the original material... About me talking about people probably making comparisons with MADORNA was simply not an excuse for not putting it out, but mainly to show that I was aware of the fact that the comparison was gonna be made by allot of people, not to piss on "Blood On Ice" as an album or MADORNA as a band."

why have you re-recorded the vocals t weren't you satisfied with the old ones anymore t were they "different" (like less sung) to the new ones t

The reason why some new vocals was added to the original material was that not all of the tracks had vocals laid down. Read the story on the recording in the CD-booklet on this and you'll get a more detailed picture.

well. In the meantime I got the album on lp. so I now read your words I so. Is there still any unreleased songmaterial existing, or was "blood on ice" the last messenger from the past I I know that you once had a song entitled "witchcraft"... how many old songs have never been recorded I

It's true that there is allot of material still unreleased. Not that I think even half of it is even worth releasing, not even the most die-hard BACDORD fan could enjoy some of it. There is some demo-stuff made in 1983 and early 1984, some songs from an album that was never completed from the end of the 80s etc... "Witchcraft"

is a really old song. I don't even remember how to play or sing it, so unfortunately that is a track that no one will ever be able to hear. I'm not even sure I have a tape of it anywhere...

talking about "requiem" and "octagon": a lot of fans are not very fond of those albums and are [to say the truth] disappointed, especially of "octagon"... they say that the typical bathory feeling/atmosphere is gone, how do you see "octagon" compared to all the other lps you did ? why do you think that this album received bad response? I is this anoher bathory album which gets criticised first and halled afterwards?

It's true that whenever BATHORY puts an album out, 50% of our fans are always disappointed. Some of our fans accept the Black/Death type of albums, but cannot listen to the more Nordic/ Epic albums. Others do not like the Black/ Death but hail the Nordic Epic as legendary stuff. About "Requiem" and "Octagon" I think the problem was that people had gotten used to BATHORD sounding a certain way like "Twilight of the Gods"... but here they were offered two albums of brutal Death Metal. Not everybody (who had a definitive idea of what BATHORD was/ is all about) could accept two such brutal albums. In some circles they are considered to be among the best stuff we've done. But as a musician and an artist you can not always write stuff to satisfy all out there. In the end what an album is all about is satisfying yourself. I wanted to make an album like "Requiem" and "Octagon" at that time. I wanted to make a brutal, dry and violent production at the time. What one person may think of any album is not important... there is always other albums to listen to should you not like the new one."

what do you see when you look into the crystal ball when it comes to bathory's tomorrow?

I have a million of ideas for the future. I don't know yet the specific style and what it may sound like, but I promise that it is gonna be something really special. We are gonna start working on the next BACHORD album next year, and hopefully it will be out sometime early Summer next year. No titles as of yet though...'

to what kind of music are listening nowadays † you often said that you don't listen to metal very much... but you play metal... why this †

I listen to virtually everything really. I have no specific favourite type of music now a days... I hardly buy CDs and follow no "living" acts die-hard."

when you think of old bands, which ones have survived in your heart to do you still listen to them here and then t

'Slayer have always had a big place in my heart, because they have remained true to their style and sound. As far as any other old acts... I guess most of them are gone since long now ... VEROM reunited for one show, but other than BACHORD. SIMPER, METALISCA and I guess one or two others there aren't any bands around from the really old days."

well, I can not agree, just think of kreator, megabeth, sodom, RAZOR, EVEN NECRONOMICON, etc. are still around, even if their sound has changed during the years...

you once said that you made your quorthon sololp, because you were for still are 1) a big kiss fan. so, what do you think of all the ne-union stuff that happens today t not only kiss, but also venom, twisted sister and even sex pistols try to revive their old days i Why are so many people but to see all those pands t don't all the new Bands of today have anything exciting to offer anymore?

I can not believe that I have ever said I made the first solo album because I am/ were a 1355 fan. That was never the reason. The reason was to take a step aside and see what could be done outside of BACHORD for fun really. I guess ultimately the people who gets the most out of all these re-unifications and revival stuff are the fans/ the audiences. They will decide which act should fail or succeed, there's really nothing about any of that. But I would have preferred to see the original kiss without make-up and blood on this world tour...

will you go to one of those kiss gigs in near future 1 and what about venom ?

I will probably go to see \$355 in Stockholm in three weeks but never in a life time should I go to see PEADA... not even if anyone pays me a million Deutsch Mark to go and see them.

this you can tell your grandma, but no me, haha I but let's continue... Bathory has been one of the bands (like bulldozer, hellhammer, sodom, etc.) who got ridiculed by the press in the mid sos... Which were the worst reactions you ever got ? do you still remember some of the old reviews t

I guess there is a time when we all care allot for reviews and stuff... for allot of years now I have not been bothered with even reading my own interviews or reviews on 那個工事の配到 albums... I don't care at all ... I have been doing this stuff now for 14 years and have not too much love for the media for no other reason other than that I feel a single person's idea about an album should not influence thousands of readers whether they should buy it or not ... the Führer-Prinzip, you know ...

yes, that's true, but reviews are necessary for a rough orientation, aren't they ? also, a bad review can sometimes be a reason for some maniacs to Buy an album...

the new wave of Black metal was heavily influenced by your first three lps, and you were regarded as a kind of god for many new Black metal musicians. But when I read newer interviews of you, I can't get RIO of the feeling that you like to destroy your "cult status" with statements like "under the sign..." is your worst lp. and things like that. don't you want to be a kind of idol for all those young satanists t or is black metal something that belongs to the past, and that you can't take for serious anymore ?

It's not a question of wanting to be an idol or not... I am just perfectly honest when I say "Under the Sign of the Black Mark" is not a very good album at all. It's just my personal opinion. I am not trying to kill the BACHORD legend and piss on the cult status around the name BACDORD and our albums. But all this legend status and cult or whatever you may call it was created by other people and I have nothing to do with that (You certainly have something to do with that... you created the mystery around 强烈飞扬争张的 in the beginning, and most important, you created the music... - ed.). When I say I don't like some 那須匹功の私D stuff, some BAC的ORD fans go crazy and raise hell because I talk bad about a BAC的ORD album, like if I wasn't in a position to be able to have an opinion at all... Of course I know how much BACTIONS has meant to hundreds of bands and to tens of thousands of fans... but to me BACHORD is just another act. Very little of what BATHORD has done over the years is really good, most is shit... but the important thing is that we all understand when and how this stuff was recorded... we have to put everything into its right time-slot. We all progress, develop, improve and

how has quorthon as a person changed during the years?

The same way we all change... we grow and get older and wiser with time... better musicians and better understand what life and music is all about... well, most of us I

what differs the new Black metal wave from the old one ? are those two scenes comparable in your opinion? can you take most of the new bands for serious, or are they just a horde of teenagers for you who just like to provocate with the help of satan ?

No. One cannot compare BACDORD, Slaper, Benom, Bellhammer, Sobom and the rest of the old acts with what's happening today. Mainly because first of all more than ten years seperates these acts with what's going on out there today. It's true we influenced a lot of these new acts but it's an entirely different market and scene now than ten years ago. These new acts carry the torch on into the future and I love it even though I know absolutely nothing about what they sound like or their names... I don't believe Black Metal was ever dead at all.... music will always be



around, only fashion comes and goes.

please could you tell us how many copies you have sold of each album t would be interesting to know... I guess you still sold a lot of cos/lps in the 90s as well, after black metal came back to beign 1

The sales figures concerning BACDORD was never affected of the fequency of Black Metal in fanzines or magazines... We have sold more and more for each year even though the market is allot tougher now a days. There are so many acts out there today, today a new act can be glad to sell more than 10.000 copies of a debut album. It's not fair to compare sales figures because our first album has been out for 12 years and is considered a classic, whereas "Octagon", or my solo album are totally different type of albums and have only been out for a short time. But I have been able to live from the albums alone for the past five years, so we sell allot of albums around the world."

why are you so faithful to Black mark ? I mean, they haven't released anything that was as strong as Bathory... haven't you got any other offers from bigger labels so far ?

That's your personal opinion that BLACK MARK hasn't released anything as strong as BACHORD ... it's true that we are their first babies in the sense that we sell more than any other act even though we do not tour and make videos like the others. we mean allot to them as far as prestige and credibility is concerned and they do allot for us because of that... We also draw attention to the label and this in the end helps allot of great young acts reaching a record contract and an album release, etc... of course we have been approached by other major labels, but we have always said "no" to each and everyone of them basically because we want to remain an independent band on an independent label... the same reason why we never signed any big merchandise contracts.

which were the coolest, most memorable things you experienced with Bathory ? I can imagine that having a Band helps you to see a lot of people and different countries...

'I don't know really.... what about fucking girls in limousines and 747s at 20.000 feet above the atlantic (sounds great ! -ed.), or signing autographs for six hours in two continents on promo trips, or doing TV and radio... I don't know... the greatest thing is probably having been able to make music and putting on Vinyl/CD... the other is the love and support from hundreds of thousands of fans all these years... money couldn't buy that I tell you, man!

yes, I can imagine this I you can't beat the feeling, haha I ... heavy metal seems to be a musical style that cannot be killed; it's alive for about 26 years now III why do you think is metal still popular, why doesn't it ever get out of style ?


'Metal has got a specific sound and style that is very definitive even though threr is a big difference between bands like Bon Jovi (is this Metal ??? -ed.) and BURZUM. But call it Hard Rock, Metal. Black Metal. Death Metal. Speed. Thrash, Epic, Doom, Gothic, Grunge or whatever... its the guitar based hard style right through it all... Metal and Rock will never die!

there's talk of a Bathory tribute lp/cd... have you already heard some of the Bands that will be included on that release ! have you heard any bathory covers at all so far ?

I have known about several BACHORD tribute albums being made over the past two or three years, but I haven't yet heard of any out on the market... I know that several bands have done BATHORD covers on their album and I have even heard a few of them... It's great and you feel proud and start to think how much the stuff that I have done for these years have meant to a whole generation of Metal fans.... are the bathory hordes still existing ?

BATHORD Borbes is just a bond of fans... there's no official fan club or anything... anyone into BATHORD is a horde member/ warrior." any final message to the fans !

Thank you for all these years of great memories... You are all part of the BATHORD legend... without you it would never have been possible. Hail the



MERCILESS Records is a growing underground label for sure, and so far Volker, the guy behind this institution, didn't disappoint me with any of his releases (UNSOD, DESASTER, MORTEM, ...), so I thought I might give him a chance to talk through this issue about the past, his plans, etc.

When did the idea appear to become an active member of the Metal underground? Do you still know how it was when you began your activities under the name "MERCILESS"?

In the middle of 1989 I begun to write to bands and labels to ask for their stuff, because well-known distribution services where quite too expensive (LP 25,-). I always asked for 10 LPs and the prices I've got were cheap for me. I made a lot of real bad experiences with fuckin' rip offs like SERAPHIC DECAY Records, etc. At this time I also got in touch with Euronyomous, he started just at the same time DEATHLIKE SILENCE Production. His first release was the Merciless "The Awakening" album. The sellings of this album where so incredibly good for me, that I've decided to call my distribution service MERCILESS!

It took you some years until you managed to release a band's product or MERCILESS... why did it took so long? Lack of money or lack of bands?

I never had the thoughts "I must have a release out". But after H.S.B. Records from Holland had released the Ungod "Circle of..." LP, the band wanted to release a CD version as well. Economical problems at H.S.B. Records prevented this plan, so we all decided to re-release the album on CD through MERCILESS Records.'

You have released three full-length LPs/CDs so far, not really much, but I guess that there are already plans for the upcoming time. Would you reveal some of them to us? What will be next on MERCILESS?

T've to correct you, Costa, the 4th MERCILESS album is out now (oh, I've forgotten to count the Martyrium CD! -ed), Mortem's "Demon Tales"! But yes, it's not really much, quality is more important than quantity. There are of course plans for future activities, but nothing's sure now, so I don't let you know. Next release will be a Desaster "Stormbringer" Mini album, and Acheron "Anti God, Anti Christ" Vinyl (LP), with bonus tracks, which is a license product from MORIBOUND Records.'

Sounds good! Have you tried to sign a band without being successful at the end? If yes, which bands were these? By the way, for what kind of bands are you generelly looking?

It's always difficult to know in advance if a band will be successful at the end, I believe in the bands I sign! I'm looking for original Metal bands which are able to push adrenalin with their music in my veins.'

What does a label need (except for good bands) to be successful? What is the most important thing for the sales? Is it hard for you to get your stuff sold on an international basis?

To be honest to yourself! Important things are also bands which are involved in the underground, promotion work and good contacts to other labels/ distros. Pechaps I'm in contact with more than 200, so the sellings on an international basis are quite ok.'

As you are doing your distribution service for some years now...: What experiences have you made during that time with all those labels, bands, etc? I heard that the old NO FASHION guy has heavily ripped you off, and that you (as a result) once visited him due to that..., right?

Fuckin' Rip Offs destroy the scene! Destroy that what is destroying you! Yes, I visited Tomas after he tried to rip me off(and several others as well). He was looking very strange when I stood eye to eye before him, and saying "Hey, I'm Volker from MERCILESS Records, Germany. And I don't wanna be ripped by you!" This asshole was using all the money he's received for drugs! I found some interesting goods in his apartment, and said "Thanx, good bye!".'

What do you think of the business-side of Metal anyway?

Too many people with money -making attitude are in business, and they are selling out

the scene. I really hate the business-side, but it's important for a financial existance, so I've to do some unpleasant compromises.'

How have your customers' (behaviour/ taste) changed during the years? You often sell at concerts, so there isn't a lack of personal experiences...

The customers didn't change over the years! Mostly long-haired, beer-drinking headbangers like me. From 14 up to 40 year-old people. I want the personal contact with the customers, so you can find me at a lot of concerts.'

Once you said that you are (again) going to distribute stuff that is more underground, but when I take a look at your current lists I must say that it's more the trend stuff instead of the underground one... Why this? Has your principle changed in order to stay alive (financially)?

Hey, I don't like this question (I know! -ed.)! Well, that's probably the compromise that I've mentioned in the "business" question. What can I say, I'm going step by step forward, any other direction would be stupid. I never want to leave the underground and I never deny my roots. Years ago I was one of the first in Germany who was selling stuff of the new age of Black Metal I'm still selling the same kind of stuff from the same labels! So please Costs, tell me out of your eyes what is wrong with me! I always try to find out bands with self-financed CDs or new labels! How would you describe "underground"? (Oh, it's me who's fucked now, because that's a tough question to answer. Let's say it this way: Underground is the institution beyond the commercial trends, but it's really hard to find nowadsys, I must admit! However, leave the real boring trendy releases in the dust, that'as the only way to make shit disappear!-ed.)
You released a lot of German stuff like INICOD HIMCOD HARD.

You released a lot of German stuff, like UNGOD, FULGOR, CABAL, MARTYRIUM, DESASTER. MORTEM is the only exception as they hail from Peru. Why this interest in German bands? Do you think it's your job to bring German Metal some attention again? Are there any other German bands you'd like to sign in future?

Difficult question for me. To be honest, I really don't know. The reason is probably the easy work, no problems with translation, etc. At the moment I don't have plans for more German bands. I don't feel responsible for the attention of German Metal scene, but I hope to have done part of it (Yes, you have ! -ed.). Bands have to do that with good music!'

Although you are one of the smaller labels, you decided to still press your releases on Vinyl as well.... Is it easy to sell LPs? Is the interest in vinyl still strong as far you can tell?

It's definitely not easy to sell LPs, because German postage rates kill! I've got a collection of circa 1.200 LPs, and I want to see my products on vinyl as well. The interest in Vinyl is still alive, but mostly by people who are older than around 25 years.'

How is your personal metallic taste? Are there any LPs in your collection you would defend with your life, hehe? Perhaps the first MERCILESS LP (the band!)? Since more than 16 years I'm listening to Metal music now, always to the underground-like stuff. Yes, you are right, there are some items in my collection I would defend with my life, like the Merciless album. But also the raries of Mercyful Fate, Mayhem, Possessed, Venom, 1st Watchtower or any others.'

Have you ever tried to create an own band? How would your own band sound if you had the ability of a musician like (let's say) Glenn Tipton?

I never had the idea to create a band, I can't play any instrument and cannot even sing, so it would sound horrible! But when I would be a musician, I would create a kind of Metal which would sound totally different to the wellknown music. Like Mercyful Fate or VolVod had done.

IROnsword



Those of you who think that real traditional Heavy Metal is dead should better continue to read, because IRONSWORD is here to teach you a lesson !!! Tann, who's the only warrior behind this growing Portuguese Metal force, managed to record a promotape which includes three songs of pure metallic delight. It's a very promising tape, this is the beginning of something that will grow strong in future. After an ordinary intro a song called "I am the Defender" awaits you, a simple but effective atmospheric tune that knows to convince, followed by "The Flame and the Sword", which is a great track with strong riffs reminding me a lot at early IRON MAIDEN ("Phantom of the Opera"), cool. The final song is 100%ly a highlight for all old Metalbangers... it starts off with a JUDAS PRIEST/RUNNING WILD-like riff and has a MANOWAR kind of chorus... no wonder why the song is called "Battlecry". All three songs are done with certain intelligence, you feel this when listening to them, and it's great to hear that Tann tries to sing, he simply dares it, even if his voice isn't perfect yet. He even uses high screams, something that nobody (except for the old bands) does nowadays. The feeling is right and you hear that IRONSWORD seems to be a honsest mission of forgotten Heavy Metal, with no commercial or trendy background.

Therefore I'm proud to present you this long interview with Tann, the creator of this promising band...

Most of the readers have surely never heard of IRONSWORD before, so would you introduce it? For what does your creation stand?

I'll introduce just by saying that Ironsword is a Metal band in the old forgotten spirit of the 80s, may it be Heavy Metal or Power Metal, I don't care what people label me or if they like my work or not, I make music for myself only and not with the main intention of pleasing the audience.

Ironsword is more than music. It's Lusitanian art, culture brought from the past. I live through Ironsword!

Only a few months ago I started spreading my band across all nations, that's why most readers never heard of it before. My band is new in flesh and soul, but quite old in spirit. It's a long time dream of mine that became a neverending quest, of creating something different, unique, where I could see myself as a bard warrior singing, narrating legends, visions, dreams of my homeland kingdom which I rightfully belong. To pass all my feelings, emotions, knowledge to music and poetry. I had this huge urge but only recently I decided to move forward with it.'

You mailed out a 3-track promotape... what were the reactions to it? I mean, it's not music that people are used to hear from a new "band".

'Yes, I consciously know that! Times have changed, but not me... This promo recorded during Yule '95 ev, was the first step. I guess I owe a bit to some fanzines who got really interested and intrigued when I sent them the presentation booklet, such as your case actually. It encouraged me when I faced all of a sudden million requests for listening any audio stuff of mine. It wasn't necessary too much time to convince me, so I just asked a friend of mine if I could record at home on his 4 track recorder some songs, and immediately the whole thing was done. I maybe have rushed things a bit according to my plans, but when you see opportunaties, it's better to seize them before it's too late! A kind of gift !!

However, on one hand the reactions I could ascertain were right according to my predictions, no big surprise! I have full conciousness of all weak points on that promo, and the hard ameliorations I have to work in future. On the other hand, for my astonishment there was a complete adherence to my so dated sound. I hail all those who loyally supported me! I'll keep the spirit alive, still fighting in the name of Heavy Metal! That's what I offer with respect...

Has the tape brought you any useful fruits (beside personal satisfaction of course)?

'It's too early to say... it makes me reflect alot when you're suddenly faced with several identical comments such as "IRONSWORD is the last hope in the Heavy Metal underground scene" or "I haven't heard such a brilliant traditional thing for ages!" ... another gift, perhaps !! (I guess so as I

agree to these comments as well! -ed.)

I feel proud and completely satisfied with that tape, afterall a 4 tracker limitates your composing, but I just wanted to capture the "feeling" of the power and energy, spontaneous as possible. I still have alot to learn on my way. For the moment, I will concentrate on the work I've started with all my heart. I'm not running after any throne! My ego is not bigger than myself! Let's wait and be patient... Great and fuckin' seldom attitude indeed! Some of you arrogant (Black) Metal musicians out there should better think in that way, too, instead of praising themselves too much. But back to you, Tann: How came the idea to play music that is totally in the traditional 80s Heavy Metal style ??? I hear nothing but old (direct) influences like MANOWAR, JUDAS PRIEST, IRON MAIDEN, RUNNING WILD, etc. in your creations....

'Well, I've always kept the flame of Heavy Metal burning inside me, alive! Musical evolution does not make part of my vocabulary. Being faithful to the roots and traditions is my priority! So, consider it a natural thing from my part, to continue what others left behind and held high once! As I told you it was something I had planned long ago, but for some reasons I never got the chance to achieve. I cannot imagine how it would be if I had started 6 years ago!

People should believe more in themselves. If a

person really knows what he wants, he gets there easily. On the contrary, if you don't know your destiny, you end up wasting too many time going round in circles. The most important is to define our goals that hich we like to do. Also, I cannot permit that others oppose to what I like to do... I am free! I am a musician, I play what I like, in solitude I've followed with enormous pasion my musical rainbow path!'

So what is missing in today's music if you have dedicated yourself to the old style? Why doesn't most of the new stuff fascinate you anymore?

' Alot of people do not understand such a phenomenom, but I remember when Metal was a way of life, something united, mystical. Metal was always connected to the concept of freedom and that's what I miss mostly from the 80s. The early 90s were ofuscated by excess and bad quality that we can so witness nowadays. Millions of shitty bands with rockstar attitudes! Nowadays it's more a matter of image, perhaps it's a reflex of lack of motivation, lack of identity from the new generations. I regret as well the fact that Metal is now a musical vicious business, all the pure values and principles were easily betrayed by materialism and commercialism (yes, but capitalism gets more extreme and knows no boundaries, unfortunately! -ed.). Some of the responsibilities for all this change I can point some people from the media who wanted to make Metal a normal style of music, image, mixed among others. These people only speak good of what they like or what is fashion, they don't pay attention to what the audience wants Probably, if I had today 13 years old and listen to the first time a modern Metal band, I certainly would not enjoy it, since it's too mundane. That'a why I avoid all reading big magazines or listening radioshows, etc...

Nothing is dead as it seems, although nothing returns in the same form... for several people Metal is a fashion, and all fashions after a while disappear for these people, but not for a certain elite!

It all starts when you're trying to be a part of today's society and you're rejected. In Singapore, I think, it's forbidden to have long hair! I remember 10 years ago when you walked on a crowded sidewalk, dressed with black leather, spikes, etc. everyone point you as a menace! So, everything starts somewhere, somplace...

It's rare to find new stuff that really fascinate me, there are some exceptions, but it's rare. I rather listen to traditional Metal, Classical music or folk music which are two other pure musical sources.

For any cause, there is a reason, and a truth behind it. Or you believe and fight, or...'

it. Or you believe and fight, or...

Why do you do a band on your very own? Aren't you open for other musicians to join your misson or is it simply too complicated to find musicians that fit into the band?

'First of all it's too complicated to find good musicians, concilliating taste for old Metal sounding, as well as individuals with strong character and personality, with interest for Portuguese historical background, etc. It's too difficult, you know. It's not healthy for a band having always an unstable line-up. Every member for Ironsword should be like me, which is something impossible! That's not of my interest having a complete line-up, I don't care as it's useless! Not even when I first idealised Ironsword, and according to my plans this shall prevail. That's why I follow my path alone, as I feel capable to be in charge of all things, really capable enough.

Besides, all the experiences I had of playing in bands before didn't leave me with such good memories, and I always felt I had to accomodate and compromise to others which had the result of slowing me down, to share with others my personal ideas, etc. That is why this quest must be shared by myself only, because it is too intimate, and still I am trying to prove something to myself. When a group of people, may it be clan, team or band, do don't respect each other, there can be no harmony in it, unless it is for materialistic purposes, but then it's just a small concept box of appearent happiness! I

rather remain pure at heart with no materialistic goal above my own life...'

What about other songmaterial? Have you already developed some more new old-sounding songs? Please give some details...

Hopefully very soon! Yes, still this Autumn I'm planning to enter a decent studio and record a demotape entitled "Power Metal Thunder" with 6 new songs, so everyone with no restrinctions, will certainly lay their hands on new Ironsword release, on the contrary of the promo which was only available to fanzines, mags, radioshows. This time I can offer more time of music, more quality and more Power Metal old sounding. A real important presentation card for everyone...

I'm still in a composition phase, but I have some new songs ready like "Warriors Blood" and "Stormbound", which are going to be factured on this demo.

And I guess that's it for this year. In spite of all the invitations I have to participate in several compilation CDs, etc., the idea of wasting material in everycomer who says he's interested in Ironsword, does not cheer me up! So far, I refused all offers! Let's wait and see how things develop for my side, then I can decide... only time will tell now!"

"Power Metal Thunder"

Do you think that there's still a market for real Heavy Metal music the way it was meant to be?

'With all these small labels popping up like mushrooms? That we can so easily find in record stores so many releases of bands who don't know how to handle their instruments? With shitty rehearsalsound? Five thousand bands all sounding like Pantera, Sepultura or Paradise Lost?

Major labels who offer honesty and trust to their artists, when these great values are something you possess inside and do not give for free, unless you want something in exchange - "music for profit!" - and the values become senseless? Or just be something enslaved on the hook of vicious musical business? Surviving? There can be a market of course. Just close your eyes, and lesser man in wise, for he is in deep sleep to the world he lives, and the hunted prey who dwells within the calls to be slaughtered... enslavement is unbearable... but the hunters still make profit of the dead useless meat to eat!"

IRONSWORD is based upon paganism, and I noticed that you are really into it. When did this subject started to interest you? Any special moment for the "aha!" effect?

'There wasn't such a thing as the "aha!" effect! Yes, I am a free man and I truly recognize myself! There was an intersection of factors who contributed for the manifestations and senses that I was enable to interpretate and understand before. At school in my chikihood I heard for the first time the first inhabitants of Portugal, the Lusitanians, an Iberian tribe of Pre-Cektic origin who fought during centuries the Roman legions who came to the Peninsula to conquer by force our kingdom and to enslave all tribes.

This interest increased as time passed by and I soon realised that this part of Portuguese history, although very restrict, as some of the events are mixed with legends, is very rich and significant, and how I felt more than linked with that, I started to buy all books possible on my homeland ancestors, visiting pagan sites, exploring and researching regions, monuments, studying all in detail, drawing maps, etc., and it became a quest just naturally...

It makes me puke why most of the Portuguese historians ignore this part of Portuguese history, labeling the Lusitanians as "Savages" and "Barbarians", when their known intentions was to form one Iberian Nation early that time in the Peninsula by the gathering of all tribes. If they were really barbarians, the kind of "drink, rape and kill",

how come they fought for their freedom for centuries against the biggest and powerful potency of that age, the Roman Empire? ... and that's not all, several christian churches destroyed several archeological evidences from that time just to finish with probable "incentives for pagan practices and supersticions"!!! I just don't recognize nowadays in Portuguese people's mentality and behaviour any heritage left by the Lusitanians! Slaves of modern technology and materialism... (We are living in a century of with the biggest lost of old values ever, frustrating as it is. But it's a sign of the upcoming chaos.! -ed.).

I think it needs a certain time, when you have a different uncommon vision towards life and death, to shout "That wich does not kill us, makes us stronger", and important it is to play the character role of Nietzsche's Zarathustra, once in a while or probably always, as only a free man is capable enough of influence his own destiny...'

Portugal is a nice country, you certainly agree, don't you? But can you fully live a pagan lifestyle in your country? Are you dependend on any kind of jobs in order to live? Do you live in an old house with the right old atmosphere of forgotten times?

'Of course Portugal is a wonderful country, I live here, remember !! There isn't only sun, beaches, good food and cheap prices. In spite of the "Romans" who want us as puppets... Well, I am employed, you have to work to get paid here and I live in a normal flat! For something more than a philosophy or a way of life in a visionsight, adapting to new parameters, base upon old noble values and principles that the elder ones lived in harmonious balance with nature, makes a free man constantly moving, longing in a place called Mother Earth ! Through blood and soil you can fullfill all desires... But back to music: To play in the old traditional Heavy Metal style affords playing some coverversions first to get the right feeling, so which songs have taught you this great old style ? What do you think are the most important musical forces for the invention of new riffs?

Hmmm... I don't think so. I learned everything by mysellf only, when a cousin of min who plays in a folk band offered me an accoustic guitar on my birthday. I never bought books, nor tapes either ... at the beginning at least, I never was able to do an decent coverversion, because they were too difficult. The only thing I could get was just a few riffs, you know. However, Motorhead was always favourite for coverversions. Songs like "Bomber", "Iron Fist", "Deaf Forever", "Built for Speed", "Killed by Death", "Back at the funny Farm", etc. such nostalgy it brigs... However, at the moment it is not so difficult as it was, but hard to cose, among AC/DC, Saxon, etc., but in near or distant future. it's not concrete though, I will definitely do a coverversion of Manilla Road! They're absolutely brilliant (Yes, indeed ! -ed.) !

Ironsword naturally was brought to live, by several factors all mixed together. There are alot of things that inspire me, not only musically, but nature, Portuguese mythology and protohistorical background, etc. Musically, I'm inspired by everything I consider good quality music, from classical music like Mussorgsky, Grieg, Barber, Prokofiev, Handel, Debussy; folk stuff like The Chieftains, Clannad, Hedningarda, etc. etc. etc. ...and of course 80s Metal in general...

The loud pounding of my Lusitanian pagan heart is the most important musical force for the invention of new riffs...'

Is it an advantage or disadvantage for you to hail from Portugal? Does the Portuguese scene get the international attention which it deserves?

'I am proud of being born in Portugal, of being a Lusitanian in blood, heart and spirit... even if it's nowadays occupied by "Romans", but this happens everywhere, in every society, in every government... In my viewpoint, there are no disadvantages or advantages, at least for me. I follow my path alone longing for the ancient homeland, and do you think

others care about our History, ancestors, etc.?

Portuguese scene does not have a big international attention, because it is not so popular, only 3 or 4 bands can be detached from the rest. You know, where once was cooperation and support, now there is only envy and greed. They don't show respect or any sympathy for others, so why should I care? I don't want to be backstabbed by those who proclaim themselves my brothers...

It is so disappointing, when here in Portugal everyone wants to be the clone of some modern thing... but it leaves the ways open to others, but as I told you I follow in a different path, alone, and I'm very misanthropic, only those who respect me, have the same treatment... I cannot change anything, at least for now, but I think this will never happen, because no one would understand me, as they never understood my ancestors...'

Usually bands look out for contacts with other bands that are in the same direction, but I guess you will have your difficulties with that as there aren't many similar bands like IRONSWORD around, right? I think there's nothing much left but MANOWAR, ha ha....

'I'm not sure if there are similar bands like Ironsword, apart from the creators, Manowar, etc., but I guess I'm not the only one. This Earth is so big! But if there is, they are totally unknown for me, I've even heard of a couple, but I'm a bit lazy to get in touch, and to judge. You see, alot claim to play in the old style, but most are just a weak attempt to sound old, because they don't have the spirit, the schooling... (I totally agree, but as long as those bands are successful, they'll continue to release this kind of 'False Old Metal", to express it in the Manowar kind of language, haha! - ed.).

I once had this thing of getting in contact with all those I found to be interesting, since I liked their music, but at the end most of them revealed to be a big dissapointment, because they had no brains or they were just trying to impress others etc. ... for countless reasons.

I have my contacts all over the globe, but I have one in particular, which is Manú da Silva, ex-roady of Trust and Iron Maiden, who has a new label, and a Bar (Eddie's Bar) in Algarve, in the south of Portugal, a very known touristic place... Eddie's Bar is a cool place.'

If somebody would damn you on a lonely island, which (let's say five) albums would you take with you if you have the chance to ?

'Ah!...that's easy! Manowar "Into Glory Ride", Manowar "Sign of the Hammer", Manowar "Hail to England", Manilla Road "Open the Gates", Manilla Road "Metal", etc. etc. etc... there are so many!! Is there anybody out there who has the guts to damn me on a lonely island? Anyone, please? (Perhaps some old Roman imperators, if our modern technology manages to raise them from their graves, hehe! -ed.) But, I shouldn't reimd you, sorry to be the spoiler, but on a lonely island there is no electricity!!"

Well, the one who damns you should be mercilful and give you (beside a cheap record player) a bicycle with a dynamo to produce some electricity (ride for Metal)! But enough bullshit talked now...

How do you rehearse your songs? Do you use a drumcomputer when writing music or is it all inside your head?

'Every symphony that I create has its origin in my head. When sometimes I'm composing a certain guitar riff or acoustic bass, I immediately imagine how the rest like instruments, vocals, effects are going to be. Then I record all instruments on several tapes and rehearse one at each time. I sometimes use the drum machine just when I'm experimenting the rhythmic section.'

Any final greetings at the end?

'I raise my ale filled cup and hail with power to all those who've been massively supporting me, we are all brothers at arms! It was really a nice pleasure answering your questions, and I just hope that anyone survived after reading all this ...(I hope that those who lay their hands on TALES OF THE MACABRE are not buying it just because of the photos! -ed.). I don't like to reveal my plans, but expect always the unexpected from my band, everything is so unpredictable...

Look out for my new demo "Power Metal Thunder", if you like 80s Heavy Power Metal sounding.

All the best to you Costa, and thanks for giving me thisopportunity!

DEFACED CREATION "Resurrection"

You'll hear 5 songs of fast, aggressive and great Death Metal à la Deicide on this black 7inch. Power is guaranteed here, and those four Swedish guys really know to play and write great riffs. This is untrendy and immortal music, and I think you should get your copy of this good (and limited) single in case you like this style of music. Try to contact following address: Ergen Bylander. DEAD "Slaves to abysmal Perversity"

Perverse is the right word for this single's cover"art"work (fuckin' 'n' suckin'), and you expect the music to sound like shit. But hat's not the case here, Dead play very powerful Death Metal with gory vocals (à la old Carcass), and it sounds damn good. This band seems to be an exception from the rule when it comes to the musical quality in comparison to most of the other gory 'n' perverse bands. Get this 4 song-single (red vinyl) if you're seeking for untamed energy.

ABJUSATE "Confound Eternal" (Of God's Disgrace)

Abigail returns with a second 7'inch. Their two songs are in the typical Abigail vein (one of them can be found on th previously released piece of vinyl as well), old fashioned simple Black Metal. I like it !!!



MASTER / EXCISION (Moonlight)

Paul Speckmann never surrenders! Master are still alive, and their single-side (consisting of three songs) presents music in the typical old ass-kicking Master way (a lot of doublebass doses, simple riffs, etc.)... I enjoy it! Let's hope that these songs will not be the last songs from Master, I'm waiting for more!!! Excision are a Dutch band and play great Death Thrashing Metal with great guitarwork and quite a lot of energy... sounds very professional! So at the end you get two good bands on this 7inch (the layout of it is good!), perhaps a good reason to buy it!

DEAD "Wanted for Kingly Sesions"

The music is almost as good as on the other reviewed Dead- 7inch. Just the cover is (in my opinion) more perverse on this one here. 3 songs (again very powerful) are pressed into the piss-yellow vinyl.... those who have sworn themselves to the gory things in life should have this 7inch in their record collection.

MOURNINGSTAR "Before the Dawn" (Moonlight)

A single with two songs that sound different to the band's stuff from their debut CD "Heretic Metal". This 7 inch has a rawer production and a rawer kind of playing when it comes to the riffs, etc. It all sounds more dirty, so I suppose that this songmaterial is older than the one from the CD. But anyway, musically it's just average what you'll hear, even if it's not unoriginal stuff, but the final deadly strike is missing.



Something's going on in Chicago.... in TALES OF THE MACABRE #2 the band USURPER has found the way on one page, in #3 I had PAZUZU/EZURATE and SCEPTER included, and now, this "unwanted" tradition continues with another band by the name CIANIDE from this city.

All those bands know to cultivate old Metal roots in their powerful music with CIANIDE being the deathliest band of them.

Their "Rage War" demo reached my address, and already the opening song, the titletrack, showed me that this band's work should be honoured with an interview. Musically it's Death Metal with touches of the doomy side of CELTIC FROST, a sort of combination of old and new sounds, all played in a quite heavy way. The vocals are death growls, no imitating of Tom Warrior or anyone else here. The faster parts are sounding very violent and brutal, a feast for people into aggressive stuff! A demo with different faces! The band's axeman (Scott) gives more details about the band...

"Rage War" did really surprise me, and I was even more surprised to read that you already released albums. Why is CIANIDE still a very unknown name in the underground? Has your old stuff been limited to 50 copies only or what?

'Cianide has never been the cool new hip band in the underground and we really don't give a fuck either. We've had two CDs out, and four demos from 1989 through 1996. Our CDs were put out mainly in the U.S., not too many made it to Europe. So perhaps that's why you never heard of us. As for the demos, we went through about 200 copies each except for the new "Rage War" tape which will be 400 copies. We only send out free copies to zines we enjoy and zines we know are still around. We don't worry about sending out 600 free tapes to every zine that has a fucking flyer floating around. Fuck that, I'd rather spend my money on myself. Fuck all these people wanting stuff for free and fuck all these bands who can afford it because they live at home with mom and dad!'

CIANIDE says: "If it's not Metal, it ain't shit"...what do you mean with this? Sounds quite strange to me...

Basically it means "If it's not Metal, then it's not worth listening to". Words to live by, right?"

Oh yes, of course! The word METAL is especially hailed in Chicago when I think of other cool bands like SCEPTER, PAZUZU, USURPER, etc... So I guess that you know and influence eachother, right? Tell us about your relationship with the Chicago METAL INQUISITION!

Yes, we know each other, but as far as influence, no! None of these bands have never had any influence on us whatsoever, perhaps we influence them as we've been around quite a bit longer than any of these bands. We don't know or care if we influence them or not. We do like to get together and get drunk as hell and sing the Piledriver classic... "And if you're not a Metalhead, you might as

well be dead, we're the Metal Inquistion - we sentence you to death - by guillotine." That is the Metal Inquisition Cianide belongs to."

You hail BATHORY, VENOM, HELLHAMMER,...are there any newer bands you hail as well?

'Cianide hails bands who stay true to themselves, Bands who don't fall for the latest underground trend. People who believe in Metal as a life style, not a fuckin' fashion show, Metal is more than dressing up and pretending and thinking you are evil. You're not that evil when you have to go back to your beedroom in your mother's house. There are many newer bands that we like, but we don't care to mention them.'

What will come next at CIANIDE? An album? I'm sure that some labels have already knocked on your door, right?

We are currently recording our third CD entitled "Death...Doom...:Destruction" out in January 1997 on LOST HORIZON Records (??? ed.). We have also recruited another guitarist named "Jim" and recording for the first time as a four-piece band. This is where we are right now! Do you think about re-recording any of your old stuff for a future release? Bands often like to re-record old songs to show that they have improved during the years (remember POSSESSED. KREATOR.

during the years (remember POSSESSED, KREATOR, DESTRUCTION,...)

We will be re-recording the song "The Dying Truth" from our 2nd demo and it was also on our first CD, and a cover song. These two songs will appear on a

was also on our first CD, and a cover song. These two songs will appear on a 7'inch next year after the CD. We are doing a cover of Chicago legends Death Strike.'

Great idea, especially as this old band never got the attention they

Great idea, especially as this old band never got the attention they deserved! Which interesting things have you experienced in Chicago in the last couple of months when it comes to Metal? I heard that old Metal/Speed merchants ANVIL and RAZOR played near your stinky city...

Not much happening in Shitcago over the last few months, but Mercyful Fate will play here soon. We played a cool show with Incantation during the Summer. Just alot drinking, as usua. The Anvil /Razor show did not happen, a cruel rumour!!! I did see Anvil about 10 years ago and the memories have never left my head. Lips is one crazy motherfucker. There were only about 30 people, but they killed anyway. Also Manowar are coming here for the first time in 8 or 9 years!!! I'm dying to see them again, it's been way too long.'

A final message to those who label Metal as dead?

Fools who label Metal as dead are the same fools who will be listening to Metal again once it gets trendy again, fuckin' weakminded fools. Metalheads know Metal will never die, there will always be a demand for Metal and real Metal freaks will always know how to get their fix. So all you real fuckers out there, if you want some real Death Metal, then take some fuckin' Cianide, "Rage War" motherfuckers!"

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
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

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GUARD! After I heard the album for the first time, I didn't know what to think of it, because I wasn't used this kind of musical soft-Metal style. But after listening to it again and again, the gates to enthusiams opened for me, I was trapped within this very emotional and epic sound. The things I appreciate most are William's guitarriffs and solos, they really touch your deepest soul, even more than it was the case at WARLORD. But all it is all more softer than it used to be due to the tamed guitarplaying. The vocals are female and spread a special magic. They aren't 100%ly "perfectly" sung, but especially this make them so interesting, and you hear that there's not 16 year-young girl singing here. But I have to say that I had to get used to the vocals, so don't surrender if they don't appeal to you when listening to them for the first time.

Well, the album contains nothing but kingly and intensive feelings, definitely music for those who demand more from Metal than just aggressive atmospheres. The only thing to criticize, in my opinion, are the lyrics which are very clichee at parts.... But as we are here for the musical side of the story. I can say that LORDIAN GUARD are a band beyond all trends... all you get is skill, originality and honesty when it comes to music.

To catch both bands, WARLORD and LORDIAN GUARD, nobody else but William J. Tsamis had to be contacted...

Hello William, what's up at LORDIAN GUARD? I heard that you are already working on your second album...

Des, we are currently working on the 2nd album, titled "Sinners In The Hands Of Un Ungen Bob". It will be more Barlord orientated; however, it will maintain the sophistication, maturity and epic/medieval quality of Lordian Buard. Prior to the release of the LP/CD, however, we released a single (DicDisc) of the song "Behold 21 Pale Horse" (Side 21), with a Lordian Buard rendition of the Barlord song "Deliver Us From Evil" (Side B). The single is out since October and the LP/CD will be out in December! ME === Are you still happy with the debut LP? I think it's a great album, but it got heavily criticized by some of the big magazines... Doesn't this hurt your motivation to continue with your musical art?

'Yes, I am very happy with the music of the first album. The only thing open to critique, in my opinion, was the production quality. We had a mastering problem with the mastering studio in Bermany, so most of the PPs/Ds released to the magazines were not of the best production. The remastered version sounds much better. Uctually, we received great reviews from almost every magazine, and the fan mail has been extremely supportive. I remember that "Deliver Us" WP was heavily criticized for its production quality when it first came out, but now it is regarded as a classic, so the critics don't really concern me.'

Do you think that LORDIAN GUARD fits into the 90s? I mean, there are not many bands around that play a similar style that you play...

'3 really bon't know what's happening in the 1990s Metal scene, so I'm not really concerned with this. The music of Lordian Buard is epic/medieval Metal, a style which will always appeal to a certain underground audience. Be have a large underground following, so I'm content with that. I will continue to explore this

blend of renaissance/medieval music with Heavy Metal, and I'm certain from fan response that it will appeal to more and more people.'

LORDIAN GUARD is much more emotional and calmer than WARLORD was... why this development? Has your attitude towards (Metal) music changed?

'Raturally, I have grown as a person and a musician, so of course my music will always change a little. Since the Warlord days, I have learned to play keyboards and have exteneded my knowledge of renaissance and medieval music, so

this is all incorporated into the new sound. Mapbe Barlord was heavier in a traditional sense, but the music of Lordian Guard is much darker and medieval than Barlord. For me, it is heavier than Barlord because it contains darker compositional themes. Furthermore, there are more guitar solos in the songs of Lordian Guard (some have 2 or 3 solos), so this gives me more flexibility in my artistic expression.'

still has a sort of 'cult' status today... What do you feel when people are still asking you about that period of your life?

'3' think Barlord has maintained a cult status because it roas a blend of many of the classic. Deavy Metal bands. Almost every Lordian

Buard fan is a Barlord fan as well. Und since Barlord was my band (my ideas, etc.), Lordian Buard is an extension of the Barlord legacy.' How many WARLORD songs have never seen the light of day? And will you continue to use old riffs for LORDIAN GUARD, or aren't you satisfied with your old songwriting anymore?

"Some Barlord songs will be released through Lordian Buard; for example, "Binds of Thot", "Bar in Peaven", and some others which man appear on future LPs/CDs. But even though these songs are "old" Barlord songs, then are Barlord only in the sense of the main riffs. Many aspects of these songs are very new. Als far as being satisfied with my "old" songwriting, this is like asking Beethoven if he liked his 9th symphony more than his 5th (although I'm not comparing myself to Beethoven). Like any artist, a composer grows artistically, so although I am content with the older music, I am also very excited about the new sound as well."

In one interview I read that you don't lister to Metal for many years now... what's the reason for this? Are you afraid that other bands music will probably influence you too much, or is it a lack of interest? I think you should at least listen to some of the epic MANOWAR stuff as it is similar to your

'I bon't listen to Metal because when I'm not roriting or recording, I usually like to listen to something from the renaissance or medieval period. 3 know there are many great Metal groups out there (including Manomar), but 3 simply don't have the time to hear it all. I usually rorite the kind of music that I want to hear; it's bifficult to explain. 3 know Michael Schenker never listened to Metal because he bidn't mant it to affect his original style; however, that's not my reason. Somehow, when you become aMetal composer/player, the magic of listening to others somehow bisappears.'

Was HELLION Records the only label that was interested in LORDIAN GUARD? Are you satisfied with their job?

'I never really actively pursued a deal with any label. I was connencted to Hellion Records (Jürgen Hegervald) through John Kornarens (an 2.21. Metal aficianodo) and 3 have very much enjoned working with Jürgen. De is far and above more honest and professional than those who I worked with in the past. And as we release subsequent projects, the production quality and everything will improve (as you will hear on the upcoming single and LP/CD). So, 3 am very happy with Sellion.'

Joey DeMaio from MANOWAR once said that "people take music so unserious that it is a real problem for me" ... what do you think of this statement?

'I agree with that statement. Just look at what has been popular in the music industry. Us far as I'm concerned, true Epic Metal will always thrive in the underground (although some groups like Iron Maiben and Manomar mabe it vern big). It boesn't matter to me, however. I create my music because I'm an artist. If anyone mants to listen, then're more than welcome, J.S. Bach and Frang Schubert were unheard of in their time, but their music stood the test of time. Ebgar Allen Doe sold his poem "The Raven" for \$14; nevertheless, he is now regarbed as one of the greats. The artist must be concerned with artistic expression and nothing else."

Good and healthy attitude... hope some of the trendy folks will read this, because trendmusic is mortal! Anyway, how would you describe your musi to a person who's not familiar with your band?

'Bell, I guess I would befine it is as "Epic Medieval Metal". The music is vern bark, reminiscent of the Middle Alges and The Crusades; nou know, knights going off to battle and things like that. Many of the songs contain narration, chants, choirs, and sound effects, and melobies progress like Bregorian or Bnjantine music. Most of the lprice contain apocalyptic expressing philosophically the monumental conflict between good and evil. Also, there are a lot of harmonn guitar solos floating over briving thothms. The music is vern melodic.'

Is America the right place for a band like LORDIAN GUARD? Songs like Winds of Thor' don't really sound american...

'America is a bastion of commercialism definitely not a place for Epic / Medieval Metal. 3 mas never influenced by any Umerican bands annman, so both Barlord and Lordian Buard are rooted in the Euro-Metal experience.

Any dreams for the band?

'Not really. Primarily, I am concerned with artistic expression. Like I said earlier, I compose and record a very original form of music; if any wants to listen, then're more than welcome.



Lordian Buard, 3 think, will grow in popularity as subsequent projects are released. The first project certainly exceeded my expectations, not only in sales, but also in positive fan response, My concern right now is with the 2nd LP/CD

will be much fuller and thicker, and the tracks so far sound vern porverful and intense. 3 am certain that the Barlord fans especially will like this new thicker sound. I can't mait for the new release !



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
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EVOL "Dreamquest" (Adipocere)

Black Metal in the South-European vein (Evol is an Italian band) with a clever combination of synths and guitars. The songwriting is quite ok, some parts are really nice, others are just standard stuff. A release which isn't a great but at least a cool one. For fans of this kind of Black Metal this might be something to lay your hands on.

AVULSED "Eminence In Putrescence" (Repulse)

To make it short: Avulsed haven't wimped out... it's still deadly stuff with deeeep vocals. It all got a bit more "drum-orientated", all is done in a more precise 'n' hectical way. They have certainly improved as musicians. I shall not forget to mention the great coverartwork in pure Death Metal style!

SCEPTER "Metal Supremacy" (Self - financed)

Here it is, the first (M)CD of Chicago's Metal cultivators Scepter, and it is in the same style as their cool "Up Thy Ass" demotape. Well, to be exactly, this MCD sounds more serious than the demo, but it's again mid-tempo Metal with touches of old Celtic Frost (guitars) and probably Sodom (vocals).... all is done in a heavy way which is good! The final kick is missing unfortunately (except for the titletrack which is a killing kick in your balls 1), but I'm sure that these three American Metalheads will progress on their next release, so that we can expect "I'm going to Hell" to be an interesting album with the quality of the track "Metal Supremacy". THY SERPENT "Flowers of Witchery" (Spinefarm)

After two succeful demotapes here the first CD offering from Finland's Thy Serpent. It's a melodical, atmospherical but fine Black Metal album which offers good 'n' intelligent songwriting (with acoustic guitars, etc.)... real enjoyable stuff. Finally not just another CD up from the north, but a CD where you hear that a lot of careful work has been invested here. People who are looking for good riffs, melodies should keep this release in mind... this may be something for you!

FROZEN SUN "Unspoken" (DSFA)

To make it short... This is music for baseballcap- people who like the jump around like idiots. Groovy stuff that pisses me off!!!

LYCANTHROPY "The Veils of Sorrow" (PtE)

Fast, raw, badly produced Black Metal from the United States. All sounds very average, just the last of the four tracks has some good moments included, but that's all. Would have been ok for a demo, but not for CD release.

OXIPLEGATZ "Worlds and Words" (Adipocere)

This band is really strange... just take a look at the cover (reminds me at Black Sabbath's "Technical Ecstasy"). Their music is a sort of Black Metal, but it's very hard to describe. It's interesting to listen to this stuff as there are a lot of untypical sounds/ arrangements inside the music... varity is no unknown term here! Well, as this is fuckin' difficult to review I will leave you with the advice to test it yourself at your local CD shop....



ABRAMELECH "Psychostasia" (Repulse)

Scandinavian Death Metal mixed with the power of Bolt Thrower. Great production, it sounds pretty tough! With bands like Abramelech, real dark Death Metal will not rest in peace!!!

FOREST OF SOULS "War and poetry" (Adipocere)

Basically this seems to be a new promising band, their mixture of mystical (Greek styled) Metal and atmospherical music is indeed nice. But then those sung vocals appear, and it makes me shiver. This guy tries to imitate Messiah Marcolin's (Ex- Candlemass) voice, but it sounds very amateurish that it is a pain in my ears. So... keep on rehearsing and rehearsing because you have the right feeling, but not the technical ability to realize all your ideas.

DEEDS OF FLESH "Trading Pieces" (Repulse)

Fuckin' Death, very fast and full of gore! Typical bestial U.S. stuff in the vein of old Cannibal Corpse, Suffocation, etc... with very powerful doublebass and snare attacks! Only the guitars could be louder!

Desecration "Gore and Perversion" (Arctic Serenades)

52 minutes of gory and perverse Death/ Grind with greetings from Cannibal Corpse. Heavy production!

MORTIIS "Crypt of the Wizzard" (Dark Dungeon Music)

Kingly hymns from forgotten ages | Dark music the way we always know it from **Mortiis**, only heroic atmospheres can be found here |

AVATAR "...Memorian Draconis" (Wood Nymph)

It's nice to see bands that at least try to make their music a bit more interesting. Avatar's Black Metal is good as they know to combine fast, slow, grim and sweet atmospherical parts without making it all sound like an unprofessional cocktail. Ok, it's still not perfect, but this MCD it's a good start for this Belgian band. Good, extremely high vocals... cool atmosphere! This release can be obtained through MERCILESS Records by German people.

Lunar Aurora "Weltengänger" (Voices)

Frank Stöver of VOICES FROM THE DARKSIDE zine now enters the world of labels with his first release of a German Black Metal band. But even if Frank prefers old Metal stuff instead of new sounds, this CD sounds 100%ly modern. It's fast, very symphonic nordic Black Metal which is played in a perfect and intense way, but it doesn't blow me away! It's the kind of Black Metal that I don't like too much as it has no real spirit. Sorry, but I expected something better (or should I say more original ?) from an old Metal warrior like Frank. However, Lunar Aurora are perfect for those who love pure intense 'n' modern Black Metal with no old traditional influences!

IMPALED NAZARENE "Latex Cult" (Osmose)

Thrashier than before are Impaled Nazarene on their latest LP/CD offering But of course they are still recognizable as they didn't get rid of their punkrock infected influences. Also, you hear that this band adores the chaotical side of Venom! "Latex Cult" is another step away from the band's old Blackened Metal style.

"Motörpenis" (Osmose)

This is a "Rip Off" release in my eyes, because this MaxiCD lasts for 8 minutes only... This sucks especially when you keep in mind that "Latex Cult" 's playing time is also just 30 minutes.

FUNEREAL MOON "Beware of the light of a Spectial Moon" (Guttural)

Wake me up when it's over! 43 minutes of abyssical ritual music with Black Metal parts here and then. All is very primitive and diletantish. Perhaps I'm not evil enough for this one?!?

DECEMBER WOLVES "Til Ten Years" (Hammerheart)

Interesting Black Metal from the U.S.A.! These guys know to bring some variety into their style which keeps | my interest awake. Cool effects and intros are also added, so don't expect ultraboring shit here. Powerful music is what they offer!

ARCKANUM "Fran Marder" (Necropolis)

Pagan stuff in the typical melodical (fast and slow) Black Metal disguise, with cool intros 'n' stuff. Vocals are both sung and screamed one. An average release!

IMPIETY "Asateerul Awaleem' (Shivadarshana)

Fuckin' hell, these barbaric desecrators of the church really know no boundaries when it comes to be blasphemous! Titles like "Anal Madonna", etc. are really over the top, ... and so is the music! But they've changed their style compared to their Tinch release, they've changed it into pure Black blasphemous Metal with both nordic (Emperor, vocals and guitarsound), and exotical (old Sarcofago when it comes to rhythms, speed, etc.) influences. It's sheer Metal to the bone, even if I was upset when I listened to it for the first time. Now it's you who decides whether you are strong enough to face the ruthless evilness of Impiety or not



"Zygotical Sabbatory Anadept" (Shivardashana)

There's also a change in Abhorer's style, but it's not as radical as it's the case at their landmates from Impiety Abhorer still play ultrafast 'n' hard Death Metal which is b upon dark terror, but they've lost a bit of their old simple songstructuring as the songs now are much more complex. Plus I hear that some new influences have been adopted in Abhorer's style, like Morbid Angel and other deadly bands like that. I'm convinced that every maniac into dark 'n' brutal Death Metal will love this album, because this is no wimpshit here but pure raging violence. Not destined fot those who long for melodies, sweetest keyboardsounds and female vocals Piss off!

RAISM "The very best of Pain" (Kron - H)

Ex-Diabolos Rising ! But Raism's electrified synth-stuff includes more guitarsounds in comparison. An interesting experience, a lot better than most of the other synth-bands of that direction, but it's of course no CD for true headbangers.

PIKE "Lack of Judgement" (Black Mark)

Why does a label like BLACK MARK sign mainstream shit(core) bands like Pike? Isn't the label's motto "Metal for the World"? If Pike is Metal, I will not call myself a Metalhead anymore! This is below the belt music à la Pantera/ Faith No More, etc., with horrible vocals! Down the toilet with it.



"Secret Sudaria"

(advance, to be released on N.E.P.)

It's still 100%ly Mortuary Drape-styled stuff, dark Death /Black Metal with an old touch. "Secret Sudaria" is better than "All The Witches Dance", it's more a "back to the roots" kind of album. When I look at songtitles like "Necromancy", etc. I suppose that some very old demosongs have been rerecorded here... and I think they sound very good. It's great to see Mortuary Drape still sticking to their original style! It all sounds very honest and original to me! I just wonder what kind of cover these! A Italian monks will take for this new album.... I'm surprised why "All The Witches Dance" hasn't been cencored yet....

RAMPAGE "The Burden of Melancholy Gravity" (self-financed)

Brutal Death Metal with Cannibal Corpselike vocals. The songwriting is ok, but don't expect any surprises. At least it all sounds dark and brutal, and is professionally done!

UNDER BLACK CLOUDS "As Darkness Falls" (Arsi Metalli)

Oh, what a nice CD. This second album really knowns to convince me as I detect a lot of traditional Metal riffs in their new songs. Under Black Clouds, a German band, fortunately got rid of their Swedish kind of riffs ... all is much more variable and powerful now, so don't ignore this promising band as they have real good music to offer. Support bands that try to make their music sound more interesting... and you certainly hear that Under One Clouds put a lot of work and time into their songwriting! Better check this one out before you get bored by another unoriginal Black/ Death Metal CD.

MARDUK "Glorification" (Osmose)

Do Marduk have financial problems? I don't understand the reason for this release. because this 5 -tracker just contains four (!) coverversions and a "remixed" (how interesting ?!) version of "Glorification of the The coverversion are. Destruction ("Total Desaster"), two old Piledriver songs (which were meant to be a parody on Black Metal back in '85) and the Bathory classic "The Return...". Especially this one shows where the difference lies between new and old Black Metal, because even if Marduk cover this song very well, the general atmosphere/ feeling is totally different compared to the original version which sounds way more evil! "Glorification" seems to be an attempt to make some extra money... and the next Marduk release is already announced... it should be a Live CD/LP ! To me, this smells like making some more quick bucks...

ВЕЦЕМОТЬ "Grom"

(Solistitium)

"Sventevith" has already been a good album, but "Grom" blows "Sventevith" away. Good songwriting and both Death/Thrash Metal influences made "Grom" a great album. Power is no unknown word when listening to the songs, all is done in an energetic but still variable way. The use of acoustic guitars again rules... it fits perfectly. Behemoth have managed to develop their own style! Go and get this album on Picture Disc!!!

TUMULUS / MOCK "Split CD" (Hammerheart)

52 minutes of pure paganism! German Tumulus do their job in a very slow atmospheric (metal) way with death grunts and female vocals, and Mock's contribution on this CD consists of three tracks from their "Cold Winter"-demo (a mixture of old Swedish Death Metal and Northern Black). Both bands know to convince with a touch of originality, even if they don't bring us anything brandnew.

DIMMU BORGIR "Stormblast" (Cacophonous)

It's the return of **Dimmu Borgir** with a new fine release. "Stormblast" is better and more original than "For all Tid", all is a bit better worked out and full of convincing melodies. You can certainly hear that this is a Norwegian band, but their atmospherical and melodical Black Metal hits your deepest soul. So don't get deceived by their grim and with spikes/bullets/nails overloaded photos, because they are not a grim and ruthless band. Check out the vinyl version, because the coverartwork is too fine just to be printed on CD/flyer- format. A convincing release indeed!

MEANWHILE "The Road to Hell" (We Bite)

We, the Metal fans, know that U.S.-hardcore is definitely the disease of the 90s and is constantly disturbing our ears, so it's always nice to know that there are still some hard Punkbands around like Meanwhile. They are as rough as The Exploited are nowadays, or old Accused, etc. "The Road to hell" includes songs that are hard, fast and quite short... simply "in your face"-like compositions, cool! Even if the new Hardcore movement has nearly killed Punk music (and it certainly hurt the Metal scene as well), Punk seems to be not dead at all with bands like Meanwhile.

CRACK UP "Blood is Life" (Corrosion)

A deep voice, deep guitars, ruthless doublebass attacks help to give this new German outfit a brutal sound of Death Metal. But melodies aren't missing, and especially this makes the band sound like old Crematory without keyboards. Fans of this style can buy this CD without any doubts.



After a couple of good demos it was natural to hear Sabaoth's music on CD format soon. But the band hasn't progressed in my opinion, because the album is not stronger than the (2nd) demo. Although this band hails from Paraguay, they have a Scandinavian kind of sound, only their calmer parts show the original side of the songwriting. Their speedy Black Metal parts sound below average, this must be the biggest disadvantage at this album. Sabaoth should better keep working on their own style instead of trying to sound like other bands.... I'm a bit disappointed!

Satanic Slaughter (Necropolis)

Already formed in 1985 (as they say), this U.S. band needed 10 years to release their debutCD. But there are not many old Metal sounds included on their debut if anybody has wondered.. It's thrash-infected Black Metal, fast, grim and without mercy. I have to say that I expected more from a band that is around since a decade, because it's just average stuff with some good riffs here and then what they have to offer. Quite unspectacular I must say, sorry!

DODHEIMSGARD "Monumental Possession" (Malicious)

This Norwegian band is known as a Black Metal band, and they're still playing this harsh stuff that we know from their debutLP "Kronet Til Konge", but Dodheimsgard have (like many others) started to adopt some old Thrash influences (here: Destruction) in their new songs. It's not bad, but most of the riffs are unoriginal, especially the Thrash stuff. Also I'm not too happy with parts of the vocals (which seem to be done by several people). On the other side I have to say that it's all well-played and that there are some real good parts existing as well. And this makes "Monumental Possession" an acceptable release.

Mercyful Fate

"Into The Unknown"
(Metal Blade)

Again a great album, even if this is possibly their "weakest" (if we can say so...) release so far. Songs like "The Uninvited Guest" or "Under The Spell" still kick asses... 1st class compositions! The Mercyful Fate reunion was surely one of the better reunions, and we should be thankful for that! So go out and get "Into The Unkown" if you like to listen to good old Metal!

POINT BLANK (self financed)

4 songs of brutal but groovy Death Metal with vocals à la **Sepultura**. Not my style at all | But anybody who's interested should send DM 13 to...Andreas Rabe, Westerdik 28, 26125 Oldenburg, Germany

EMPYRZHM

"A Wintersunset..."
(Advance from Prophecy)

In comparison to their successful demo this CD is much more overloaded with synths and tons of melodies which creep deep into your ears.... It's all used in such an intense way that it all sounds fuckin' kitschy, it's too much of all! But I can't deny that these two intellectual persons behind Empyrium made a good job when it comes to the recording and the whole arrangements... I know that there are a lot of guys/ pussies liking this CD! One thing I really regard as amateurish are the deep sung vocals, because they are weak attempt to copy gothic styled vocals like Sisters of Mercy, Fields of the Nephilim, etc.

EINHERJER "Aurora Borealis" (Necropolis)

A re-released of a demo on CD! It's Metal with heroic sounds, therefore you'll find parallels to epic Bathory and sometimes even Manowar, only the main vocals are different (= screamy). It's great music in my opinion, music (4 songs) that is worth the money.

IMPRECATION "Theurgia Goetia Summa" (Repulse)

Arrgghhh... a band that is really dark 'n' brutal, but also boring when you take their whole CD. Imprecation play dark Death/ Doom/ Grind with deep dark vocals, probably destined to reach the ears of die-hard fans only as this CD is extreme and hard to take! This album comes with an ultracoloured blasphemous Chris Moyen cover, so this band must be cult, right ?!?

COUNTESS

"The Return of the Horned One"
(Nazgul's Eyrie)

This CD isn't the newest one, but I got it as a promo, so here I am with a review. "The Return of..." is the most rude and aggressive Countess album so far, very primitive but total original Black Metal which is far away from any trendy sounds. They play this kind of "Love Us or Hate Us" music, but to me this is way much more "Black Metal" than most of the shit that gets released nowadays. I at least fuckin' like this art, even if it's recorded on a 4-tracker only...

Serenade / Corment (Arctic Serenades)

Serenade bore me to death with their strange kind of melodical and powerless Death Metal style. You need more than just a couple of good soli to make your music sound great. Torment's feature is better... it's more aggressive deadly stuff with good raging riffs, etc. Why hasn't this band released a MCD instead of sharing their release with another band? A splitCD with two sides of different quality!

PENTACROSTIC "De Profundis" (Hellion Brazil)

Brutal Death Metal isn't dead, especially not in Brazil (hail their old bands !!!), but Pentacrostic's kind of style isn't too overwhelming as it lacks of good riffs. Also, their sometimes abruptly and strange played breaks and the arrangements in general don't make this CD a new sensation. Well, it's not a shit-album, and potential is existing, but it's still not enough to be worth an investion!

SICKNESS "Verbrannte Erde" (Folter)

There are more Sickness-bands around, but this here is the German one. This former Grind-band now plays Death Metal with high and deep vocals and calmer parts. This CD hits my nerves at parts as their style is sometimes too confused and in adition I can't find too many real great riffs. Not my case....



MYTHOLOGICAL COLD TOWERS "Sphere of Nebaddon" (Sound Riot)

Darkest Death/Doom from Brazil, very well done with an intense atmosphere. Deep voice, heavy production, intelligent songwriting, etc. ... A perfect release for abyssic wintermoods, and a good alternative to nordic stuff.

HEAVENSHORE "Between Human and Divine" (Repulse)

There's one song included that is really great called "...While Your God Is Dying", it has the special touch of immortality! The other three tracks are just average and not very well-worked out, it's melodical atmospherical Metal with parallels to hymnic Greek Metal and epic Bathory. I hope that this Spanish men will come up with more than just one great song on their next release in order to be fully recommendable. Potential is existing!

NYCTOPHOBIC "War Criminal Views" (Morbid)

Fans of old Napalm Death and Carcass should check out this new band and their brutal Death/Grind (with distorted vocals).

AMESTISON /ANSIZIA

(Napalm)

"Where raw Black Metal meets fanastic folklore" are the words of NAPALM Records for this splitCD. Amestigon (with Ex-Abigor vocalist Rune) is not very raw but hymnic nordic-styled Black Metal with nice melodies (which seem to be typical for Austrian Black hordes). It's nothing very original, but as long as it doesn't start to bore me it's enjoyable. Angizia is a band that mixes Black Metal sounds with folklore elements and female vocals. The result is quite nice but kind of kitschy as well. The melodies slip easily into your damaged ears, so you won't have any problems with keeping the songs in mind. A good thing is the playing time (51 minutes = more than two new Gorgoroth LPs !!!), that's what I call fair ! Although this is a cool Austrian SplitCD, this isn't anything for people who are fed up with the typical Scandinavian sounds.



"Natural Survivor"
(Neat Metal)

Old stuff, re-released. This Yugoslavian band sounds like a softer version of old (not the new I) Scorpions, and I fuckin' like it. This album has sold over 1.000.000 copies in Yugoslavia when it was released years ago (1986?) if I have to believe the info... check this CD out if you like Hard / Heavy Rock music with good melodies.

CRYPTIC CARNAGE "And another Kingdom was born" (Folter)

With lack of power these Germans arrive on their debutCD. Slow, Death Metal inspired music with melodies and a lot of doublebass... I heard it too many times before, and their attempts to add some mystical elements with the use of sung voices, keyboards and acoustic guitars can't help to convince me! Perhaps I'm not the right person to judge this CD as I have never been fond of this kind of music, but real feeling is much more necessary to me than instrumental abilities... sorry!

MOCK "Vinterlandet" (Hammerheart)

"This MCD is the last recording thy cult Norse viking band (Mock) did" is a statement taken from the innersleeve of this product. But I think that the word "cult" is superfluous here, because this MCD isn't anything very special. Hymnic Norwegian Metal which is just ok, but nothing more. Not a necessary release!

FERMENTING INNARDS "Myst" (Invasion)

This here used to be a Death Metal band if I remember correctly... but I guess they are forced to play Black Metal now as it sells better, ... I don't know !?! Fast atmospheric but still melodical Black Metal with a lot of changes and clever arrangements that keeps the listener interested. But too many ordinary riffs don't make this by Dan Swano produced CD an unbeatable release.

FATA MORGANA

(Tower)

Mortiis here with his third project...and this is his best one in my opinion. Very naturally sounding calm harmonic music with flutes, piano, etc. with a kingly atmosphere. Great and absolutely recommendable! This is something that everyone (even your grandmother) can listen to!

CHRIST AGONY "Unholyunion" (Faithless)

It was a wise decision to release these old recordings on CD. Doomy Black Metal at its best, with influences from old Samael which is a sign for heaviness. But faster parts aren't missing as well, so variety is there. 4 songs are only included on this album, but they manage to last for 52 minutes (1)... not really a MCD, eh? "Unholyunion" is a must for everyone into serious unholy Black Death Metal.

ORPHANED LAND "El Norra Alila" (Holy)

Album number two from Israel's most successful band. Basically their music hasn't changed that much, perhaps it's softer now. Mystical Metal with a lot of harmonical riffs. But still I'm not too mad about this band as most of the other reviewing editors are... it's juts too "different" for my taste. I'm just no flexible guy!

SHUB - NIGGURATH "Evilness and Darkness Prevails" (Guttural)

Old stuff from '92/93, but still enjoyable. Dark Death Metal on a certain technical level. I think it's good stuff, because the feeling is right. It's just a touch too abruptly played and the sound of the percussions is strange. But I read that this unholy album was recorded in "Tequil(I)a" studio, so this might be the reason, haha. Get a taste of Mexican Death Metal with this band.

MYSTIFIER "The World is so good..." (Osmose)

Out now on OSMOSE Records is the third strike of Brazil's Mystifier. This one is not so easy to review, because the style now is a very strange mixture of typical rough Black Metal, some quite melodic parts and a tenor (!) voice. Sounds interesting, doesn't it ? Well, this is definitely an original and by no means boring album. On the other hand this one is no easy listening and the whole thing is pretty close at the edge of being ridiculous. Ask your parents, they might be right this time. So, don't buy the new Mystifier album blindly folks. Perhaps check out the last track first, for it is one of the best on most representatives titles of this very unusual output

MY GARDEN "Neon Lights" (Arctic Serenades)

According to the promotion sheet, My Garden from Istanbul is not a newcomer band. Actually, they were formed in 1990. In October 1995, they re-recorded their former demotape which is no released as a MCD.

My Garden are playing well produced Doom Metal with a mixture of male normal and death vocals along with some female vocals, which works out quite fine. Every no and then, the band's own ethnic roots become apparent, namely arabic folk music, but I would have put more of that into the songs. Perhaps next time?

Although nothing too special for now, we may expect something from My Garden in the near future.

KVIST "For Kunsten Maa Vi Evig Vike" (Avantgarde)

Yes, Kvist are from Norway, and also do sound Norwegian. It's in the vein of Satyricon ("The Shadowthrone", vocals) and Immortal, just with the difference that Kvist's music is more complex. Both hard and soft riffs can be found, and a lot of atmospheric sounds as well.

EXPIRATION "Deviated" (Self-Financed)

If you decide to release a gory Death Metal product, then the production should at least be powerful. But that's absolutely not the case here, and this makes this Mini MCD quite a boring one. Even the extremely gory cover can't help making this release a more interesting one. Five very boring powerless songs!

WORLD OF SILENCE "Window of Heaven" (Black Mark)

Silent stuff indeed, with parts à la new Metallica, dreamy Tiamat combined with almost hardcore-like rhythms. It's all quite far away from being real Metal... it's more the kind of stuff which people into modern commercial Metal Rock (if this is the right term ...) will probably enjoy.



Good CD! This is the kind of Death Metal I like... intense, brutal and with dark obscure atmospheres. It's nothing new though, but it's done in a satisfying way. Also, enough doublebass doses have been recorded on this CD to make your house sound like being crushed by a giant bulldozer. It's great to know that there are still some bands around that know to convince with destructive music.

28izard "Advance for CD"

I've no titles, no info, etc. about this release, just the tape! All I can say is that I like Wizard as they play old-school Metal in the vein of Exorcist, Onslaught, Piledriver and The Exploited ("The Massacre" LP, when it comes to the riffs' simplicity). Also, Wizard have good original dark vocals, which is a cool thing for me after hearing 1000 high screaming throats. All sounds quite honest and not so "let's sound 80s"-like, that's an important thing for me! I think you'll find an interview with Wizard in TALES OF THE MACABRE #5!

GRIMOIRE "A Requiem for the Light" (Euphonious)

In #3 I reviewed this band's demo and thought that some more work is necessary in order to release a real CD. Well, they couldn't wait anymore, and here's their debutCD. Although the band has improved, this album is not more than average. They play melodical, keyboard-infected Black Metal with faster drumparts occasionally. It's all too average as said before... you get tired of it. Some riffs are good, other parts totally suck in contrary. This band has still to find their own identity.

MORTEM "Demon Tales" (Merciless)

Take Possessed's "Seven Churches" and a touch of Deicide's hectical playing.... then you have the sound that Mortem smashes into your face | Old-school Death Metal played on a certain technical level, and in addition you can hear great deathly vocals the way they usually should sound. For more info read the interview elsewhere....

FROZEN SUN "Unspoken" (DSFA)

To make it short... This is music for baseballcap-people who like the jump around like idiots. Groovy stuff that pisses me off!!!



MANIAC BUTCHER "Lucan - Antkrist" (Pussy God)

These Czech Barbarians really work fast... here's already their follow-up for their "Barbarians"-CD. It's again fast furious Black Metal the Northern way, but done with quite some power and strong vocals. Musically it's nothing new, of course. To my surprise I found a good coverversion of an old Master's Hammer classic... and it's good to see Maniac Butcher showing respect for their landmates' great work which they've done for true Black Metal history.

MANOS "Weihnachtsfieber"

I expected the worst, and I got the worst, Christmas songs for Metal (?) fans... and a couple of other tunes. My interpretation of fun is a different one, sorry!

BORKNAGAR (Malicious)

Norse attack in a form of very fast, furious but still epical Norwegian Metal style. It's done in a very bombastic and professional way, and people into the pure Norse style will like this LP. I think that they have the strongest moments when they slow down the speed, as the fast parts are just average.

93DCA Dib.187"Towards Judgement" (Necropolis)

What an irretating bandname, but it's just one of the few new Black Metal hordes that got spat out of the abyss of Sweden. Those guys don't have the typical look of a Black Metal band (no corpsepaint, etc.), but they have the typical Black Metal sound. 4 songs of standard stuff.... nothing important!

SORT VOKTER "Folkloric Necro Metal" (Norse League)

NORSE LEAGUE seemed to have specialized on Norse bands with an extremely primitive sound... Sort Vokter play nothing but ultra-primitive, grim "Necro" Metal (huhu 1), with boring computerdrums and shitty guitardistortion. But musically it's acceptable, nordic Black Metal with keyboards and monotonous drums. However, there are a lot of better releases to pick up...

Beherit "Electric Doom Synthesis" (Spinefarm)

I would prefer some more metallic songmaterial instead of this synthetic computersound from Holocausto. Anyway, error if it's not Metal, this is a CD with dark ritual music in the typical simple Beherit style just with the difference that it's a totally different musical direction. This is certainly one of the stronger synth-CDs !

VOICE OF DESTRUCTION "Bloedriever" (Morbid)

Oh, I'm not used such kind of Metal from MORBID Records. Modern Heavy Metal with cool guitarriffs and melodies, and it all sounds good except for the vocals (which are a mixture of Punk and Death Metal). The thing I like most at this South Afrian band is the healthy does of energy in their music!

SACRILEGIUM "Wicher" (Pagan)

"Wicher" sounds like Graveland with a lot more melodies and hymnic parts if you ask me. Sacrilegium will probably kill me for this comparison, but let's face the truth: A lot of Polish bands have this kind of sound when it comes to Black/Pagan Metal. Luckily I can say that Sacrilegium are not a horde of stupid slavs who worship Hitler, ...they just seem to love their country and their pagan roots. Therefore all the lyrics are sung in Polish language, and the music got a bit calmer and more melodical with some folklore (?) -like touches in comparison to their great and successful "Sleeptime" demo (which is now re-released on CD. Black Metallers: Get it !!!). It's a cool CD, but I have to admit that it gets a bit monotonous in the long run. Also I'm a bit sad that the band lost a bit of their malice which they surely had on their furious demo, but time changes and so does music in most cases

AMON SOCTH "Call The Master" (N.E.P.)

An old demo (from '92) re-released on CD format. Those of you who have read reviews about "Call The Master" in several other mags probably think that this band sounds like garbage, but this is not true. But I know that Amon Goeth is not a band like any other, and this is why the opinions are so different about this CD! It's a mixture of (old) Black/Death Metal with growled but still sung vocals which sound quite original, but are definitely not everyone's cup of tea and are probably the main reason for all the bad critics. But I like the voice anyway, especially the incredibly deep backing vocals of Root's Big Boss, sounds unbelievable ! Musically it's stuff who have to get used to, but it's very variable stuff. The only weak point is the coverversion of Celtic Frost's "Into the Crypts of Rays", because it lacks of the original energy.



A MCD that rips your head off! With the exception of the titletrack, Desaster are thrashier than ever. But it's no clone / copy thing here like it is the case at Infernö or other Scandinavian shitbands. Just listen to "The Swords Will Never Sink" and the short but deadly "Sacrilege"... total Black thrashing Metal mayhem, very raging stuff! These two songs do capture an old spirit, but are still sounding individual, and are indeed the best tunes that I heard from a German band for ages. Also the vocals have improved since the debut album, and can be seen as original. Desaster seem to be one of the only German bands (beside Ungod) who follow the tradition of the old German Thrash scene that is hailed by so many foreign maniacs. Those who only talk about the German past should better get their hands on this release and hear that real German Metal quality is still existing. "Stormbringer" is also released on PicDisc (limited to 500), and has one of the best covers I've seen during the last couple of months.

LUX OCCULTA "Forever Alone. Immortal" (Pagan)

This metallic music is simple, melodial, very atmospheric (=keyboards), dark, etc. It's probably nothing really exciting, but it has a touch of an original sound.

MELEK - THA "Astrun Argentinum" (Adipocere)

Non-metallic stuff, based on pure atmospheric sounds. A nice experience as it causes different feelings... sounds like a filmsoundtrack. Weird!



"The Cainian" (Metal Blade)

A lot of people were surprised to hear that Norwegian band Ancient signed at METAL BLADE, because the band used to play good but not original Black Metal on their old releases. Well, and this hasn't changed, just listen to this new album which just presents the ordinary Northern Black Metal thing which certainly loses its magic in these days as too many bands sound alike and have no own face. "The Cainain" is well-produced, well-played, etc., but it simply bores me too much. Two/three years ago this would have been a great release, but now amongst countless competitors this is just an average album.

ANGEL CORPSE "Hammer of Gods" (Osmose)

Fast raging Death/Thrash Metal with sick guitarsoli and dark morbid (angel) riffing. I like it when these guys slow down their tempo, because this are the most powerful moments! The album is a bit softer compared to the demo, but that's probably just because of the cleaner album sound. The music itself is absolutely untrendy and indeed a hammer in your face in case you like aggressive stuff the American way.

LIMBONIC ART "Morn in the Scorpio" (Nocturnal Art)

Extreme Norse Black Metal with atmospheric keyboardsounds... a mixture which sounds good. Of course it's no brandnew thing, but the feeling is right and its all well-done. This kind of Black Metal sounds quite modern and is doesn't show those typical **Bathory** roots which all the older Norwegian bands had. This is the only disadvantage for me to be honest.

EINHERJER "Dragons of the North" (Napalm)

What is this? I thought that this band ceased to exist, but I was wrong. Here's their first album... and I'm quite disappointed when I compare with their good demo. They've changed their style into a more folklorical one, and especially some of the new drumrhythms make me sceptical... they sound too unheavy for me. The music itself is not typically arranged and played for Metal standards, and this is the reason why I'm not fond of this CD.

HELHEIM "Jordmundsgand" (Solistitium)

Is anything wrong with my ears? The vocals of **Helheim** are really extreme, very high and insanely screamed.... I really don't know if this sounds cool or silly. Musically it's typical Norwegian Black Metal, both slow and fuckin' fast, but played in the way we have heard it from countless bands before.

MORDOR "Prayer to..." (Effigy)

The Polish answer to old (but not too old)

Tiamat! But it's original in its very own way
though, there are a lot of good ideas
combined in an intelligent way. The positive
thing is that you don't get tired while listening
to this CD, and this is something that has
become quite seldome for me! Good
harmonies and a clever use of keyboards
make "Prayer to..." the best EFFIGY release!

AURA "Shattered Dawnbreak" (Hammerheart)

Sounds as if Aura are Swedish, but those guys are from Holland. They play melodical, Swedish styled Metal... 4 songs!

MOURNINGSTAR "Herectic Metal" (Moonlight)

Mourningstar are the kind of band who have potential to be a very strong force in the world of real Metal, because you'll find some great riffs and several good parts in their songs. The only problem is that it's not all perfect and well-arranged yet... there are too many influences (like Nordic Metal, Heavy Metal, even Rock'n'Roll, etc.) combined. and we all know that not only creating good riffs but also arranging them to a good song is a kind of art. "Heretic Metal" is a cool powerful album, and it's still better than most of the crap that gets released, but I hope that the band will be able to offer something really strong next time... it only depends on how hard the band is willing to work on their new material.



Black Metal extremists listen up... The French Black Legions still march! And their bands still play ruthless grim Black Metal which is awfully produced and very wickedly played. Torgeist sound like an underground-version of bands like Graveland, Belketre, etc... but all with a high distorted rehearsal sound, it almost hurt my ears!

Vlap Tepes' part is not much better when it comes to the sound, but musically they are stronger than their mates from Torgeist. Vlad Tepes have good melodies/ ancient riffs to offer, and it all sounds quite honest to me. To summon it all up: This CD is made for Die-Hard Black Metal maniacs only. Decide for yourself, but be warned: This is not a "usual" Black Metal album!

TORQUE (Mascot)

Hardcore Metal the modern way, with influences from Napalm (R.I.P.) and Biohazard (hopefully R.I.P. soon!) and such kind of crap. Do I need say more?

Paragon Belial "Hordes of the Darklands" (Folter)

Black Metal... raw, grim, unoriginal! Their biggest influence must be **Darkthrone** ("Transilvanian Hunger"), but they can't reach this level. People into primitive harsh music should try this German band. Good dark intros, weak vocals (sung by Ex-**Bethlehem** vocalist)... ordinary music!

DEVISER "Unspeakable Cults" (Mascot)

It took long time until this old Greek band managed to record their first CD. Well, I know Deviser's Tinch, and in comparison to this CD I can say that the band lost their thrashy spirit and added Black Metal kind of arrangements / riffs instead. But the riffs are still good (most Greek bands understand to create good guitarriffs by the way), and so are the songs. Only the fast parts don't blow me away and make Deviser sound average, but for the rest it's good stuff!

DECORYAH "Fall- Dark Waters " (Metal Blade)

People who liked **Decoryah**'s debut CD will like this new CD as well. Atsmopheric (Metal?) music with sung vocals, well played and well-arranged.

DAMNATION "Reborn" (Pagan)

This crossfire of dark satanic Death Metal comes from Poland, so don't mix this band with the Swedish Damnation. "Reborn" is american styled Death Metal in the style of Morbid Angel and Deicide when it comes to the arrangements, but it's all a bit more technical and not so straight ahead here. This is what irretates me at Damnation, but generally seen I can say that they made a good job, and I guess that die-hard Death Metalheads will be satsified. But next time the band should try to have a more powerful production, 'cause this kind of music simply demands it!

"Rebel Souls" (Last Epitaph)

Here it finally is, the follow up to "Reborn". It's still Death Metal, but not as dark and technical as before... I think it's mainly because the guitardistortion/-sound has changed. But... don't worry, it's good stuff, professionally played and performed with a certain know-how. Also, the production is better now. So, "Rebel Souls" is a step forward for Damnation... let's wait and hear what the third CD will bring...

DJABOL3 "Mesmerized by Darkness" (Unisound)

Diaboli is the new name for Sigillum Diaboli, some of you probably remember this band as they were part of TALES ... #2. However, here's the first CD attack, and I'm sad to say that I'm disappointed! All I can say is that the second demo is much better than this album, even if those three demosongs can be found on this CD as well. This step backward is caused by a too distorted guitarsound, too monotonous songmaterial, etc... It all sounds too nordic ! But I don't want to damn this album as it isn't shit, ... I'm just disappointed, because I know that this band is able to be much better. Style Fast, grim Black Metal, played in an extreme way!

A second album is already recorded, so I hope that that one will be stronger! If diehard Black Metallers like to order "Mesmerized by Darkness", then send \$20 to...: Diaboli, Box 54, 33961 Pirkkala, Finland.

DARK "Endless Dreams" (self- financed)

Germany seems to be the domain for atmospherical Death Metal like old Crematory played it, with clear sound and harmonic keyboard effects. Dark (not to be compared with the Czech band) try to take lovers of this music by storm with their one hour strong debut CD... and their music really doesn't need to hide. They did a good job indeed, only the voice is could be a bit better, but that's my opinion. It's good to see such kind of bands existing who try to convince with honest music instead of false images 'n' cheap talk. This CD is absolutely recommendable for lovers of this kind of powerful but still atmospheric Death Metal. This CD costs \$20: Mathias Fickert, Buchenstr.5, 17707 Schopp, Germany



"Hosanna Bizzare"
(Osmose)

This new German band seems to be heavily influenced by old Impaled Nazarene stuff, like simple Metal/Punk riffs, straight ahead music. I don't know why OSMOSE have signed this band for they are nothing very exciting, they just do an ordinary job on their debut.

THE FLESH "Storming the Heaven's Gates" (Arctic Serenades)

Due to a weak sound this brutal dark Death Metal 4-tracker is just average sounding, but it's very pure in its style!

Judgement day "Sir-Sum-Sis-Jon of the War - Tyr" (Effigy)

Judgement Day have a better production in contrary to The Flesh, but the music is weaker. Their Death Metal is fast and well-played, but their too melodical riffs make their music sound "unheavy". Not my case at all for it's just boring!

ALGOL "Entering the Woods of Enchantment" (Effigy)

A Norwegian band with a (for Norwegians) untypical style of music. Their style is Death Metal the technical way, which has a certain balance between brutal and melodical riffs. The band is not easy to categorize... all I can say that I got a bit sleepy after a while, but that's probably because I've listened to too much stuff for this fourth issue...

Poccolus

(Hammerheart)

This debut CD would be cool if the vocals weren't that horrible! This screaming sounds like Grishnackh meets Franta Storm, very strange, and not my case at all. But the music is ok, simple stuff with a lot of melodies. The biggest inspiration must be Burzum, but Poccolus are not as dark and grim as Grishnackh's creations. Mid tempo Pagan / Black (?) Metal.

Argentum

Ad Interitum Funebrarum" (Full Moon)

Beside Tacos and Tequila there's also a cool dark Metal band hailing from Mexico. Argentum play abyssic Black/ Death Metal with obscure vocals, dark keyboards, cryptic sounds.... Just the production on their debut CDcould be more powerful, especially when it comes to the guitars. Great is the length of this CD.... 76 minutes (= 3x Gorgoroth's "Antichrist" LP for the price of one!).



'Sursum Luna" (Avantgarde)

Good news from Italy | Funeral Oration proove that the Italian scene is better than most people think! This band shows that Black/Death doesn't have to sound boring and monotonous. "Sursum Luna" has different faces, and all is very well-done. It's energetic, aggressive on one side, on the other side it's also filled with melancholical sounds and atmospheres. You can hear that this is an older band (formed in 1989), especially when you listen to some of the older tracks that have been recorded for this CD ('89 - '95)... this kind of variety makes this album so interesting! The old songs have a touch of old Incubus, very cool! I received this fine album as a digipack CD, and I must say that the artwork and the generell layout is

ISVIND "Dark Waters Stir" (Solistitium)

Norwegian Black Metal... fast, hard, but also average. No progression since their demo!

AZAG -THOTH "Reign Supreme" (Witchhunt)

Originally known as Pazuzu, this Swiss outfit returns with a debut CD. But they've changed their Hellhammer-like style into a more Nordic Black Metal-like one. But it's still hard 'n' fast stuff which is done in an aggressive way. The vocals are untypical for this kind of music, there's a strange effect used here. Musically it's all just ok, at least they know how to rage hard!

ORPHANAGE "By Time alone" (DSFA)

Uuhh... I don't like this one for the groovy slow rhythms! Although it's seriously made, it's more the kind of music for people who like to jump at concerts...

DEMONIC "Lead Us Into Darkness" (Necropolis)

The strength of Demonic lies in the slower parts which spread a lot of power. It's of course all played in the Norwegian Black Metal style, but luckily I can say that Demonic are one of the stronger bands up from the North. 4 songs are included, all recorded between '94 and '95.

OBCENITY "The 3rd Chapter" (Morbid)

Still hungry for brutal Death Metal? Your faves are Immolation, Cannibal Corpse, etc.? Then check out Obscenity. The only difference is that this band also has some slower parts (with female vocals) which bring some variety into the music.

PAKENI "Detergent Bubble Bath" (Morbid)

Let it groove with Pakeni from Finland. Warning: Not for real headbangers!!!



BENIGHTED LEAMS
"Calignas Romantic Myth"
(Supernal Music)

An original style isn't always a great one... This new English band plays a very original style of Black Metal that can be seen as quite complex and unusual... the vocals are both sung and growled, but very different, and so are the unusual drumrhythms, etc. This music will definitely find a few ears only, it's certainly not music for the masses. If anybody is open for music that is experimental and beyond the limits, then Benighted Leams may be your new cult band. For me it's too different, but it's good to see some musicians daring to try something new.

GORGOROTH "Antichrist" (Malicious)

This one is hard to review... on one side, there are some good 'n' powerful songs included (like "Possessed by Satan"), but on the other side some songs are typical Norse ones which we've heard already before in its rough structure. This is probably one of the better pure Norwegian Black Metal releases as Gorgoroth still know to play hard and with the right feeling (even if the band's live performance sucked with their new "vocalist"), but it's definitely not ok that 24 minutes playing time get sold for a full length album... You decide whether you buy this one or not, but if you do... buy it on PicDise!

COUNTESS

"The Book of the Heretic" (N.E.P.)

Nobody seems to stop Countess' way! This is already the fourth album... and it's still typical Countess-styled, even if the band has progressed. 70 minutes (!!!) of music are damned on this CD, 70 minutes of original and very simple Black Metal. The songmaterial is ok, some of the riffs repeat too often at parts. But the production isn't the best unfortunately, because the guitars are too much in the background which means a lost of power. Cool is the coverartwork of the CD, I'm sure this is a sign for the band's admiration for Venom. I'm curious what the fifth Countess CD will bring. ... I hope at least a real drummer!

WARDOG "Scorched Earth" (Metal Blade)

Just imagine Hallows Eve with a 90s sound plus some newer Overkill influences, and mix this with groovy elements and a positive "C'mon let's party"-atmosphere...well, ready is the Wardog cocktail | Ha, I guess most of you don't know what I mean with this description, right ? Doesn't matter, because I'm sure that most of you won't like this release anyway. But I have to say that Wardog's music is better than any kind of "Metal" band with bloody Hardcore influences (spit!). If your local CD-store (the word "record store" belongs to the past unfortunately!), has this CD, well, try at least to listen to it, perhaps I'm wrong with my review?

DISMAL EUPHONY (Napalm)

Norse hardware mixed with lovely female vocals, a grim Black Metal voice and abyssic atmospheres. A strange but interesting combination of sounds: This MCD should be a rough taste for the upcoming full-length CD. Musically it fits to the current Norse kind of playing, you'll find melodical, atmospheric riffs, so don't expect anything barndnew here. It's just the mixture of styles which makes this new Norwegian band (at least a bit) interesting. A good release for a start, let's see if those boys and girls are able to improve. Nice coverartwork!

CRYPTOPSY "None So Vile" (Wrong Again)

Do you want it very hectically played? And very intense? Well, this is what Cryptopsy is all about... melodical sounds are crossed with old Napalm Death (!)- vocals and Cannibal Corpse-like arrangements. It all sounds like a fuckin' violent inferno! Cool untrendy stuff which is definitely difficult to play, but this is only for people with nerves of steel... otherwise you won't survive this deadly storm of violence!

DISMAL EUPHONY ."Sorta Moria Slott" (Napalm)

It's in the same style as on their MCD (review see elsewhere)...Nodric blackened stuff with a lot of keyboards, screamed and sung (female) vocals. It's "easy listening" kind of music, sweet melodies that directly go deep into your ears. There's nothing much to add except for the thing that real clear guitarriffs are hard to find on this one.

DEMILICH "Nespithe" (Repulse)

Finland still produces a lot of Death Metal bands, but not every band is a gain!

Demilich know to play, but their deadly music does not kill... it doesn't affect me at all for it's filled with too many uninteresting riffs and arrangements. Next time, guys!

POLLUTED INHERITANCE "Betrayed" (DSFA)

Death Metal the more technical way, especially the drumwork is astonishing, ... some of you drumming maniacs will find it interesting listening to it if you like precise playing!

Sholhber 9 "Tagernes Artusinde" (Euphonious)

I hate it when a complete booklet is written in a foreign language like it is the case here. It's technical Death Metal with good dark vocals, but musically it's nothing really great... It's all played in a hectical way.... and is therefore nothing I appreciate!

GODKILLER "The Rebirth of the Middle Age" (Wounded Love)

Black Metal in the Norwegian vein, but with medieval touches. Those of you who know the band's demo ("The Warlord") know what to expect. The vocals haven't changed that much as well, they're still very **Burzum**-like. A 5 song MCD of old news !

BARATHRUM "Infernal" (advance, N.E.P.)

The title say it all... "Infernal"! Yeah, this third opus of Barathrum is the most wicked and best one so far. Their doomy style of JetBlack Metal with deadly bassdoses is very original, it's something very unique! This album is beyond the trends, just listen to the tracks like "War Metal", "Ethereal Guest", etc...... hymns of the final armageddon! It's still extreme music, so wimps should stay away... you won't survive the (almost) 70 minutes of playing time! A thing I really like is the clear 'pronunciation of Demonos' vocals... they are extreme but quite easy to understand. Give "Infernal" a chance if you are bored by most of the other Black Metal stuff that gets released!



"Alone Walkying" (Wounded Love)

A re-release of a demo on MCD format. Read the review in TALES OF THE MACABRE #1. A short description: Epic and bombastic Metal in the vein of Bathory ("Hammerheart"/ "Blood Fire Death").

SCABBARD "Beginning of Extruction" (Deathvastation)

Two of the musicians are wearing Slayer shirts on the backcover, so I thought this band must be great. Well, all I got is unspectacular, abruptically played Death Metal with deep vocals. The only thing I can't deny is that those guys know to play their instruments quite well.

FLOWING TEARS & WITHERED FLOWERS

"Swansongs"
(Seven Art)

Something for your heart, with influences from My Dying Bride and Dead Can Dance, but it's not very professionally done (changing of riffs, vocal-rhythm, etc.), and it gets quite boring after some songs. It was too early for a CD.

APOPHIS "Down in the Valley" (Contraption)

Death Metal with strange drumrhythms at parts. All is professionally played, but the music is nothing really special though.

Might in Wales

A German band, but they play a melodical kind of Metal à la In Flames, etc... it all sounds 100%ly Swedish-styled. I admit that those guys can play, but this music has no real power to offer!

FORSTH (M.O.S.)

Grim nordic Black Metal with a messy but raw production which helps the band having a special atmosphere, even if the guitar-/drumwork is average. Forsth's music is best when they slow down their speed and use these obscure dark keyboards (à la Eminenz). This band spits on sweet melodies.. this is more the dark kind of Black Metal.

SANGUIS ET CINIS (M.O.S.)

Slow and very atmospherical Dark Wave stuff, with German lyrics. It all sounds very natural, so you won't suffocate in synthetic computer-sounds... even acoustic guitars can be heard!

HEFEYSTOS (Last Epitaph)

Melodical stuff... the info says "atmospheric majestic Metal, sublime, light and charming music", well, this might be right. Female vocals, flutes, organ-sounds, etc... are the elements of this CD, the guitars are more in the background. A tarned but nice album.

THE ROCKING DILDOS "On Speed" (Kron H)

"On Speed" sounds like (first) Gehennah meets newer Impaled Nazarene stuff, but mixed with a strong touch of old Hardcore. The vocals are Black Metal like. This band is supposed to be a Fun-band, right ?!?

CASKET "Emotions..." (Serenades)

There's a demo of a band called Casket reviewed elsewhere in this mag, but I'm sure that this is not the same band that released this CD here. "Emotions..." represents melodical Gothic Metal with female voices, harmonic guitars, slow rhythms, etc... not really music for wild headbangers, but for those who like this style of music.

WELTENBRAND (M.O.S.)

Romantic Dark wave! This is very atmopheric stuff which seems to be praising the dark. Sometimes it all sounds like a movie-soundtrack.



"Resurreciórem Morturáum" (Skyfall)

Black Metal, once a cult, loses power and a big part of its spirit with every new average album that gets released with every new sunrise. So I was surprised when I listened to the third Decayed album, because this band understands how Black Metal should sound... dark, harsh and with a lot of power. Influences such as Bathory, even Blasphemy, old Thrash, etc... can be found here... You can obtain this CD by sending \$20 to the, band's address (see elsewhere).

PERETUAL DEMISE "Arctic" (DSFA)

Quite untypical coverartwork for a melodical (Death) Metal release I must say, but I'm always open for surprises. One of the main influences must be VoiVod, but this CD has nothing to do with old-school Metal. It's enjoyable but unspectacular stuff!

Ancient Tites "Diabolical Serenades"

For all those who missed to buy Ancient Rites debut CD have the chance to do it now, and you'll even find a bonus track on it!
Musically it's simple but powerful Black/Death Metal which is mainly played in a fast way. For those who like it loud and heavy!

VADER "The Darkest Age" (Arctic Serenades)

This is probably the first Death Metal 'Live' album ... 12 songs of supreme deathly aggression, recorded anno '93. The sound quality is good but not excellent. However, Vader fans have to buy this CD, there's no escape! And this album prooves that Vader is a strong 'live force', hell yes!

"De Profundis"

Awesome album, pure aggressive Death Metal with parallels to Morbid Angel and Slayer. It's a shame that the label doesn't promote this album too well...

天祖為我為亞祖爾我知 "Immemorial Atlantic Veneration" (Repulse)

Speedy, raw, bad-produced Black Metal from Spain. It's a cheap **Dark Throne** copy without the necessary energy and convincing riffs. 21 minutes of boring music.

MAJESTU

(Teutonic Extsitence)

Very original melodical and melancholical Doom Metal with cool sung vocals which are almost beyond description (a rough imaination are the sung vocals of early Root tunes). 3 songs of supreme Doom cult!!!

MOLESTED "Stormvold" (Repulse)

It's still extreme what Molested from Norway have to offer on this new 5 song MCD. Furious Death Metal with dark vocals and a complex way of playing, in the same vein as their full-length CD.

SUMMONING "Dol Guldur" (Napalm)

Typical Summoning stuff again! They continue where "Minas Morgul" ended, and it's again a good album. The only shit is that too many bands nowadays started to play atmospherical Black Metal stuff, so a bit of the old "magic" of this music is gone. This is of course not Summoning's fault, because they were one of the first bands to play this kind of style. Those who liked their old CDs as well will not be disappointed by this new

GOLDEN DAWN "The Art of Dreaming" (Dark Matter)

Very professional Black Metal art, especially for a debut CD. It sounds like old Summoning stuff with a touch of an own identity. The songwriting is variable, so you won't fall asleep while you descend through the nine songs. A good album for a start, with good riffs and atmospheres.

NAZXUL "Totem" (Vampire)

Extremists of Black Metal listen up... Nazxul have arrived with their debutCD to satisfy your needs. Extremely fast 'n' ruthless Black Metal with a demonic atmosphere is what they've created. But wait, this is no copy of Norse bands here! This band ccmes from Australia and have this extreme Australian Black/ Death sound (remember Destroyer 666, Armoured Angel, etc.). "Totem" is much better than their demo (reviewed in #3), so we can speak of a good surprise here.

Adorned Brood "Hilltia"

(Folter)

'Teutonic War Metal" is the style here, as the band says. Well, to give you a better imagination I would say they play tarned Black Metal with folklore parts, with influences from bands like Cruachan, etc. as flutes, acoustic guitars, etc. can be heard in Adorned Brood's music as well. "Hilita" is an acceptable album for a start and is FOLTER's best release so far.



NECROMANTIA "Ancient Pride" (Osmose)

A good MCD / MLP by Necromantia! I like their slow parts a lot, because they are the strength and the most original side of this old Greek band. One of those 4 songs is a coverversion of Manowar's "Each Dawn I Die" (cool I), ... strange that the band didn't mention it on the promo... perhaps the fans have to find it out for themselves ?!!? The MLP version comes with one bonus-song... so go out and buy Vinyl (like always said I).

MYSTIC CIRCLE "Der Schrei nach Morgenröte" (Last Epitaph)

One more Vampire Black Metal band! Musically they have not much to offer except for the standard Black/Death Metal stuff with the typical nordic atmosphere and some melodical riffs. The first five songs for example start with the same drumrhythms, and this is one of the signs for the band's limited songwriting-ability. The intros/keyboardsounds can't help making this album much better. Some good parts can be heard, but most of the stuff is just boring and pathetic.

DECEMBER'S FIRE "Vae Victis" (Last Epitaph)

This Polish band plays music that can be seen as a dark movie-soundtrack... quite hymnic, dark and dramatic stuff! This is not music to sing along with!

MPSTICUM

"In the Streams of Inferno" (Full Moon)

You'll hear Industrial Black Metal in the purest Norwegian form when listening to this weird product. On one side it's interesting cruel music, but on the other side I'm pissed off by all those synthetic industrialized drumsounds 'n' rhythms. I would describe this band as "Emperor with an unnatural sound". Strange but original in its own way.

NINE WORLDS "Beth Zaida" (Adipocere)

Melodical stuff, infected by ordinary Black Metal sounds and doomy/ gloomy music... even VolVod/ Black Sabbath-influences can be heard on this very complex album.



HOLOCAUST "Spirit's Fly"

These old veterans of British Heavy Metal return with a new album, but all isn't of course as old-sounding as the bands' old albums. It's Heavy Metal/ Hard Rock with progressive (not chaotic!) touches.

INFERNÖ "Utter Hell" (Osmose)

Who do these Norwegians think they are ? Nobody needs a side-project of members from Ved Buens Ende, etc. etc. etc.. which just rips off old (but not forgotten !) bands' riffs. After the obligatory intro, the LP starts with the song "Intro from Hell"... this song starts with exactly the same riff as Hirax's "Bombs of Death", unbelievable! Another good example for Infernö being just a coverband is the song "Infernal Invasion" which is almost the same like Destruction's legendary "Bestial Invasion". "Torment Her" sounds like Kreator's "Tormentor", and so on and so on... the list could be endless ! Infernö are nothing but true POSERS in my eyes, so a big "Fuck Off" to them for just being a band that makes some extra money with the help of old bands' riffs... it's a shame that a band like Infernö gets hailed by some young people while some of the original old bands (like Hirax) never received full attention and are unknown to most of the younger headbangers. "Utter Hell" is probably the ultimate proof for our scene being nothing but a commercial trendy thing without any moral. Infernö are a disgrace for all people who are seriously into old Metal!

NOX MORTIS "Same" (Prophecy)

Melodical Metal with growled vocals. It sounds like a much more complex version of Crematory, but not with the same energy. Some parts are good, others suck. The band should try to compose real songs instead of assembling several riffs that do not fit too well in a row... technical know-how is existing, but no ability to write good songs.

Malignant Eternal "Farnet" (Self-financed)

Yes, another Norwegian band, but a band without corpsepaint and all the typical grim posing! It's more atmospherical Norse Metal with melodies and hymine sounds, even if it's fast at parts. The vocals are of course very high, but a touch of originality is hidden in this band's music

ATMAN "Like Pure Unawaited Magic" (New Goetia/ Requiem/ Repulse)

Black Metal, played very fast and intense, but with atmospheric touches. An album with music the straight and easy way!

ABJOOR Opus IV" (Napalm)

The fourth Abigor CD, ... and it's still in the typical Nordic Black Metal style which we are all used to hear from this band. This CD is devided into two recording sessions, it's a kind of Abigor "split CD". I've nothing to criticize at this release except for the fact that this band releases too much stuff in just a short time, so the possibility exists that people will start to lose interest in Abigor.

WRAITH "Riot" (Neat Metal)

Old Heavy Rock with a touch of Glam (like Twisted Sister, Ozzy, etc.), and grunge.

There were so many Swedish albums released that they deserve some "Extra-Only For Swedish Metal -Pages" in this issue, especially as most of the stuff sounds alike...

VARGAVINTER "Frostfödd" (Invasion)

Metal made in Sweden... fast but very melodical Black Metal with no dark spirit at all. You can't play dark music when playing tons of melodies ! Tastes are different of course

BLACKMAIL "A Female Impersonator" (Ransom)

70s sounds (Black Sabbath) meet newer (Faith No More, Danzig, I don't fuckin' know what) shit-sounds. Real Metal lovers won't buy this 4 track MCD.

EMBRACING "I hear the Burden of Time" (Invasion)

Fast and melodical Black Metal in the vein of Dissection, In Flames, etc. The vocals are really hitting my nerves the rest is "ok" in its style!

THE MOBILE MOB FREAKSHOW The Raving Dead EP (Static Age)

It seems as if fans of different music scenes have united to create a very own sound, a sort of cool 'n' ugly Rock 'n' Roll -Goth with a touch of Punk. Original indeed! This hasn't much to do with Metal, so be careful with buying this release blindly !

PARNASSUS "In Doloriam Gloria" (Secula Delenda)

This sounds like a symphonic version of Emperor.... and this is why Parnassus sounds a bit over the top! It's too symphonic with their strong use of synths. But I know that a lot of guys (and girlies) will like this band. Fast but very melodical stuff with melancolical touches is the rule here. Slaves to the Scandinavian sound should try this, because this is one of the worthier releases from Sweden, and even if it's very melodical (but still intense) stuff, it's not like all those other melodical Swedish bands!

DEATHWITCH "Triumphant Devastation" (Necropolis)

Like Bewitched, Infernö, etc. ...this is another Scandinavian old-school band members of other bands. featuring Deathwitch play straight and very simple Black/Thrash Metal, a mixture of Kreator and modern Black Metal. Well, the CD is ok, but would have been better if those guys worked harder on the songwriting, because it's sometimes a touch too simple what they show us on "Triumphant Devastation". Let's see what their second LP "Dawn of Armaggedon" will bring...



from the Sun (Adipocere)

Good CD, but lesser of the faster parts would have been better, because this band has its best moments when slowing down the tempo Symphonic fast 'n' melodical Black Metal with an bearable voice (mixture of Black and Death Metal) is game here! I think there's nothing more to say.

THE EVERDAWN "Opern of the Damned" (Invasion)

Swedish stuff, again played in a melodical way. 4 songs which I can recommend to all Swedish Metal loving readers (are there any by the way ?!?).

SCHEITAN "Travelling in Ancient Times" (Invasion)

Members of The Everdawn and Gates of Ishtar formed this new band (or should I say "project" ?!) to bring us intense Black violent Metal, with undenieable parallels to stuff like the 3rd Immortal LP, etc... just fast and grim blasphemy! But you hear in Scheitan's riffs that this band is Swedish... they can't hide their style behind the masquerade of grim Black Metal

DIABOLICAL MASQUERADE 'Ravendusk in my Heart" (Adipocere)

Blackheim (Katatonia/ Bewitched) goes solo! And he managed to record a cool album Black Metal, with melodical midtempo parts, but also very fast blastparts. Influences might be Katatonia (the gothic one), Emperor symphonical one) and even classical Heavy Metal bands (just listen to "Under The Banner of The Sentinel", featuring Dan Swano on vocals 1). It's absolutely not an album that makes you fall asleep!

AMON ARMATH "Sorrow Throughout the Nine World" (Pulverized)

New styled Swedish "Death" Metal... fast, furious, melodical. They have some good guitarriffs to offer, and might be one of the better Swedish bands in that particular style.

GEHENNAH "King of the Sidewalk" (Osmose)

More clone Metal, but it's not as worse as I've expected it be be. It's at least not as unoriginal as their labelmates from Inferno. Gehennah sound like a bloody bastard of Motörhead, Venom and dirty Punk, but it's of course not of the same quality! "King is more "Rock'n'Rolly" compared to "Hard Rocker", the band's debut CD.

DARK TRANOUILLITY 'Enter Suicidal Angels" (Osmose)

Those who like the stuff which Dark Tranquillity have created in the past, will also like this new CD. Melodical, sometimes furious Metal made in Sweden. But why have those guys recorded one techno-song Perhaps this is a taste for how the band sounds in future ?!

ANCIENT WISDOM "For Snow Covered The Northland" (Avantgarde)

Don't expect grim Black Metal here. This is good doorny and emotional Black Metal with cold feelings. Some of the melodical riffs remind me at old Burzum and old Katatonia. It's of course nothing that we haven't heard before, but Ancient Wisdom did a some good work on their debut CD. It's an album that spreads a certain atmophere that is lost in most Black Metal band's music.

INFESTDEAD "Killing Christ"

(Invasion)

The first thought I had when reading the CD's title was "Oh ... this one will suck!", but I was wrong. It's well-played straight ahead Death Metal with big influences from Deicide... that's something I really like ! Also, the CD cover is cool! But next time those guys should try to get a more brutal and dark production !

DEFLESHED "Abrah Kadavrah" (Invasion)

Another cool release by INVASION ! Defleshed are not as "Deicide-influenced" as Infestdead are, but some parallels are existing. It's a funny thing that there are some Swedish bands (like Luciferion, etc.) adopting this U.S. Death Metal style instead of playing this melodic Swedish shit which people call "Death" Metal as well. "Abrah Kadavrah" is not a new cult album, but it's at least a nice one. The only thing that pisses me off is that Defleshed isn't as straight aheadplaying as I want them to be !

DARK FUNERAL "The Secrets of the Black Arts"

(No Fashion)

It's hard to express the intensity of this album in words. It's almost as bombastic, fast and aggressive as Mayhem's "De Myteriis..." is. Of course I have to say that Dark Funeral's release is not as original as Mayhem's LP, but it's all done with the same powerful expression. It's pure fast Black Metal without any will to compromise, it's astonishing to hear the musicians play that prescise. Beside the convincing music I have to mention the great coverartwork (drawn by Necrolord) and the whole layout of this CD

UDDURE "Coldland"

(Napalm)

Most of the Swedish Black Metal bands try to copy eachother in style and sound, but this is luckily not the case at Unpure. They are still faithful to their original sound, and "Coldland" is (at least in my opinion) a strong album, much stronger than the debut CD !!! It's straight ahead old Black Metal with cool riffs and powerful rhythms, and it's sounding very honest and untrendy. Songs like "Horny Goat" (my favoured old demosong), "Count Dracula", etc. are good examples for Unpure's style. More albums like this one,

SETHERIAL "Nord" (Napalm)

This Black Metal manifest sounds like fast Emperor on a much more melodical level. But it's very intense and bombastic/ symphonic music, quite impressive I must Although Setherial do capture all typical Northern Black Metal clichees in their music, I dare to say that this is one of the highlights from Sweden in 1996. Give them a

VINTERLAND "Wings of Sorrow" (No Fashion)

Here again something for lovers of bombastic Black Metal, fast but still with melodies. Surely one of the better CDs as quality can't be denied. The production is great, so don't expect rehearsalsound. To me, Vinterland sound like a tamed and melodical version of

SACRILEGE "Lost In The Beauty You Slay" (Black Sun)

This must be the third band with the name Sacrilege that I know. But let's concentrate on the music. This album is not as overloaded with melodies as it is the case at most of the other melodical Swedish bands these days, and that's good! Sacrilege is Swedish Metal "light", which means this band is a bit harder !

NECROMICON "Realm of Silence" (Impure Creations)

An acceptable release of atmospherical but still fast 'n' powerful Black Metal from Sweden. Melodies aren't of course missing.

DECEMBER MOON 'Source of Origin' (Spinefarm)

Death Metal meets avantgarde, all in the typical Swedish disguise. But December Moon are better than most of their landmates. They still know how to define "energy", and that's very important (to me). This CD seems to be a serious work! They know to mix hard and melodical riffs without starting to souns like a rougher Helloween version like most of the other Swedish competitors.

GATES OF ISHTAR "Bloodred Path" (Spinefarm)

Fans of bands like Dissection, In Flames, Naglfar, etc. should check out Gates to Ishtar's CD!

THE BLACK "Black Blood" (Necropolis)

Another The Black release? Why this? All songs are already included on the "The Priest of Satan" album. Right, this "Black Blood" MCD includes the demorecordings, but hey... was this release really necessary? But if you haven't heard The Black yet, then check out the MCD instead of the CD, for "Black Blood" has a rawer, more wicked (and therefore for Black Metal) better production.

DAWN "Sorgh Pa Svarte Vinger Fogh" (Necropolis)

Dawn play fast, but still melodic Black Metal, and that's something I don't think fits good as a combination. But tastes are different, of course and I must admit that those guys know to play their weapons! My personal highlight in 23 minutes playing time is their coverversion of Infernäl Mäjesty's "Night of the Living Dead" which makes Dawn's own material sounds like Glam if you compare the intensity of the riffs. But the original version still rules supreme

KATATONIA "Brave Murder Day" (Avantgarde)

The guys from Katatonia must have listened to a lot of Rock stuff during the last time, because you can hear this when you bath your ears in "Brave Murder Day". But it's still Katatonia-like... and it's still good what they do, even if I honestly prefer their "For Funerals to Come" Pic12'inch. I think that no one will really be disappointed by their new work, as the band still knows to write good

ARCH ENEMY "Black Earth" (W.A.R.)

"Featuring ex-Carnage members"... wow, this must be great I thought, but at the end I got nothing but disappointed. I really love Carnage's kind of Death Metal, I dare to say that "Dark Recollections" is one of the best dark Death Metal LPs to hail rom Sweden. But Arch Enemy haven't too much in common with Carnage except for the distorted guitarsound Arch Enemy's music isn't dark and brutal... to say it with clear words: It isn't Death Metal, at least not for me ! It's all more melodical now, and is sometimes even filled with (for real Death Metal) untypical rhythms... I don't really like it too much to be honest with you. Luckily this band decided not to continue with the old name, because that would be a real deception for the old fans!

LIERS IN WAIT Spiritually Uncontrolled" (Black Sun)

Swedish Death Metal... but wait! This has nothing to do with the new kind of Swedish stuff. Liers in Wait play the kind of Death Metal the way it was meant to be...extremely violent and brutal, in the vein of Morbid Angel. It's great stuff, but a touch too technical for my primitive ears. 17 minutes of heavy produced devastation.

GOLEM "Eternity... the weeping Horizons" (Invasion)

Following the footsteps of Carcass and Death Metal, "Eternity..." turned out to be a brutal source of energy. I like the morbid riffing and the general atmosphere which is quite powerful. Unfortunately the CD starts with strong songs, but ends with some more or less ordinary ones. But it still is a good CD.

GODGORY "Sea of Dreams" (Invasion)

This kind of Death Metal seems to be popular! "Sea of Dreams" is not only ruled by the brutal kind of playing, but also by absolute harmonical parts with nice soli and acoustic guitars. This is not a CD where every song sounds equal, so you often get surprised during the 48 minutes playing time. There are of course still things that aren't perfect yet (mid-tempo /slower parts), but for a debut CD it's good.



GROTESQUE "In the Embrace of Evil" (Black Sun)

Grotesque are regarded as a cult band by a lot of people, and with this re-release of their old stuff on CD, younger Death Metal fans, who missed to listen to this band, have now the chance to check out the class of this old band. Swedish Death Metal in its old form... dark 'n' powerful the way it should be! This CD comes as a digipack with an extra booklet... looks cool!

MURDER CORPORATION "Blood Revolution 2050" (Oabalah)

This new band says they're influenced by Master, Repulsion, Impetigo, etc., so now you know how to handle this band. Death Metal, simple, brutal, but without the final kick. And this makes the album only recommendable to die-hard lunatics. Even the fact that the ex-Megaslaughter (a great band!) vocalist sings here doesn't make this CD better.

ALGAJON "Vox Clamentis" (Wounded Love)

Again, melodical but still fast Swedish Death/ Black- Metal. Nothing much has changed since their first release!

CARDINAL SIN "Spiteful Intents" (W.A.R.)

4 songs of melodical stuff the way most of the Swedish bands play. Why don't all those bands form a kind of "Big Band"? It would sound the same anyway...

NECROPHOBIC "Darkside" (Black Mark)

It's the return of Necrophobic, and they still play brutal 'n' dark Death Metal. The only difference between this CD and the old stuff is that the band lost most of their Morbid Angel-spirit and sounds more "Swedish" now instead. Even some Black Metal-like riffs can be heard now at parts. It's a good powerful album with a great coverartwork, so Death Metal maniacs have another reason to party.



BEWITCHED "Encyclopedia of Evil" (Osmose)

A MCD with covers from Mercyful Fate, Bathory, even Black Widow, etc. plus a new version of the band's own composition "Hellcult" can be found here, and they did a good job. But do we really need this release?

THE BLACK "The Priest of Satan" (Necropolis)

This album arrives about three years too late. It was recorded back in 1993, but it wasn't released until 1996 for unknown reasons. It's raw Swedish Black Metal with simple but effective riffs. Nowadays this album can be considered as "average", but three years ago this CD would have been a killer. As said before, "The Priest of Satan" is three years too late, but is still enjoyable though.

MARDUK "Heaven Shall Burn..." (Osmose)

The most characteristic element in Marduk's music must be the incredible speed. Their Black Metal is really ultrafast, but that's probably the band's main problem, because especially the very fast parts suck a lot of energy out of the music. But the instrumental abilities are astonishing, no doubt about it! A live album will be released later, and I'm sure that it will proove that Marduk are really able to play their fast stuff live as well.

CENTINEX "Reflections" (Die Hard)

A mixture of old and new-styled Swedish Death Metal is Centinex's style. Their music is very straight ahead and it's easy to get into the songs. I prefer the parts where the ghosts of old forces like Carnage, Entombed, etc. appear.

Final LP/CP Warnings

DEMONIAC "Stormblade" (Evil Omen)

"Prepare for War", the band's debut CD, offered Black Metal with some folklore influences, but "Stormblade" is more a sort of Heavy Metal album with blackened vocals. The folklore-influence still remained, but for the rest it's all very different in comparison to the debut album. Now you can hear traditional Heavy Metal techniques...and it sounds very well. I'm indeed surprised by this work, not only good riffs but also great soli, tempo changes, etc. can be heard here. Demonlac changed their sound to the better. The only thing I find shit is the band's "torturous satanic sex-slave" image... it doesn't fit to the music at all. If I want to be entertained by dirty "Sex Metal" lyrics, then I listen to real dirty stuff like The Mentors, because their music fits perfectly to their lyrics.

INTESTINE BAALISM "An Anatomy of the Beast" (Repulse)

Brutal Death Metal stuff from Japan, and those guys are not afraid to use some real melodies here and then without losing power. A cool CD which should be checked by Death Metallers. Impressive coverartwork, really great!

YOUR SHAPELESS BEAUTY (Adipocere)

Mid tempo Metal with keyboards, screamed vocals, etc..., stuff that is hard to decribe as it is very unspectacular, at least for me. I think this CD is something for people that are looking for simple stuff with touches of Gothic, Black and harmonic Metal.

(Adipocere)

Better than the above reviewed album is Kalisia's CD debut, because they have some good metallic riffs to offer. It's straight forward, guitarorientated Metal on a certain technical (but not too technical) level, supported by keyboards and a deep voice. Influences? Perhaps Greek and Swedish Metal, a bit of Crematory and traditional Heavy Metal. A good 4 song CD!

HAMMENTS

Witchburner is a new band that piays good old-fashioned Death/ Thrash Metal. The influences are taken from Kreator, Sodom, and neo-Death Metal. They present their music in a quite convincing and honest way, this band doesn't seem to be one of those "wanna-be old Metal rip off shit"-bands. Their debut CD is of course not perfect yet, but it prooves that this band has potential. So it would be cool to hear more stuff from this German outfit in future.

IMMORTAL "Blizzard Beasts" (Osmose)

With this fourth album Immortal will probably lose some of their old fans, because the band's style gets more and more complex and extreme with every new LP. "Blizzard Beasts" continues where "Battles in the North" ended, it hasn't really much to do with the first two albums anymore. But I think that "Blizzard Beasts" is not a bad album; it's just not as easy to listen to Immortal as it used to be. The riffs are really morbid and sometimes quite complex... and I dare to say that some parts sound very Morbid Angel-like when it comes to the morbidity/ disharmonies. Perhaps Demonaz and Abbath got a little inspired when they toured with Trey and his morbid angels. One thing is for sure: Immortal haven't wimped out and are more uncommercial than ever.

PAZUZU "Awaken the Dragon" (Dark Matter)

Pazuzu was one of the first bands to come up with dark non-metallic (medieval) ritual music with deep/ high vocals, and everyone who remembers the band's debut CD "...And all was silent" knows that this Austrian force stands for good quality music. "Awaken the Dragon", the second CD, is still recognizable as a Pazuzu album, but the style of songwriting has changed a bit. Don't worry, it's still good stuff which doesn't make you sleepy (like it is the case at most of the other non-metallic bands), there's still a sort of magic in the music! All those who liked the debutCD will also enjoy this new one as well. Don't waste your money on the copybands... check out the originals instead.

"War Funeral March" (Embassy)

Originally released as the band's first official demo on FULL MOON; these 5 unholy Black Metal songs are now re-released on MCD format. Unlike the other Vlad Tepes releases, these recordings are more "modern"- Black Metal sounding à la old Graveland (especially the vocals), etc... very harsh 'n' extreme stuff. This French member of the Black Legions knows to play Black Metal with the necessary dark feeling, and even the production is acceptable this time! This MCD is limited to 500 copies only, so interested people should hurry up.

ABSU "The Third Storm of Cythal" (Osmose)

Yeah, this is a great album. Absu understand to combine old Thrash Metal with new Black Metal sounds without sounding like a clone-band. This third album offers first class Metal mayhem with a lot of powerful parts and great drumwork. Also the coverartwork is impressive. What should I say? This is the best band OSMOSE has to offer right now! Buy or die!!!

EDGE OF SANITY "Infernal" (Black Mark)

The devil is in Edge of Sanity now, at least in some parts, because they have adopted a bit of Black Metal here and then. But it's still typical Edge of Sanity-styled stuff with all the distorted guitarsound and those harmonic riffs. There are both good and not so good songs included on "Infernal", but I'm sure that fans will again enjoy this album, even if the songmaterial varies a lot from song to song.

PURITY "Built" (Black Mark)

Modern Metal stuff with sung vocals, but it lacks of a certain feeling that is necessary to make heads bang. Not really bad, but not really recommendable as well.

DYING FETUS "Purifaction Through Violence" (Die Hard)

The influences seem to be old Carcass, Suffocation, Cannibal Corpse, but Dying Fetus' Death/ Grind is not as "deathly" as the music of those mentioned bands. But it's extreme anyway,

COVENANT

After long delays here Covenant's first CD. It's pure Norwegian Black Metal on a high quality level. The biggest influence must be Satyricon, but I think that Covenant are better. This album is finally an interesting one worth the money.

GEASA "Starside"

6 nordic Black Metal songs with a clear sound, with both atmospheric and hard parts. That's all... \$5: Draighean, 184 Grace Park Rd., Drumcondra, Dublin 9, Ireland,

OSSUARY"The Black Wind ... "

Raging Deathrash played on a higher technical level.... these guys really know to torment their instruments, and it sounds cool and honest. SERPENT RISE "Travellin' Free"

A tape for people into depressive and melancholical Doom sounds... and these sounds are combined with a sort of "Space music" which makes your soul fly. Interesting and very moody music indeed! NEBULA OF DESTINY "Rehearsaltape'96"

He accuses him being a rip-off, etc. . so there's really some bad air between them. Anyway, let's concentrate on the music: Black Metal in the typical Austrian style (= melodical but still aggressive at parts). Some riffs are cool, some are just boring. So this one is hard to review, but I have the feeling that Trifixion's third album won't be an important classic for Black Metal history.

DEFACE "The Temple of Truth"

There are quite a lot of German bands who are playing melodical death à la Crematory and such sort of stuff, and so is Deface. Their music sounds professional, with good riffs and vocals, so if you are into this style, you shouldn't be afraid to invest your cash into this demo (6 songs). NEW ACE "Decadent Image of Creation in the Nihilist Age"

Finally something promising: This band is a proof for my theories that there are a lot of great but still unknown bands hiding in the countries on the Eastside of the old iron curtain. 

Black Metal needn't have a high distorted guitarsound or tons of sweet melodies, etc. ... If you are looking for straight ahead dark, brutal, both slow and fast Black/ Death Metal with the necessary violent feeling, then you have to hear DECAYED. They already released two full-length CDs and one MCD, but due to bad promotion and ignorance from the label-asslicking and trendy press, this band is still rooted in the deepest abyss of the underground, and is only known to very few people.

As I find the band's music quite powerful and honestly, I got in touch with their axeman and wanted to know more details about this older Portuguese Black/Death Metal force...

Tell us about your 3rd album! For what kind of Metalheads is it especially made?

'Well, our 2nd album (3rd CD) is available since August to every Metalhead in the true meaning of the word. People into the old Gods, the mighty bands who started it all in the 80s. This is Pure Metal, Black Metal in the way that it was meant to be. No bullshit attitudes, no evil kids who discovered "Black Metal" when the Norwegian trend came to life.'

Although you managed to release three CDs and one 7'inch, you can't really say that DECAYED is a well-known band in the underground, can you? Who's the one to blame? SKYFALL Records?

You're right, we aren't a well-known band in the underground, but I can't say that there is anyone to blame except for the people who make the underground. We're ignored, because we are not from Norway. There are just too many reasons for our position in the underground. The main one is: We don't follow any trends, therefore trendies don't follow us. I guess that our small part in the scene shows the amount of trendies within the scene. Because I doubt that anyone can honestly say that we are worst than all the shit that has big names.'

DECAYED is luckily one of the bands that doesn't sound as trendy as most of the other bands around in Black /Death Metal. So it's obvious for me to ask about your influences. Are you keeping away from typical nordic sounds (shrieky guitars, etc.) on purpose.... or is it like "what happens happens" when it comes to your songwriting?

I guess that it's obvious that we don't have the same influences than all these trend followers. We are in this scene for something like 10 years now, we are not 17 year-old kids (well, I've nothing against young Heavy Black Metallers as long as their attitudes are good!-ed.). We mainly listen to all sorts of Metal from the 80s and not only "Black Metal". We listen to Heavy-Speed - Thrash - Death - Black from the good old days. We don't try to sound like the nordic bands, it's just that we are different from those guys. Probably our backgrounds are different and our mentality is for sure, different. But if something sounds a bit like nordic, we won't change it (Yes, your song "?" has a touch of old Immortal... or is it old BATHORY?!!! -ed.). If we like a certain riff, we keep it, besides being a "what happens happens" situation: It's a "We do what we want, fuck you!" -attitude!'

Which are the main differences between between "In Lustful Mayhem", your second CD, and your new output?

Fuck! "In Lustful Mayhem" isn't an album, it was a MCD that should never be released! It was a mistake. In that time we were going through some bad shit within the band and my personal life was also a bunch of shit. I guess that you can easily check that, if you listen to this stupid CD. Also, I wanted to try something with the sound which obviously didn't work out! The main difference is that when we started to write the material for the 2nd album, we knew what we wanted to do. We learn from our mistakes, so it had to be better. Another thing was that this time I wouldn't care if the songs sounded like BATHORY. Whatever came out of my mind, it would be put onto tape. That didn't happen when we wrote the 1st album. The major change is that now I write what I want and I don't give a fuck about anything. If people want to listen to Decayed, fine. If not, FUCK OFF!!!"

Have you planned to play more coverversions in future (like you've done on "In Lustful Mayhem" and your new CD? I think it's quite popular to cover old

bands' songs in these days

'HAHAHAH! Yeah, you're right, it's very popular to coversongs these days. But there is a small difference between us and everyone else. Since the beginning of Decayed back in 1990 we play covers and we do it with the feeling from the 80s. I mean, most of the covers that you hear these days are totally shit! I don't even know why some bands do them (I don't even know why some Black Metal bands claim to have one thousand and one old bands as their influences without recognizing any of them in the new bands' style ! -ed.). What's the point in doing a coverversion if you're going to murder the feeling of the song? We do covers, because we want to keep something alive. To me, there isn't that much difference between the covers that we do and the actual songs of DECAYED (well, some of your songs are "a bit" faster than the covers, hehe ! -ed.). But back to your question: Yes, we're doing some other covers. Our debut CD is about to be re-released through NAZGUL'S EYRIE PRODUCTIONS with four coverversions as bonustracks (besides four more old songs!). "Tormentor" from KREATOR, "Sign Of Evil" from VIOLENT FORCE, "Woman of Dark Desires" from BATHORY and "The Conqueror" from SODOM. We are also working on "Touch Too Much" from AC/DC and we'll see what we'll do in future.'

Is there a good Metal scene in Portugal (relating to both bands 'n' fans)? Please compare it to your neighbour's scene, the Spanish one!

No scene! There are bands (lots) and there are fans (lots), but no Metal. Here in this country everyone is trying to sound like PANTERA; SEPULTURA; PARADISE LOST, RAGE A.T.M.! Now there is also the trend of sounding (and looking) like MOONSPELL. And apart from that, 90% of the band members are stupid kids who act like big rockstars, No seene! As for the fans.... CRADLE OF FILTH till they die (Oh no! -ed.)! Or "I like CANNIBAL CORPSE and RAGE A.T.M." and too much brainless shit like that. It's disgusting! I don't have a clue of how's the Spanish scene, so I can't compare it. I don't have anything good to say about Spain.'


"At the end I'd like to say that it would be nice to receive some small recognition for what we are, a Pure Metal band. Finding a drummer would also be cool:

Yes, indeed, because Metal music demands real drums that get hammered by strong arms !!!

If you are into the kind of style of Black Metal which sounds a touch more violent and darker with a guitarsound where you can identify the riffs as more than just a shricking rhythmic noise, then try DECAYED's music. It would be unfair to ignore this band while other bands are hailed because of their boring trendy

At the end I also had a change to get some words from the band's vocalist/ Bassmen concerning DECAYED, so read what he has to say...

... DECAYED is considered as a kind of mythic band in Portugal due to its problems the band has faced during his years of existence! However, being labeled as the Portuguese underground cult old styled Black Metal band is very good for us, but on the other hand we always had problems with labels, being ripped off in the end, there was a time when several promoters were afraid to put DECAYED live as rumours were spread we were alcoholics, destroy everything on stage, we were an incentivation to violence, among other senseless comments. To finsih this, major labels don't give a shit to us because we are Portuguese besides we'll never change, we won't sell out and become trendy! And people tell DECAYED is not innovative, out-dated, unoriginal, etc. and speak better about Norwegian bands which are copying each other! Last but not least, it's the drummer dilema... we simply can't find a decent drummer for more than two years more or less! Perhaps 6 guys tried, but all wanted to play more atmospheric stuff, or slow etc., so that's why we decided for a drum-machine. I know it may sound irretating, even for us, but we can't stop nor being dependent of someone either! The drum machine gives us a lot of problems, because if we don't have P.A. we can't play or else it's very easy to get lost in the middle of the music even if you have released a lot. Then it's people complaining we use a drum-machine, still very dogmatic about that, but what can we do. We gave up searching for a drummer as well.. funny is that when we start playing they realize three guys make more chaos and mayhem than six or seven on stage. We have a lot of ideas for the future albums, and we won't stop, we will continue, no matter what I believe things will go better for us if we get a good promotion and distribution with this new second album.



What would you think when a band, namely GUILLOTINE, entitles their demo "Under the Guillotine" ? Yes, similarities to KREATOR are undenieable, as "Under the Guillotine" is a great song from those German thrashers.

But not enough, GUILLOTINE from Sweden even sound like old KREATOR, it's almost like covering old songs from their "Endless Pain" period.

The demotape, which has a good 'n' clear sound, starts with "Tormentor" which is not coverversion of the KREATOR song, but is in the same thrashing style. It's well-done ith its raging speed guitars, and could have been recorded about a decade ago. The second song is the fast "Guillotine" and it has an opening riff like BATHORY's "Reaper", and continues with a "Flag of Hate" KREATOR-like riff... "Crucifixion", again a skullcushing thrasher, closes this cool but total unoriginal demo.

Well, I have some problems with this bands as I don't know what to think of them ... are they serious, or is it just another band to cash in with the help of the new "old Metal" trend? I tried to clear up my mind by getting in touch with Spider, the one who handles the "Screaming Guitarz & Vocals from Hell", especially as the band is planning to release an album...

You already signed a deal with NECROPOLIS Records, although you are still a more or less unknown name in the Metal scene. What can you tell us about the deal? Why NECROPOLIS ?

The contract we got from NECROPOLIS is for two LPs/CDs. We got a good royalty... and a lot of money for the recordings and the cover stuff. You might have heard bad things about them... but... you have to take chances. We got a lot of other offers, too, for example OSMOSE Productions, MALICIOUS Records, etc... But e decided to go for NECROPOLIS. We are an derground band, and we didn't want to sign

ith OSMOSE. Hervé thinks that he can get any band he wants on his label, because he knows that his label's big. On the other hand, we are the first band to choose another label before OSMOSE... so... it's a honour, haha. But othing bad for Hervé and his label from my

Well, NECROPOLIS isn't really a small label (anymore) as well, they have a well-selling and called NIFELHEIM! But I understand our point of view ... So can we expect you to ecord your debut album very soon ? an we expect ?

Yes, we will record our debut album very soon. It will contain 10 songs and the title will be, just like the demo, "Under the Guillotine". The songs influenced by Kreator (of course), Destruction, Deathrow, Possessed, Bathory,... Titles are: "Grave Desecration", "Violence", "Headhunter", "Bringer of Death", "Total Mayhem", "Death Penalty", "Leprosy", Tormentor", "Guillotine" and "Crucifixion".

ery original songtitles, it must have taken hours to invent them, haha On your demo you're heavily ripping off old KREATOR riffs ("Flag of "Cry War", etc.), but what about your new songs? Can we spect at least a touch of originality or do you want GUILLOTINE to be band which is just known for stealing old riffs (like INFERNÖ does) ?

Well, I haven't been ripping off old Kreator riffs. I agree that I have a riff ch is the same that they have, and it's the song riff on "Flag of Hate". I didn't steal it... I made that riff (Come on, I don't believe this! ed.)! Later I piced that it was the same riff. But then it was too late, because we had just released the demo. That riff only contains three accords, so... It's easy to make riff like that. Our new songmaterial isn't any Kreator rip off-stuff. I think, have the same kind of riffs, so that explains alot. We have a lot of struction influences, too (we will see when your album's out ! - ed.). bont want Guillotine to be known as a "Rip Off" band... I'm trying to do m n stuff, but sometimes it's difficult.

Does Mille Petrozza know what you're doing with his old riffs? Have you tried to get in contact with him? It would be interesting to know his opinion on GUILLOTINE, wouldn't it? He will probably kill you, haha!

Well, it ain't his riffs... they're mine (don't start to bore me ! -ed.) ! Yes, it would be great to hear his opinion, but he will probably think it's teenage shit music which he has left. But you never know... he might get nostaglic feelings. Who's hiding behind GUILLOTINE? I can't

get rid of the feeling that it is a union of other bands' musicians, right ? Or don't you want to tell us from which "main" bands you're emerging? Don't you think that a couple of side-projects for the fans and yourself? couple of side-projects isn't a honest thing

You coward ! But I'm sure it won't be possible to keep your secret, you'll see ! There's certainly a "main" band above GUILLOTINE!! 44. 1. 1. 1.

How's the relationship between you and other new "old Metal" bands? With whom are you in touch? Do you think that the old thrashing fans (if there are still any left) will accept these new old-sounding outfits ? Some of those bands seem to be very unserious in my opinion....

I know Bewitched quite well, because the live in the same town just like the rest of us. I have no contact with any other bands... we don't have the satanic image like all the others (You haven't read TALES OF THE MACABRE #2. because there was a non-satanic Greek Thrash band called Despise featured ! - ed.). We stand on our own feet. We are a true Thrash band, we do not sound like the other new "oldies" (You're right ! -ed.) ! We are 100% Thrash, and they are not that. I think that old thrashers might like our stuff, but they have probably found a new meaning in their life, so they are probably into rock/pop stuff now.' 138 MAN Why do you call yourself "Spider" ? Tom Araya used to have this name for his headbanging style... Well, I wanted to be called like that We wanted these names, so that's the reason why we are using them. Perhaps it's childish, but you must enjoy the time on this earth while you still exist. Right, Costa ! (Of course ! -ed.) I forgot one thing from the question above, and it was about the seriousness in the music. I think a lot of the new bands are a bit unserious. But I'm 100% serious with Guillotine. I write songs I like If a song, in my opinion, sounds bad, I rewrite it. But you needn't be too serious . because then the

music turns out to be bad, as you want things to be 100%ly great.'
Now an ugly question at the end for you, as

you are a big KREATOR fan: Which German band once shared the rehearsalplace with Mille & Company? A little help: They 'Hm... to be honest, I don't know

Black Metal band nor a new oldschool Thrash Metal outfit... but they want to follow a tradition of a certain old band, and therefore their sound will nothing have in common with "originality"..., but enough said. Read the following interview (the first one!) with this unknown German band that has been around for quite some years now without spreading any signs of life to the public.

WARHAMMER has arrived to raise a certain forgotten spirit from the dead. Please tell us about the band's concept / mission!

Wathammer: Since May 1984 when Hellhammer's ultra heavy imagery had come to the end with their final and ultimate recording 'Apocalyptic Raids'. we've been looking forward to continue the band's brand of sound and its dark, martial doom-laden concept of the late period. So we've got nothing in common with the ideologies of today's Black/ Death scene. And (as Hellhammer said) we also do not believe in doctrines made by human beings! Warhammer was formed to bring forth the all-powerful energy of Hellhammer's speed/slow deathnoise back to mind!"

Why have so many bands failed when they tried to copy HELLHAMMER's very own sound? Only impotent wimps?

Warhammer: Did those bands really try to copy Hellhammer's real sound and concept? We don't think so. For example, none of them ever did use the right tune (!) of guitar/bass which is absolutely necessary to receive the 'Raids' sound! And none of them wrote tracks in this particular style; the rifting/powerchord-changes/ rhythms of Hellhammer's late-period were completely different; based in Hardcore-Punk which is musically (and often lyricwise!) much closer to Hellhammer than ordinary Metal.. The combination of two styles made it so effective. When Martin Ain came into the band, Hellhammer changed its whole theme to a more sophisticated

subject. Hellhammer themselves called their music this time Hardcore-Metal faot only Hellhammer, but also bands like Slayer were called like this in that time. There's even an Exodus bootleg existing under this title ! -ed.), just take a look at old NECROMANIAC UNION NEWSLETTERS and they hated it to be named a Black Metal band! Instead of this point of view other bands wrote lyrics which claimed to be parts of stupid horror-movies, but that had nothing to do with Tom Warrior's or Martin Ain's true ambition during the late (!) period of Hellhammer. Of course, Hellhammer wrote their dark lyrics with the influence of ancient revelations (the heptagramand the coverdrawing were symbols used to bring forth the occult (not satanic !) side), but the main subject with "Apocalpytic Raids" and the two songs of the sampler 'Death Metal' was the often darker side of mankind's reality (forthcoming world war. the decline of intellect, etc.). The lyrics of 'Apocalyptic Raids', with the exception of Triumph of Death", appear like a warning of things supposed

Hellhammer versus Celtic Frost

You are a die hard Necromaniae with your immortal admiration for HELLHAMMER, but you're not too fond of CELTIC FROST. Why? Are these two bands so different?

Frank: It's obvious that Celtic Frost was a completely different band! When they released their debut 'Morbid Tales', I wasn't really disappointed; Hellhammer was finished forever, so I knew a long time before the recording of 'Morbid Tales' that Tom and Martin would change their sound and concept radically with the new name! You can't play Hardcore-Metal heavier and cruder with a darker concept than Hellhammer did with

"Apocalyptic Raids". So what should I expect? Perhaps Celtic Frost was also original, but it was totally different to Hellhammer, Just take a look at the guitarwork... Celtic Frost never had the pure, raw distortion of Hellhammer, this distinctive crude tone and Ain's bass-sound on the MLP is the darkest, ultraheaviest sound I've ever heard in my life! With Celtic Frost he changed to a normal standard bass with lots of trebles and mids; so you can hear his more advanced playing which really fits to the Celtic Frost material, but it has nothing to do with his sound/style at Hellhammer...

On "Apocalyptic Raids" Tom played only three powerchords which were forced with Martin's simple but effectice basslines! Also the writing/arrangement of songs was done in a completely other way! I really think that Celtic Frost in the beginning were much more into occult lyrics than Hellhammer ever did, so their concept also included a lot of fantasy-stories. For sure, no one should scriously compare these two bands. It's ridiculous!

Volker: I really like the first two Celtic Frost MLPs and To Mega Therion. I think, it was very original Metal, but, like Frank said, totally different from Hellhammer. And it's absolutely no music I would like to recreate myself."

WARHAMMER hasn't released anything official yet, so when can we expect your songs to get unleashed upon the headbanging masses?

Wathammer: We are currently recording material for our official demotape, which will supposedly include four tracks. At this time, it's very hard for us to catch our true sound, which is very raw and powerful. We've recorded two tapes only to make experiences with the recording itself and to separate the real good stuff. But we are not satisfied with the work! Our live-sound is much heavier, so we hope to record our material in a professional studio in a few months. Our address will follow?

Do you think that there's still a big interest in a band like WARHAMMER today? I think that HELLHAMMER's cult isn't too strong nowadays, even if many musicians claim to have HELLHAMMER as one of their fave bands (only because of "prestige" reasons, if you ask me I)...

Wathammer: We don't speculate, if anyone, who wears a Heilhammer shirt, really means it. Everyone is welcome to check out our sound and if he or she likes it - great. Of course we try to reach the Heilhammer die-hard maniacs, and we're sure

they're hard to convince, but we are not talking

Apocalyptic Raids ?

Frank: Before I am going to answer this question, please let me introduce that I first wrote the following lines for the TALES OF THE MACABRE - Supporter James side. It perfectly declares my whole fascination for the music/sound and the concept/lyrics of Hellhammer's last days with just a few words...

When Hellhammer recorded their 4-track MLP for German label NOISE Records way back in March 1984, magazines worldwide had an release in prospect which would blow away anything done by famous acts like Venom, Slayer or Exciter. Of course, the pre-recordings (3 demotapes) shew a form of pure. raw power at its most intense moments, including influences like the earliest days of Black Sabbath. Motorhead and a few Hardcore-Punk acts (Discharge), but "Apocalyptic Raids" was surely far beyind description_ (SHADES, recordstore, England, May 84). A bastard made of unbelievable rawness, scorching power and total crude heaviness! The EP starts with the opener The Third of the Storms (Evoked Damnation)", an absolute brutal ultraheavy speedtrack emerging more and more extreme from the first crushing chords to the crude and awcsome main-thythmriff featuring Tom Warrior's dark, grim vocals, his disintegrating superraw guitamoise and Martin Ain's fast, ultraheavy bassdoses with passages like Three days of absolute eclipse introduce the evoked tribunal... It's followed by the lightning blast "Massacra". another full-speed corer with a total doom-laden riff in the mid-part. Hellhammer at this time really hated (1) it to be called a Black Metal band. And that's obvious... just read the lyrics (sad enough, only the first 1.200 copies were sold with a lyric sheet) (never mind, people who have bought my second issue can find them on the backcover ! -ed.) of the tracks The Third of the Storms (Evoked Damnation)'. 'Massacra' or 'Horus/ Aggressor'. These songs (as well as the two songs of the Death Metal -NOISE Sampler, Revelations of Doom and 'Messiah') completely feature Hellhammer's symbolical, dark concept (co-written and created by doom-merchant Martin Ain) about the decline of a world made of stone and mankind's self-destructive greed... Warrior's and Ain's own thoughts about the theme while introducing old-aged revelations...

All this goes along with the dark, martial and extreme bandmember outfit featuring bulletbelts and cycpainting necessary to gain their negatory concept with the heptagram drawing (Ain) and the frontcover - painting (Warrior). A lot of Metal fans seemed to be shocked about the new form and dimension of extremity (especially here in Germany) and just completely ignored this subject as no one of them could ever imagine that it's anything else but easy to write songmaterial in this way, because those songs had to be limited to a few chords to create maximum heaviness ! Side B's opener Triumph of Death crawls out of the speaker with its almost ceric-intro and its all-crushing first thythmriff (this song is still the most morbid one Tve ever heard ! -ed.]... The only track which leatures lyrics dealing with the subject of being buried alive. To say it in Tom Warrior's words: It's just a horror theatre...". About nine minutes long this song shows a few shythm changes, totally primitive but effective the same way ! At the end, another dark-driving doomster Horus/Aggressor leads into total blackness... For acons, Hellhammer's

You experienced the time when Black /Thrash Metal became popular, right? Please tell us about "fan experiences" you made during that time. Do you think that today's fans are much more different to the old Thrashers?

Rolf: In the early days 82/83/84 everything was very new and exciting. Sometimes it was anything else but easy to get the brandaew recordings; stores often were not able to get those wanted items, so the underground became the most important thing for tape traders to receive stuff like the first demotapes of acts like Hirax, Zaowhite, Malice and even Hellhammer. I remember the first ten years when we met at a local place called THE MEPHISTO' to see friends and, of course, to listen to our favourite bands. It was the time when Slayer's Reign in Blood was released and more than a dozen of Slayer-fans came to headbang to the very fast music. Sow we decided to put on something really heavy... For sure, after the first chords of Hellhammer's "The Third of the Storms" did emerge, everyone of them tried to escape the pit ! Only two Hellhammer maniacs were left to adore their ultimate faves in headbangin' crusade! I have to add that the DJ always played the records with the highest volume possible, so it was often louder than the official gigs! At this volume Hellhammer can't be beaten by any other band; it's like harddriving, destructive energy!

No, I don't think that a Black / Death / Whatever fan really can be seperated from the fans of the early days, because they do adore their faves as much as the maniaes of the 80s. But nowadays it's anything else but easy to find out what's interesting or what's not; everyone who's able to buy a guitar seems to be able to release a dozen CDs within a short time. To me, it's just too fast (it certainly is !-ed.). But that's only my point of view!

Rothing but Sellhammer Still rules ?

Which old Metal bands have survived in your heart?

Frank: 'Of course Motorhead (75 - 81), who had a strong influence on Hellhammer with their legendary "Overkill" LP! Songs like "Damage Case" or the titlesong do offer real power with a harddriving beat. I also think that Tank were great; Fifth Hounds of Hades' and the IZEP 'Hammer On were some of the crudest outputs at that time. Not to forget the always underrated Znowhite with rhythm-machine lan Tafoya, who blasted into the scene with an outstanding Thrash Metal style on "Act of God", far away from being a Metallica or Exodus - clone. I'd also like to mention the Swedish Punk-band Crude S.S. (Crude Society System) which should be of interest for every true Hellhammer maniac ! On their Who'll survive ? TEP from 1984 (!) they mixed Hellhammer style with Discharge-riffing and they're still one of the heaviest formations ever known.

Yolker: I still like some of the old stuff like Motorhead, Savage Death, the first Bathory LP, Dark Angel (Darkness Descends'), Dark Legion or the early Celtic Frost period. I will also love the first Rose Tattoo LP forever, the rawest Rock sound you can get?

Rolf: I don't listen to ordinary Heavy Metal anymore (shame on you!!-ed.), because I'm more into Punk and Hardcore acts like Discharge, C.G. Allin, Life of Agony, Slapshot or Madball. The only hardcore Metal band from the early days which has survived in my heart is Hellhammer.

Why aren't you too much into today's black/death scene?

Volker: I don't listen to today's Death Metal of Black Metal. Because of some friends I have a pretty good overlook, but I don't like too much of the stuff I hear. I think, Delirium from the Netherlands have a very solid production on their Zzooouhh LP (yeah, every reader into HEAVY stuff should check this one out !-ed.]. I also like the music from Dark Throne's track 'Quintessence', but not the vocals. Well, I guess this isn't too much, is it? (not really. haha ! -ed) Today's Death Metal is too technically complex for my tastes, and I never liked the superfast stuff. I miss the flair a lot of the old bands had like Legion of Death, Sacrifice or Whiplash. The Metal back then had a certain kind of simplicity I adore. I do not need 10 minutes songs with 30 different riffs that try to come down like Metal operas, but only to bore me to death.

You might be right with this, but have you ever heard the old BURZUM stuff? This is simplicity in its purest form!

When anything of WARHAMMER gets released, can we expect nothing but new songs? How old are your oldest creations?

Warhammer; 'Of course we'd like to release the very old stuff, too! We wrote some really ultraheavy material in the past; speed-songs as well as slow grinding tracks! So the concept was created in Summer 84 and the earliest songs were written in the first months of 1986 [!!!-ed.]!

Frank: Warhammer will have its true sound with the recording of the first demotape, so we've been currently looking for a deal with a label which is really interested in releasing pure Hellhammerdeathnoise. It's up to the hunatics...

Yeah. it's up to you, you lunatic headhangers! I really hope (and pray) that WARHAMMER will really manage to release something that will make my metallic blood run faster! Hope their deathnoise sound will be at least half as deadly as the one from my Swiss gods!!! So keep your eyes 'n' ears open for this unusual and still very unknown German hand!

Sorry, but no address should be named until an official release is out to kill...

Warhammer is...

Frank Krynojewski (Bass and Guitars) Volker Frerich (Vocals) Rolf Meyn (Drums)

P.S.: I finally heard that their MLP is already recorded and will feature following tracks...

- Warzones
-Shattered Memories
-Predictions of Doom
-The Tempter of Destruction
-The Void inside the Darkness

This MLP will have a great gatefold-cover with lyrics, so everyone should look forward to getting his hand on Marhammer's debut raid!

I'm very excited to hear it!!!!



Due to the very positive response to Mark Mackay's report (about his experience he had with CELTIC FROST years ago) in issue three, I decided to look for some more old Heavy Metal maniacs that like to share their experiences with us... and I'm glad that René van Mol, a faithful Metal warrior from Eindhoven/ Holland, wrote down some his memories that he has concerning the legendary DYNAMO Club... He was there since the very beginning of this phenomenon, and since DYNAMO nowadays is nothing but a big commerical institution, it is probably interesting to read how things were years ago in Eindhoven... Well, we better let René do the talking.....

' In 1981, the youthcentre DYNAMO in Eindhoven/Holland, started with an own kaffee(bar) for the Hardrock/ Heavy Metal fans so that they could meet eachother and talk, drink (a lot of Beers!), and bang their heads dizzy on a huge stage on our own kind of favoured music

In those days Metal was very big in Eindhoven, very big in fact and even two guys, two Hardrock/ Heavy Metal maniacs from the early years began to create and publish a Metal magazine called AARDSCHOK (in English this means "earthquake") and it was very popular. With this mag we were able to read about all our favourite bands and if new album was expected to be released, if some band(s) had the idea to come over to Holland for some gigs and of course the reviews of some many albums and how the "experts" thought about it. Nowadays the AARDSCHOCK magazine still exists and has gone far big, but now it's just a huge and commercial mag, full with fake, false Metal... Fuck false Metal, ONLY DEATH IS REAL!!! But in the beginning of this mag it was just for the real Metal Maniacs and it wasn't on a profit pursuit for the creators of Aarschock.

From the start of AARDSCHOCK until now it is still written in Dutch because in Holland the Metal scene has always been very big and even now it's still huge, but only for those so called "Metal" bands, for guys who only play for the money and don't have any old Metal roots. These trendies jump on the bandwagon every time the wind direction changes, but if you want to see real Metal bands the way they were meant to be, well, you have to go to the smaller clubs and take a (stage) dive into the underground, because there's still the atmosphere and respect for the original creators of Metal.

atmosphere and respect for the original vocation and atmosphere and respect for the original band, nowadays, start to play Metal, because real It doesn't matter in which year a beginnig band, nowadays, start to play Metal, because real Metal is timeless, so the real bands nowadays are honoured and proud to play the Metal we all like.

We don't have normal blood in our veins... it's metallized blood !!! And even the air what we breath is full of Metal and once you have sold your soul to the devilish Metal, well, there's no way back !!!

In those golden years (which will never come back, fuck !!!), a lot of bands have played in the DYNAMO Club, like **Kreator**, **Exodus** (twice with Paul Balloff), **Mercyful Fate**, **Anvil**, **Raven**, **Jaguar**, **Slayer** (twice in a week, 28th May and 3rd June 1985, arrrghhhh, killleeeeerrrrr hellish shows with those captors of sin..., both shows were sold out, and there were as much people standing in front of the club as there were inside it), **Warfare**, **Living Death**, and so on and on and let's not forget the promo-tour of the one and only Black Metal legend **Venom**, it was in 1985 and it was fun to talk with the devilish venomous guys. they were on promo-tour for their brandnew 12'inch"Acid Queen/Die Hard" in Eindhoven. They did a radiointerview here, where they later ruined the whole place. Just Cronos and Abaddon came to Holland. It was said that Mantas had some problems with drugs back then... I was there in the club (**Warlock** played at that day) and Cronos and Abaddon put their signature onto my "Acid Queen" 12'inch, I'm very proud of it ... it became a collectors item! **Venom** made two promotours that hit the DYNAMO Club, but they never actually

played here. On the second promotour all three members of **Venom** came to the Club. These Englishmen had very old 70's styled clothes on back then which looked really strange.

Not only nowadays but also in the 80s were too many bands and too many releases, but there was one damned good thing and way back then there were no CDs available, so everything was on VINYL only! And look at some classical covers like Possessed, Slayer, Venom, Celtic Frost, Tyrant, Infernäl Mäjesty, Kreator, Destruction and more... this cult demands to be released on vinyl!

Well, in 1986 the DYNAMO Club celebrated its 5th anniversary and some time before, two guys, who worked and hung around a lot at the Club, came up with the idea to organize a small festival just on the anniversary of DYNAMO, and they simply called it "DYNAMO Open Air" and so this festival stuff all began...

DYNAMO OPEN AIR, Eindhoven, 7th September 1986

Finally the important day has arrived! After the necessary preparations it all turned into reality and all the staff volunteers, including myself, were curious of all that should happen and the first disapointment was already there...the weather! It was awful, just raining and raining, and it looked as if it never stopped, but what the hell... True Metal maniacs weren't afraid of some rain, ...Beer is also wet, you know!

The entrance was for <u>free</u> and the whole festival took place behind the DYNAMO Club on the parkingplace, and there were of course different food- and beerstands, and the drinks were payable, so no non-sense ridiculous prices back then... and the organization was perfect! And there were six good, or just fine Metalbands who gave act of prescense and played like never before.

I didn't count the crowd, but there must have been about 4.500 Metal maniacs on that day, so that was just fuckin' great... and not only fans from Holland, but also from Belgium, Germany (Guten Tag! Schmeckt das Bier?), England and France and probably other European countries came. I didn't see much of the bands playing, because I was at work behind one of the Beerstands, but my ears heard a lot of quality Metal from the bands.

The first one who started was the English Satan, well known by the DYNAMO fans, and beside their regular album stuff, they also played three new songs ("Key to Oblivion", "The Ice Man, "Hear Evil, See Evil; Speak Evil"), and it was fuckin good, just as we expected. The next band was Avalon, a Dutch band, who played more melodical Metal and it was good to see that most of the fans didn't like it, we wanted to THRASH!!! So perhaps the guys of English Onslaught could help us out, their albums "Power From Hell" and "The Force" are classics! And with songs like "Let There Be Death", Metal Forces" and "Fight With The Beast" a lot of necks were at work until the band got off the stage.

Next was Angel Witch and to be honest I have nothing from them (I just didn't like it, but the show was good, at least what I saw between my barduty, so it was ok)... The battle continued with Battlezone with the famous Ex- Iron Maiden frontman Paul DiAnno and even if he was a fat guy now, the band gave a fine show with some killer songs like "Running Blind", "Warchild", "Fighting Back" and "The Land of God Gave to Gain". There was no song from Iron Maiden played, so everybody just heard the band's own songs and not some cheap coverversions.

The last band to play was Joshua, but most of the fans were already leaving the festival. I didn't like the band at all anyway...But afterall the festival was a big success and there weren't any serious riots, and this shows that real Metal maniacs don't have to fight to have a good time, music is what's important!



DYNAMO OPEN AIR, Eindhoven 8th June 1987

For the second time the DYNAMO organization came up with some bands to continue the last year's success... and it was again raining on this day. Again I was working behind one of the many beerstands, so I didn't see the whole programm and like the past year some band's didn't show up, so others came to replace them, and still the entrance was free, ...including the massive rain, and it took place at the same location as last year!

The organization thought that anno 1987 that the number of metallized fans was about 15.000 -17.000 (!) strong!

The line-up back then was German Mad Max (opener), Atomkraft from England (which only entered the stage because their manager promised to bring a complete videocrew with them for a possible Sky Channel "Monsters of Rock" -show broadcasting, but that did not happen, and Atomkraft played an extremely boring gig), Dutch Vengeance, Destruction (one of the best thrashers in Germany, and from the very brginning till the end it was like banging till you had no neck to bang with ... thrashing lunatic mayhem with the Germans !), Testament and finally Stryper (they had to perform in front of thousands of non-christian maniacs, I think less than 10% of them go to Church, and the response was like throwing tomatoes, holding banners like "To Hell with Stryper" and "Thank God there's Heineken", etc. The worst think is that those posers looked like girls! Who needed them?)

At the end of the day we (160 volunteers) could all look back at another successfull festival.

DYNAMO OPEN AIR, Eindhoven 23th May 1988

For the third time DYNAMO oragnized another open-air festival, and unlike the last two festivals, this time the weather was hot as Metal. Not only the capacity was bigger, but also the whole organization was more professional, the beer- and foodstands were led by a smart catering-company, these non-meatllic bastards smell the money! And there was a little entrance to be paid this time for every fan (1 Dutch guilder, a bit more than 1/2 dollar) and with this third festival the real DOWNFALL has begun, Metal was no more number one for the organization, hell no! Money that was it !!! Pathetic losers, fuck them, in this society it's not important anymore to have a honest opinion and choice of music, etc.. No, for those people Metal meant making big bucks, but Metal can't be bought !!! Real Metal will stand the test of time!

On this festival I worked again as a volunteer doing the barduty, but for me it was the last time that I worked there, since 1988 I hated the festival until now and later I only visited the festival in 1991 to see one of the few true Metal bands around (on that loser and fake shithole festival) namely Morbid Angel Back to 1988, there were more fans than before, I guess between 17.000-18.000 people, and six bands were contracted to play that day

Opener was Paradox, which were just "nice" but nothing special, followed by English Sabbat who just had released their debut LP "History of a time to come". They were ten times better on stage than on the record...killer ! Next were Toxic (US), Candlemass (Sweden), Laaz Röckit and finally the famous Exodus which ended the festival with a

In 1988 Kreator recorded their Live-Side of their "Out of the Dark. Into The Light" MLP in the Dynamo Club, ... you can read it on the backcover of this MLP. This was probably one of the last good recordings from the DYNAMO ground. I think that the best years were 84/85 and probably 1986. After that it all got more commercial, the hard times with studs, leather seemed to be over, people started to get into different, not so violent and dark bands like Helloween, Anthrax, etc.

Well, nowadays I don't have contacts to any of the old wild fans of the early DYNAMO days anymore, most of them are married now and/ or have lost the interest in Heavy Metal. don't see them on concerts anymore or meet them in the Club to drink a Beer. I'm one of the last remaining old headbangers from Eindhoven,,,



When people talk about old German Thrash Metal bands, they talk about KREATOR, DESTRUCTION, SODOM, and probably LIVING DEATH, DEATHROW as well. But they should not forget to mention NECRONOMICON as well, because they were one of the first German bands to release an album that contained nothing but wicked and dirty Thrash. Their first two LPs ("Necronomicon", "Apocalyptic Nightmare") did not sound very professional (bad production, technical problems), but especially this made their music sound so raw and underground, and those records have reached certain cult status for die-hard thrashers, and are definitely very hard to find nowadays. The other CDs by the band are not so "exciting", but are still listenable. To give this old band more attention and respect, you'll find an interview with Axel

How came the idea to form a band like NECRONOMICON? Please tell us about the early days of your existence!

Freddy, Lala and me found a Punkband in 1983. The name was Total Rejection. The lyrics were in German and the band was more fun orientated. We drank a lot and had a good time. In 1984 we recorded our first demotape and Jogi joined us. This was when we started to listen to the more Heavy stuff inspired by bands like Motörhead and Slayer. In that year I read a book called "Necronomicon". So we decided to change the name.

Your first albums got very bad press especially here in Germany (remember the METAL HAMMER reviews !), and you never got the attention as (almost) all of the other German (Thrash-) bands... what went wrong? Was it really because of your music or wasn't GAMA able to promote you the way you needed it? How many copies did you sell of the first two LPs (as far as you know)?

'Yes, that's true! The comments in some of the major mags was totally fucked. We recorded the first album in two days, the sound was pretty bad. The company did nothing to promote us, but in the fanzines and in some underground mags we got much better reviews. Another thing is that a lot of record companies had very good connections to the major mags, but not GAMA. Most of their bands were torn in the

press. We sold about 10.000 copies of our first two LPs.'
"Screams", your new album suprised a lot of people as they didn't think that you were still alive... but most of the old Metalmaniacs surely haven't heard it (yet). So what should we expect when laying our hands on your newest product, especially when you compare it with your old LPs (for which you are famous)?

'The new album is still thrashy, but there's also a ballad on it. There is much more double bassdrum than on any of the old albums. The music is straighter than on the last two albums, in that term Necronomicon goes back to the roots. We also used different sounds for different songs, so it's more vivid than the old ones."

Now, most dark death/black metal bands dress themselves like all the wicked 80s bands did (with spikes, nails, bullet-belts, etc.)... what do you think of sticking to this old metal tradition? Do you still use your old clothes and spikes when playing live or don't you like it anymore and think it's ridiculous?

'It's very got on stage, so we gave up being "overdressed". Perhaps next year we are going to play naked; &%! (Hopefully not! The only band I would like to see naked is Warlock, hehe!-ed.) Rockmusic was and still is 50% show and having the same show in the same outfit for years gets boring. I think that is a reason why a lot of bands change their clothing on stage. But to be dressed with spikes and leather is definitely not ridiculous!

Critics often said that you sound like DESTRUCTION (and I think so, too !)... so have you ever talked about those things with Schmier & Co.? They lived in your neighbourhood, didn't they?

We hear this very often. Destruction and Hellhammer are good friends of us. We started making music before Destruction started, but we listened to the same sound, we have a background that could be compared with that of Destruction, and we grew up in the same area (me, Mike, Tommy and Lala in the same town). But Necronomicon has more punk roots than Destruction have and I think you can hear

Is there still any unreleased or unused songmaterial existing from your early days? Do you think that thrash in the old vein is still music that sells nowadays? How do younger metal fans react to your old stuff (when you play it live)?

Yes, we have some very old songmaterial, and we think about re-recording it. The sound from the late 70s and early 80s is coming back. When we play live we have old and new songs 50/ 50. The audience is 50% old fans and 50% new fans, so there is something for both to party. But most of the visitors enjoy the whole concert, I hope! Alright, that's it for today! Do you have any final messages for the readers (I'm sure that there are some of your old fans among them)?

The old fans are really important for a band, they are the base to go forward. We never had so much of them in Germany, much more in East Europe, but the German fans always stood and still stand behind us. Our record companies always have (had) problems with their record services, but I hope this will change in future.

If this old band plays a gig in your area, why not checking it out? Perhaps we will hear more from NECRONOMICON in future, in case they re-record some of their old unreleased songs (hope that they won't ruin the old versions with the new





Reviews about zines/ mags that are inclosed in the metallic underground...

Descent #3

Noble, full-coloured cover, I'm impressed! The whole magazine's layout is very good and professional, Stephen seems to be a master behind the computer. Optically it's one of the best mags I've seen so far. Well, let's see what the contense is.... The choice of metallic bands is not very original, because names like Satyricon, Cradle of Filth, Emperor, Gehenna, Dissection, Monumentum, Ved Buens Ende can be found in many other zines as well, Evoken is probably the only exception. But the interviews are in depth, especially the Emperor interview. Beside those metallic bands you'll also find interviews with acts that have nothing to do with Metal, such as Blood Axis, Brighter Death Now, Death In June, Allereseelen and such kind of (at parts fascistic) bands. Just the reviews are not too informative, but this is because there are too many CDs, etc. reviewed here. 80 pages (minus 14 fullpage ads and a lot of big sized logos and photos) make this mag quite heavy. It's available for \$6 (or \$8 if you want Stephen to send it via air mail). Let's see what DECENT issue four will bring, ... I have the feeling that will sooner or later break the chain to Metal in near future.

Peru is really not a classical Metal country, but there's a hell of a band emerging from called MORTEM. These guys are around since 1986 (!), but they never got too much attention in the past. After almost a decade of existance these South-American gladiators of dark Death Metal finally released their debutCD ("Demon Tales) on a no name label, and due to its bad promotion, etc., this deathly album got finally re-released (with different cover) on MERCILESS Records. Death Metal at its heaviest is the game MORTEM play... a bit technical, but 100%ly pure in ist style! Fernan, the guy on the photo, was the one to attack with my questions...

Why did it take such long time for an old band like you are to get your debutalbum released on an international basis? Was there a lack of offers from labels or didn't you feel like recording an album some years ago? Today it's quite normal that every foolish band releases their CD after some months of existence...

There were many factors! First of all, here in Perú, there are almost no labels interested in Metal and that means from the early eightees to date. On second place, yes, there was a total lack of offers outside my country, because nobody knew anything about the Peruvian Mortem. We started our promotion outside Perú with our third demo "Vomit of the Earth" in 1992, which surely wasn't our best demo, but it got good reactions in the underground (it wasn't big promotion or anything like that). That demo was distributed through OSMOSE (Herve told us he liked it) and HOLY Records I think. Well, to the point, we got a few offers from other labels, but we weren't sure about them, for example, a label from the USA called INFERNAL RODS (!) was interested, but we never ever heard about their releases, and we lost contact with them. We got people from Mexico and Colombia interested, but, you know, many labels from Southamerica prefer to release European or Northamerican bands, they don't support their own bands, that's another factor (and what about COGUMELO! -ed.).

About the re-release of "Demon Tales" on MERCILESS, you're right, the Peruvian label released a very poor edition, with a lot of mistakes we couldn't control. Volker from MERCILESS offered us a fair proposal, so we decided to work with him, he's been in the scene for many years now, so I think that today, that's about the only people you can trust, the ones have been in the true scene without wimping out or getting commercial like so many today.'

It seems as if the second wave of Black Metal didn't have any affect on MORTEM's music as your style is nothing but old-fashioned satanic Death Metal the way it was meant to be. Is Death Metal your ultimate destiny? Your songwriting hasn't changed that much during your 10 (!) years of

When we were formed back in 1986, we used to call our music "Black Metal", because this term described the "black" lyrics, but we couldn't call it like that nowadays, because everybody would expect corpsepaint and depressive music, etc. I don't believe too much in labels for music. Aside from that, the bands that nowadays call themselves "Black Metal" are Bathory inspired ones, and Mortem never considered them (or him) as an influence: We would rather listen to Mercyful Fate or early Destruction. If by Death Metal you mean the music we play nowadays and in the past, yes, we will never change the style into something that isn't Metal. We'll keep on playing this same music style or die. Our

songwriting has changed in some ways, we play more technical now, without becoming flawless, jazzy robots (we have mistakes), but the spirit of the music and the lyrics remain the same. Never expect violins, keyboards or female voices from us, just guitars, bass and drums as true Metal was meant to be.'

How would you define Death Metal... and which are the deathliest Metal albums in your opinion?

When the terms Death Metal or Black Metal came out, they intended to describe the most brutal and shocking Metal style of its time, with faster music, more disgusting vocals and more blaspheming lyrics.

For us, Death Metal is muiscally aggressive, fast, slow, heavy, shocking music, disgusting, not for a party or dancing. About the lyrics, Death Metal or, maybe more appropriate, Black Metal is related to cemetaries, the dead, Satan and all the obscure things in life and death.

Yeah, very old, but certainly very great stuff! Talking about "old" times: What kind of memories and feelings do you have when you think of MORTEM's beginning in 1986? What was the main reason to found the band back then? What were you musical influences in the beginning?! suppose that POSSESSED's "Seven Churches" is one of your influencial!

Well, I used to be a Heavy Metal fan together with my brother Akare Amduscias, Iron Maiden being our favourite band (I still love everything from Iron Maiden before "Somewhere in Time"), when I started to listen to band that we simply used to call "Black Metal": Slayer, Celtic Frost, Destruction. Mereyful Fate, Venom, etc. One thing I remember is that I never hird Metallica or Megadeth and we always considered them as garbage (we never a wrong, because they are still garbage, hahaha).

This may sound strange to some, but this music was heard by a very few. Only very few people got contacts outside Perú. I remember Thanatos' bassist Stribus Gedeby was one of the first contacts for Peruvians. He sent democrapes from band and many other interesting bands from all the world through tape unding Thanatos, Messiah, Black Sheperd, Casbah, Mephisto, Deceased.etc. Absome newer bands with LPs were heard like Possessed, Sacrifice, Dark Aged etc. When me and my bloodbrother Alvaro Amduscias decided to form a flat

Metal band, we started to "write" some songs inspired by the bands mentioned above. Slayer was one of our fave bands and we also used to play covers from the only songs that my skill on the guitar would let me play like Celtic Frost's "Dethroned Emperor" or Sodom's "Deathlike Silence".

Yes, we also had problems in finding people who join our band (we still have!). When we first started, almost all the few Peruvian metallers were totally into Heavy Metal and considered Black Metal as pure "satanic noise". Then people thought that this music was made by non-musicians which didn't know how to play any instrument (perhaps it was like that, haha). Today, we have problems in finding members with developed skills that still believe in brutal music (most of them use to wimp out)."

Bands from South-America have more difficulties in getting their names established on the international market than North-American or European bands, I guess you agree! What can you tell us about both old and new Black/Death Metal bands from your continent (except for Brazilian bands)? I only know that there was a cool band in Chile called PENTAGRAM, but that's all (Why have they splitted by the way? I thought they wanted to record an album?!)! Are/were there more great bands around that real Black/Death Metalheads should better check out?

'I may not have an objective view of this. I haven't listened too many new Southamerican bands. Pentagram from Chile is long dead, yes, I really liked this band. The founder member now plays in another band, another music style.'

Do you have a big scene in your country? How many people usually come to see a good concert? Are foreign bands touring through Peru or are just local bands responsible for driving the fans wild?

'Our scene isn't big. It's full of posers. About 200 people currently go to the concerts. In the past there were about 800 people going to the shows. Well, only 3 or 4 bands from Southamerica and 2 from the USA have come here. No foreign bands include Perú in their tours.'

Must be very depressing for you! What are you expecting to happen now as "Demon Tales" got re-released through MERCILESS Records? Isn't an international tour one of the dreams that aren't fulfilled yet for you?

Well, the deal is for 2 albums, so we have some new songs now with the following tentative titles: "Harlots of Hell", "Howling Death", "Shadows that pray to Assura" and some more. We will once again re-record a couple of old songs, and we had in mind covering "Black Funeral" from Mercyful Fate, but a band already did that. Shit! There are no plans for an international town and we have no fave bands at the moment. I'd to travel to the past to play with Possessed, hahaha!"

How many copies have you sold of the first edition of "Demon Tales"?

I really don't know, because I'm not in contact with Ivan from the Peruvian label. He hasn't informed me about this. All I know is he has made some trades with other labels.'

Your vocals sound really "deathly" (are you a brother of Jeff Becerra or Evil Chuck?). Do you have a special training for your voice, and don't you have any problems with it through the years?

No, I don't have any special training. I'm not the original vocalist of Mortem, my bloodbrother was! But he also plays drums so... he had big problems. To be honest I don't like my vocals too much, but if you compare them to such good singers of the past, then that's great, but I don't intend to ripp anyone off, I'd like to think those are my influences!!!'

How many hours do you invest for doing the band's mail a week?

I think it must be about 10 hours a week libelieve, I'm not making too much mail right now, but I take my time in writing new songs and rehearsing them. Yes, we have invested money and overall TIME in our band, but I think it's been worth it. I began playing with handmade electric guitars, my current guitar is not the best either, but it works.

VARATHRON's music has never disappointed me so far, and after listening to their newest but still not very famous album "Walpurgisnacht", I had no doubts that VARATHRON is not just a band that walks in the shadow of ROTTING CHRIST. Their dark guitarorienated meldical but still heavy Greek Metal music deserves more attention, so here's a short interview with the deep voice of the band, which comes from the throat of Stephen (or better known as "Necroabyssious").

If you compare "Walpurgisnacht" with the old stuff you did, which are the main differences or things that have changed?

Well, I think "Walpurgisnacht is an album with a lot of atmosphere and heavy riffs, some melodical, some brutal ones. On that LP, for the first time, we have an instrumental song, a little psalm to darkness!!! I think our "Walpurgisnacht" LP has a lot of good guitarwork, a better production when it comes to the instruments, and all the ideas are greater than on our old stuff. I like all our releases, but I try to create even better music than in the past.'

VARATHRON seems to have constant line-up problems... Why did people like Jim Mutilator or Necroslaughter leave the band? Are you a difficult person to work with ?!?

'Hey!!! Absolutely not! If you want, ask my brothers Jim "Emperor Vorskaath" (Necroslaughter) and Jim Mutilator! First, some changes in our line-up came because of our fuckin' obligatory army service! The two old guitarists left the band after the army. About "Necroslaughter" and his brother, they both now live in Australia now. So he left the band for personal and natural reasons. I don't believe that our band can exists when the lead-guitarist lives in Australia. About Jim Mutilator: He left the band, because he has a family with children, a record store and Rotting Christ, so he doesn't have any time for Varathron to rehearse, write songs, etc. Now we are 4 members-strong and powerful!!!'

Who is Wolfen (drums)? I've never seen any photo of him...
'Well, his real name is Spyros. He's our crazy drumming maniac. So, the most time he lives in an underhouse and he hates photos. You'll see him on the newest

Some bands weren't/aren't satisfied with the work of UNISOUND Records, saying they don't work professional when it comes to promotion/distribution, etc. Are you happy with their job for VARATHRON? Why didn't you stay at BLACK POWER or MOLON LAVE?

Tagree with the other people/bands! UNISOUND Rec. make good work when it comes to layout, design, some flyers, BUT no good distribution and no promotion. I receive letters from people who ask me if we have a new album out, and I freak out! I don't understand why Panos, UNISOUND's chief, put an advert in a magazine in July 1996 for our LP "Walpurgisnacht", but didn't do it again when our LP finally got released in September ????!?

About BLACK POWER Records: This label was lead by a small boy who had a lot of money, and he listened to Varathron and simply released our Split LP with Necromantia. Nothing else! No label, no company, nothing! Also, we never signed on MOLON LAVE Records!!! They just released our first album ("his Majesty at the Swamp") on vinyl after CYBER MUSIC, who released the CD version, gave them the "OK". Nothing else! When they decided to press the LPs, they decided to use a different coverartwork.'

Who was responsible for the SLAYER -like songwriting on the "Everlasting Sins" SplitLP with NECROMANTIA? Who took care of the songwriting on the other LPs?

'Our "old" guitarist Stavros has written that song "La Reine Noir" which has a Slayer-like riff. I like that song and I think it's a great one. I don't know why this has created some negative opinions in some people's mind. Our songs are written by our guitarist Pyphoros and the rest of the band. We work like a band and we never stopped and destroyed this situation.'

You seem to have a special relationship with "Morbid" ... is this because of the music only or is it personal friendship?

"Well, Morbid ("Magus Wampyr Daoloth") is a bloodbrother of me. We have a personal friendship and we helped eachother in our world of music. He's a guy who gives the best of himself for you. He makes very good work on our LPs! Hail brother!!!

VARATHRON played one (?) gig in Germany some years ago if I have to believe an old flyer, but never again. Why? Aren't there any requests or is it because of the changing line-ups?

'Yes, we played some gigs before, but during the last years the basic reason for not playing live was the military service and the line-up problems. Now we prepare for our barbaric invasion!

So you readers, listen to our unholy psalms and prepare for the final battle !!!!'

People that demand more than just high noisy guitars, a shricky voice and a shitty production when it comes to Black/Death Metal, should better try to invest their cash into the music of VARATHRON, because here's where you find quality instead of quantity!!!
