

"Life Boes On, Even After Death"

Let's start the news off with an item that will no doubt freak many of you out, shall we? Possessed has reformed! There is only one original member in this incarnation, Mike Torraro, but they have a full line up already and are going to record a demo of new songs soon. Look for a demo review in the next RH. On another note, former Possessed bassist/ vocalist Jeff Becerra was shot in a hold up attempt and was paralyzed from the neck down. Earache Records and Combat have signed a deal to release Earache stuff in the US and they might even do a Grindcrusher tour in the US. Obituary was on tour in Europe after playing a bunch of dates in the US and their new album is out. Buy it! The new Slaver should be out soon, it will be called "Seasons In The Abyss" and will have songs like "War Ensemble", "Dead Skin Mask", "Born Of Fire" and "Blood Red". New York thrash band Demolition Hammer has been signed to Century Media and have recorded their debut LP, due out soon. The songs will include "Crippling Velocity", "44 Calibre Brain Surgery", "Parasital Epitaph", "Neanderthal", "Infectious Hospital Waste", "Hydrophobia", "Mercenary Aggression" and "Jellied Remains".

Massacre has reformed, and will include Kam Lee and Rick Rozz along with Butch Gonzales (of the Genitorturers) and Joey Cangelosi. They've been signed to Earache Records and their debut will be titled "Second Coming". Sadus and Malevolent Creation have been signed to Roadracer. MC is working on songs for the album, while the Sadus is out now. Nocturnus has completed their debut album for Earache Records, called "The Key" and it will be released in Europe on October 1st. The album will include the songs "Lake Of Fire", "Standing In Blood", "Neolithic", "Undead Journey", "Before Christ, After Death", "Droid Sector", "Andromeda Strain", "Destroying The Manger" and "Empire Of The Sands". See the review in the album section. Incubus has recorded their second LP and it will be released on Nuclear Blast Records in October. I've heard some of the new stuff and it's mush faster and heavier than the old songs, even the vocals are better. Deicide has been forced to move back to Clearwater. The big winner at the First Annual Tampa Bay Metal Awards was the band Fester, who won the awards for best local unsigned band, best local vocalist (John O'Brien), best local guitarist




(John Mahoney), best local bassist (Scott Carino) and best local drummer (Curtis Beeson). Other winners were: best local album (The Guff "Art Of Deception", which is a total joke because they haven't released an album, just a demo tape-Ed.), best local signed band (Atheist), best local death metal band (Obituary), best local recording studio (Morrisound, of course!), best local record store (Ace's Records), best local nightclub (Volley Club), best national band (Metallica), best national album (Savatage, "Gutter Ballet"), best new local band (Mortuary), and Hall of Fame (The Volley Club, Keith Collins and Ace's Records). Coroner are in the process of writing material for their next album and are scheduled to go into the studio in December of this year. The new Rage album should be finished by now and will be out soon. Kreator has mixed their new LP "Coma Of Souls" and it will have 10 new songs: "Coma Of Souls", "Terror Zone", "People Of The Lie", "Mental Slavery", "Material World Paranoia", "When The Sun Burns Red", "Hidden Dictator", "Agents Of Brutality", "World Beyond" and "Twisted Urges". The release date is October 23rd. Sabbat are looking for a new singer after the departure of Martin Walkyier and after a replacement is found, they will go into the studio to record their third LP. By the way,



their bassist, Frazer Caske, also left. Martin is working on his solo album. Watchtower vocalist Alan Tecchio has left the band. Mordred are starting work on their new album at Fantasy Studios in Berkely, California. Tankard will release a new LP titled "The Meaning Of Life". The Wild Rag has collapsed after 13 issues. It will carry on as a newsletter with news and information about Wild Rags bands. Heathen have been signed to Roadracer Records. So have Hawkwind, whose next album will be "Space Bandits".

RH: What songs are going to be on your side of the upcoming split LP with Exit 13?
Christofer: "Well, it won't be! Project dismissed! Instead our LP will come soon."

RH: Out of the three recordings you've made so far, which do you think shows the band at its best musically?

Christofer: "The third (ULP "Time Shall Tell").

But that was a half a year ago. Now it's our new song which shows our musicallity. You can't compare it with our old songs. This is much more symphonic (and psychodelic sometimes)."

RH: Have you played many shows? How was the reaction (if any)?

Christofer: "We have played 11 gigs and we have been satisfied on most of the reactions from the crowds. The biggest crowd we have had is on almost 300 people, which I think is very good."

RH: Who comes up with the lyrics and what Kind of ideas are the songs about?

Christofer: "I writes all the lyrics and most of them is against drugs, violence, war, nuclear weapons, pollution, cruel tests on animals and against multinational



garbage like McDonalds & Coco Cola company. The lyrics which isn't these things is mostly stories taken from books/ movies or about the mysteries of death."

RH: Which do you think is more important, speed or heaviness?
Christofer: "Nothing of it! Everybody plays how they like. We'd like to be both heavy and fast, which I personally think we have succed quite well with. The most important is to have fun while playing!"

RH: What do you think sets you apart from other death metal bands from Sweden? Christofer: "We're more creative than most of them (well some of the other creative Swedish bands I like is Carbonized Conly the new demol, Tribulation [if you call that death metall and some parts on the Entombed LP as well too) and along with a few other we have an original style. The biggest difference is that we don't drink alcohol (well, our drummer do a bit, but except for that)."

RH: Do you always work on new songs or do you take a break between them?
Christofer: "Mostly I always have an idea for a new song, but lately I have had some problems with writing songs which is better than my last ones. It moves slower nowadays. It's quite heavy to write all songs by yourself as I do."

RH: You're going to record your side of the split in July, any idea when it will be out?

Christofer: "It would have been out in late September I presume, but it'll never come! Maybe we'll do a 7" for that label instead. It will then be a limited edition, so it's just for fun."

RH: How would you say you've progressed from the first demo?
Christofer: "Oh yes! What a question! It's not even the same band anymore.
Then we did play quite simple (to us anyway) and traditional death metal, now we plays complicated avante gardistic death metal!"

RH: Have all the reviews you've gotten in zines been good ones so far?
Christofer: "Yes, as far as I Know! The only negative who has been said ones so it might hurt us is that the vocals on our second demo is one of the worst in the Swedish underground. It probably is, 'coz I was ill in the studio that time."

RH: What will the artwork on the split look like? Christofer: "Would have been the same as we now probably gonna take on our LP. Won't tell you the motive now, 'coz it's possible that we'll change it later on before the LP is ready."

RH: Also, what will the new shirt design be? Christofer: "The same as the old, but in a new version (more brutal)."

RH: What is the biggest problem living in Sweden?
Christofer: "All bloody taxes and all "Kickers"


(a "Kicker" is some Kind of hiphop/ rap asshole which goes out in the nights only to fight and Kick people without reason for fun). That bloody Karate jerks doesn't deserve to live!"


RH: Any more information about the possible record deal you're working on?
Christofer: "You can expect our LP before
Christmas, I promise! We have pretty much material for the next LP too, so that won't take more than possibly a half year."

Here's an interview with a ripping new band from the Chicago area which is formed from two previously well Known bands. They are original and very heavy, and they seem to be getting more and more attention. Please read on for more info. Also see the review "State Of Insanity" demo in the demo section.

RH: How widely has the debut demo been distributed so far and have all the reviews been if any! At the moment no all good? Dave: "We feel we covered interested." a lot of ground with our debut demo and we'll cover more with the 2nd one. Our demo has been all over England, Sweden, Lithuania, W. Germany, just basically almost everywhere internationally and almost every state here but we're just starting to hit Florida!"

RH: Tell us something about the songs that will appear on the second demo. Dave: "The songs will be

in the same style of

course as the first demo. All in the F. Nation vein, musically and lyrically will be out in January 91."

RH: CMFT Records in England is pressing the onto vinyl, but is there any interest in putting out an LP by this label or any other? Dave: "Yes, CMFT would like to sign us to a 2 album deal but this is our 1st demo, we're scared! We just want to put out 1 more demo then see what our options are other label is

RH: Do you think that Funeral Nation is better than the previous bands the members were in? Dave: "Definitely."

RH: How many shows have you played, and which was the best one? Dave: "We've only done nine shows so far, the last time we played here at the Thirsty Whale June 26, but we did a show in Moorsetown, Michigan July 6, that totally Killed that was our best out of state show so far."

RH: Do you think the new material will be so complex that you'll need a second guitarist eventually? Dave: "No, we are not thinking of a second guitarist but who Knows what the future holds!"

RH: About your lyrics, who writes them and will they continue in the same direction on the new songs? Dave: "Mike, our bassist/ vocalist writes all the lyrics. As I mentioned earlier everything on the second demo is about the same musically and lyrically!"

RH: How do you think the Chicago scene is doing right now? Dave: "As far as demo bands go, it's OK. There really isn't too many places to play. Except when big names come through Chicago, you have to fight with the promoter and all the other bands just to get on the bill. And we haven't gotten one yet. Some of the bills are so mis matched!"

RH: Is there a foreign country from which you get tons of mail? Dave: "Germany E+W, England, Sweden, Holland, out of these four I cannot say!"

RH: Are you influenced by Venom in any way? Dave: "Mike was totally into Venom about 6-7 years ago he probably brings a little of that in with him. Mike loves writing about the Black Bible."

RH: Is there enough support from out of state to enable you to play somewhere other than

locally? Dave: "Well, not as a headliner, lots of people Know of us through out the States. There's good support in RI, Mass., Indiana."

RH: Will there be artwork on the next release? Dave: "We're pretty sure that there will be. If we're able to get some kind of a record deal before the release of the second demo. We will probably release another demo and 7 to 8 months after an album. Then we won't put that much into artwork for our second demo. We'll need to save money for an LP."

RH: Is there anything you'd like to fix about the first demo? Dave: "Yeah, I would have wanted the snare drum louder especially in the fast parts it seems to get drowned out a bit. But that's cuz of a

combination of a lot of things, maybe I wasn't hitting the snare hard enough, I will on the next one! And Chaz wanted a few more guitar tracks!"

RH: How does the band figure out what music to use from whom? Dave: "What do you mean, we don't use anyone's music. We don't say let's use a Slayer part or Venom part. We just get together and play. Maybe our songs sound a little Slayerish or Venomish, but that's not planned. why what do you think?"

RH: Any last words for the readers? Dave: "Well, hope you guys Know a little more about us now! Thanks for the interview Bruce maybe someday we can go to Florida and play. Stay hard and stay heavy!"



This is only an advance copy, but I can already tell that this album is going to be the best release so far. 

Well, you may have heard about Massacra's debut LP by now, there's a review of it in the record section. It's a real good record, despite what some French people might think. This interview was done by a friend in Mexico, so please excuse the bad English. (Introby Bruce Davis.)

RH: First off, please tell us some about the response to your last tape "Nearer From Death" around the planet? Pascal: "Nearer From-Death" has gotten the best sold of our tapes, it is fantastic to have sold between 700 and 1000 copies of one demo. I'll say that all the planet has liked this demo and we're very happy. "N.F.D." is sold out now."

RH: I have the three demos of the band and I think that you had a big progress, maybe more technical sound, what do you tell about the sound in this three tapes? Tell us about the progress!

Pascal: "I find that the sound of this third tape is not very good. I prefer totally the sound

of the "Final Holocaust" demo, it was more violent and powerful, stronger especially for the drums. The sound of "N.F.D." is not the same but good too. Of course that we've progressed, why will epist we again? We try to play more death metal with doom parts and it's genius; we hope always progress to play always differently and not the same thing. Massacra titles of 1986 and Massacra titles of 1990 are very different and we're happy to have changed."

you write in the same line since your first tape? Pascal: "No! Our lyrics in the first demo tape was enough ridiculous. Now it's Chris (drummer)

RH: About the lyrics, do

Now it's Chris (drummer) who writes them and he try to write interesting things on great subject like war, apocalypse, horrible and horrified thing of the life."

RH: I personally think that your last tape is really a professional work, all was excellent, like cover, mix and sound. Are you satisfied with this tape?

Pascal: "Yes! "Nearer From Death" is for me the best result that we could record on tape."

RH: How do you describe the present sound of Massacra? Pascal: "It's really hard because we think that we can again changed this sound before one or two years. Actually I want not describe our actual sound because we look always for new technics."

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RH: Can you tell us about the tracks, studio work and all about your debut LP. Is out now? (Of course man ! -MG) Pascal: "This first LP will be out in the end of February 1990 (long time ago-MG) and it calls "Final Holocaust". It'll be composed of eight titles (10 on CD) like "Nearer From Death", "Final Holocaust", "Eternal Hate", "Researches of Tortures", "Sentenced For Life". It'll be out on Shark Records and was recorded to the Rash studio to Bochum (Essen, W. Germany) on 24 tracks. We've had some problems with the studio and we're not so happy of sound that we've gotten. It's not bad but it's not what we wanted really, we will do better for the second LP."

RH: Tell us if you are satisfied with Shark US Records.

Pascal: "Shark US Metal Records is a goodd label in Europe and has a good distribution everywhere

distribution everywhere in Europe. It is a professional label that has put always in Europe the first LP's of Post Mortem, Wehermacht, Sepultura... we're happy

RH: About Massacra's tour in Canada last year, tell us about the response of the people, bands... are you in contact with any Canadian bands? Pascal: "We were in contact with some bands but not now. The Canadian people was good but we were not too Known. It was a good moment of course. We've reh Snake of Voivod (good guy) but too DBC and never we'll forget."

RH: Do you have any plans for other gigs in Canada and other places after your debut LP?

Pascal: "Not with Canada.

We've some plans of gigs but nothing sure like in Sueden, Norway, Austria.

Actually we wait the out of the LP and we will try to contact organizers for

a European tour in support act."

RH: I Know you played a big gig in Paris on 30/9/89 with Tankard and my gods of Immolation, can you tell us some about this gig, do you like Immolation?

Pascal: "The public of this gig was really fantastic and Immolation is really genius. It was a total slam and stage diving show!"

RH: Which are your actual fave death metal bands? Pascal: "We like to much Sepultura (I say death metal!-MG), Death, Dark Angel, Morbid Angel (goddogs!-MG), Obituary, Pestilence (Holland masters-MG), but too Nocturnus (Hi Mike-MG), Carcass, Terrorizer, Atrocity (WG), Mayhem..." RH How do you see the actual world scene? Pascal: "I find that the world scene is composed new poser bands, rock starts. The death metal scene again unknown for many people. I'd like that our music is Known everywhere and Massacra

gets a great popularity. We want not be rockstars but only musicians who can live off their music. Actually the best scenes for the death metal are Sweden, UK, USA, but some other countries begin to be good like Switzerland, Holland and it's really great. I hope that France will have a best scene too."

RH Personally I hate zines, record companies like Wild Rags, Morbid Mag, Combat and tons more who sucks a lot of money of guys, bands ... what do you think about them? Pascal: "Wild Rag is a pure RIP OFF (His opinion only-Ed.), Richard C. must us money (Richard you must die! I promise you that I will fuck your mom!-MG). This guy is for me a big star, he wants sign all the bands to win before all money. I can say you that he wanted sign Massacra but we've refused because he proposed us nothing good. We must all paid and it's him who will win tons of money. Some people have said the same thing about Ronny Eide but I don't

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Know. Actually one of the underground labels, the more serious is Deathlike Silence Productions from Norway. It's a Mayhem label and I can say you that for him, the only thing important it's to do Know the bands that he has signed is GOD. About Combat, I can't say you something's about them 'cause I Know Eric Meyer of Dark Angel (Well, good for you!-Ed.) who has said me that's label was very good and signed not too bands 'cause they have enough job like that." (Dark Angel is not underground band, I think-MG).

RH I really don't Know much about the French scene, can you tell us some things about that? Pascal: "The French scene is very poor. The bands are not serious and are unknown out of France. France sucks but we hope that it'll revived in some time."

RH What about your plans after you release your LP?

Pascal: "We hope to play too many gigs everywhere and compose new titles for the second LP."

RH Are there many places to play in France? Pascal: "Not too much, if you wait a good local with a good public, you must go to Paris but all is expensive and the national press sucks for the promotion. If you want play gigs in France, you must be the slaves of the national press and we hate this opinion."

RH How is the actual songwriting done? Pascal: "Actually we'll compose a new style of Massacra songs more death metal (Godly!-MG) than style to copy not other bands."

RH How do you feel about stagediving? Pascal: "Stagediving is very important 'cause without it, there is not good gig and not good atmosphere, yes to the stagediving." (I love it-MG).

how do you see all these you like HC? Satanic bands, do you like them? Pascal: "Yes, but not any us to practice slam and bands. I like Satanic stagediving, but they lyrics when the music is come I think at all gigs! fantastic doom or pure death metal and with lyrics very interesting RH Well, that's all, do written by people who is fan of Satanism and occultism and who Knows Pascal: very well the subject. I like Keyboard parts, it's Watchout our first LP and great!" (Satan rules-MG.)

RH I'm sure that you Know all these godly new stuff on Carcass, Morbid Angel, Napalm Death, Filthy Christians ... all on Earache, what do you think about their LP's? Pascal: "Yes, I like too much Carcass, Morbid Angel, Bolt Thrower (Hell yezzzz!-Ed.) but the first of all is Carcass (Definitely gods !-MG), they are fabulous and their second LP is the most morbid vinyl of century (Of course-MG). I hate Napalm Death (Me too-MG) it's too noisy for me (I hate them for other questions-MG). Filthy Christians had out one good demo but I've listened some weeks ago a split 7" EP with G-anx and it sucks with a hardcore voice without much interest. Morbid Angel is a good band but

Anyway Sadistic Intent came on first with their basic Death/Thrash Metal that everybody has been listening to for years... For their first appearance in the southern state they got a pretty bad response from the audience (by the way only 50 people showed up). Next was DAMNATION, local band with their John Tardy lookalike singer (or at least trying to imitate him). They played 45° of boring Thrash/Handcore, pretty noisy in fact. You know as I'm (Chris) a French guy I had to honour my reputation and so I went, at the end of their gig, outside just to talk to some nice looking girls... so I missed nearly the whole damn show of MALEVOLENT CREATION, Well, stop kidding here, everybody knows I'm not that kind of stupid brainless Thrasher (you know, like the ones I'm continuously criticizing in this Mag). This will be the second, yes, second interview I've done with Eviction. The first one was in an old issue of RH and was done before the second demo, much less before their CD/ cassette came out. There are no actual records of the album, but I still think it's something to check out. Here's the second interview with Rob Tabachka, guitarist.

EVICTION c/o Rob 12 Victory Lane Leetsdale, PA. 15056 USA

RH: So, how does it feel to be signed to Metal Blade Records? Rob: "It feels great, we're all happy about it."

RH: Are there any touring plans in the works, possibly with other bands on the same label? Rob: "Right now we're working on a mini tour for October opening up for Intruder and . Slaughterhouse. Hopefully we'll make make it to the West coast then up to Chicago, Cleveland, Philly then to New Jersey then make it to the big CMJ convention in New York."

RH: How did Metal Blade

hear your tape and how quickly did they respond? Rob: "We sent them our "Who Will Win?" demo, they liked it and asked us if we wanted to be on their comp. album titled "Complete Death Vol. 3". We said sure (that comp. never did come out) than six months later they called and wanted us for a full release. We said sure and signed the contract."

RH: What do you think of Metal Blade's decision not to produce vinyl anymore? Think it'll affect your sales? Rob: "I think this was a bad move cause a lot of kids still have a record player, I even collect albums over CD's or cassettes and today's pre-recorded cassettes sound shitty and at the moment CD's sound great. but it's too expensive. And in record stores albums stick out on the racks better so you can think this helps in sales. At least the record company should press a few up but make them limited edition on vinyl."

RH: What is it with the Mickey Mouse head in the cover art? Rob: "What mouse? He's just our mascot."

RH: What are the new songs and the old songs on the album? Rob: "We've written seven new songs for the CD and cassette, here's some titles: "Our World", "Behind The Mask", "Listen", "Drunken State" and "You Decide". We used the song "American Way" from our first demo ("Struggle With Society") and "Living In Emptiness" and "Struggle With Society" from our second demo ("Who Will Win?")."

RH: What new underground releases are you really into? Rob: "Solitude from Delaware, anything by them, they kill and should be signed. Atrocity from New York has a killer new demo. I listen to Messiah from North Carolina, they're cool."

RH: Think the first interview in Ripping Headaches really helped the band? see the product easier, | Rob: "Well, the zine is think this helps in great and I did get some response from your area, so that's good. But I'm sure once people read this interview they'll see that we have an official world wide release and they might take us much seriously. Without underground zines we wouldn't have gotten noticed. If your local record store doesn't stock our product, tell

them they can get it through Caroline record distributors."

RH: Has the band started on any new songs yet?
Rob: "As a matter of fact we did and they're ripping, one is called "Blind Faith" and another one is called "Fighting To Live", it's definitely Eviction style, no wimping out here."

RH: Just what are you trying to say with your music anyway?

Rob: "Well we're not preachers, we're into real topics, the things we see around us in our everyday lives like money problems, possibilities of war, drug and alcohol problems, etc. I guess you can call it street talk, it's real."

RH: Any new shirt designs on the way?
Rob: "Oh yes, we have new moshkateer shirts and hats, shirts cost 10 bucks and hats cost 6 bucks, they look really cool."

RH: Was the Metal Blade deal the best out of all you were offered?
Rob: "Yes it was, so that's why we made the decision to sign with them."

RH: Will you continue to write to zines after you get a second album released?

Rob: "Of course, I live for this kind of thing and it will definitely help out in getting kids into our music."

RH: What's something you'd like the band to be remembered for?

Rob: "Writing good music and being honest."

RH: Last words please?
Rob: "Support the underground and please check out our new release, I think you'll enjoy it."



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Ever wonder what happened to doomsters Bream Beath? After releasing a great album, they seemed to disappear. I heard that they recorded a new demo, then they broke up, but when I got the new demo from Penance, the above rumors were confirmed. Penance continues in the tradition of Bream Beath and do a great job of it. Here's Mike Smail (drums) to fill us in on the band. They're back from the dead!

RH: What finally led to the demise of Dream Death?

Mike: "Well, things had kind of been falling apart for a while but no one really wanted to admit it I think. Brian, vocals and guitar, just didn't feel the same about things anymore and we both decided to finally call it quits. Both Terry and I knew we still wanted to play so we formed Penance with Rich, DD's last bass player. Getting royally screwed by New Ren, didn't help matters either!"

RH: How different do you think Penance is from Deam Death?

Mike: "Basically the same, but nobody knows it. I'll explain by saying that as Dream Beath we never really got known for who we were. People think of the album naturally, but that's kind of misleading. A lot of that stuff was written around '83 and the early eighties, so it was basically a comp. album of our old stuff. By the time people heard that, we had several new songs which was going to be the second album which no one ever really heard except for live shows. We never really had a chance to release something that represented DD at a present time. We did a three song demo after the album and before the break up that was the real_00. The songs were: "The Unseen", "Born To Suffer" and "A Wayfarer's Tale" all of which we kept and still play. So people may think it's a big change, but it's really not."

RH Are you any closer to finding a pernament cocalist, and what kind of cocalist are you looking for?

<u>Mike:</u> "Yes. We have a permanent, vocalist (I think), but I'm not at liberty to say just yet."

RH: I naticed that the lyrics of Penance seem to be more influenced by reality instead of kinking, who writes them? Mike: "I write all the lyrics except for some of the BD stuff that both Brian and I or just he wrote. We do write reality based lyrics dealing with how we feel about something or whatever is bothering us, but I still write some fantasy lyrics as well. We have a new three part song that is a big fantasy story called "Shadowed Images"."

AH Will you be looking to get signed right away or will you spend more time promoting the demo first?

Mike; "If we got a good deal, naturally we'd take it, but we're content with things as they are. I'm not that concerned with getting signed. I want to do some stuff on our own first. He still have a bad taste of record labels."

RH. The band is a three piece, are there plans to expand the line up if necessary?

Mike; "Yes, sooner or later we'd like to get another guitar, especially for live situations. If we don't, that's OK too because I'm content with things as they are."

RH Penance is derivitely a doom metal band, but are there any directions other than doom goo'd like to take the band?" Mike: "I really don't like to put ourselves in any one category. We definitely fall into the doom cat., but I'd like to think of us as just HEAVY. Be it fast or slow, it's got to be heavy. It's usually slow which everybody associates with doom but we do play some faster stuff as well. We go for a mood, not a speed. Whatever the mood calls for, that's what we try to play. We do have some NWOBHM stuff too."

RH: How has local support for the band been so far?

Mike: "As well as expected. We really haven't heard any reactions to the demo yet."

RH. What are some of your lave new bands?

Mike: "Hone that I can think of I listen mostly to older stuff."

RH: Mould you be happy with a small label or a kinge one?

Mike: "As long as we get treated fair and right. I don't care if they're big or small."

RH. How's the interest from Europe so har?



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Mike: "It's still too early to tell. We really haven't been reviewed in any mags yet. We had a pretty good following in Europe before, so I'm assuming it'll be about the same."

RH: I-that do you think of some of the other doom metal bands that have appeared after Bream Beath?

Mike: "Like who?"

RH: Mould you want to be in a band that didn't play doom metal?

Mike: "Not really. I'd like to play some other types of music but not on a permanent basis and definitely not under the name Penance."

AH: Will you be trying to play some shows out of state if there's if there's enough demand?

Mike: "Definitely if there's enough demand, we'd love to. It's kind of hard when you're doing everything on your

own."

Mike: "Thanks for the space in "RH" and watch out for a UK comp. album called "Dark Passages" from Rise Above Records with an issue of Under the Oak with the first several hundred copies. Atrocity recently came to Florida to record their brain eroding full length (just like my dick) LP on Nuclear Blast Records. I've heard an adv. tape of it and it's fuckin' intense fast death metal! Atrocity went on tour with Carcass over the summer and terrorized all who saw them. Well, be sure to pick up their LP, it's out now wimp. Here's the interview with homeboy Mathias Roderer.

RH: Give the history of the band and the current line up. Mathias: "A. was formed five years ago under the name Instigators. After hearing of the Instigators, we changed the name to A. three years ago and in October '88 we recorded the "Instigator" studio which sold about 500 copies. In these days our style was pretty different, we started five years ago

with a Metallica like band and pregressed in the way that we got harder and faster from song to song. After we fired our old drummer (after the demo recording) we could finally sound like me and Alex (voc) always wanted (we two are the only members since the beginning) so we searched for an ideal drummer and found him under his name Migge (he's also playing in two other bands). After this we started rehearsing and recorded the "Blue Blood" 7" after one month in August '89. We had now again two line up changes because of personal and musical problems but since May '90 we have a steady line up again and in July we recorded our first full length album in Tampa, Morrisound called "Hallucinations". Lineup: Alex Krull: vocals, Richard Scharf: guitar, Mathias Roderer: guitar. Oli Klasen: bass, Migge Schwarz: drums."

recording the 7" EP "Blue Blood"? Were you pleased with it? Mathias: "It was a very good experience for us because it was our first really decent recording and the music we wanted to play. We recorded it in two days and one day mixing but we're not satisfied with the endproduct because for example, Migge had to play on a total different drumkit and I had to play on our other guitar player's guitar. I also had to play his leads because two days before the studio he had an accident and a metal block fell on his head and so he wasn't allowed to come to the studio! But I think it's still a good representation of the songs and the sound we used to have in this time! It sold nearly about 4000 copies til now which is a great thing in my eyes! (The 7" will be on the "Hallucinations"

CD) . "

RH: What was it like

RH: How did you get the deal with Nuclear Blast? Mathias: "Markus (NB chief) was since a long time a good friend of us and he lives about one hour driving (with car) away from our rehearsal room so we invited him to a rehearsal and after that he offered us the deal and we both are still very satisfied with each other."

RH: Tell us about the recording of your new full length LP. Mathias: "We recorded the album from the 1st-9th July in Morrisound studio together with Scott Burns and Tom Morris and I think it worked out fine for this short time, we're all very satisfied with the recording!"

RH: What is the name of the LP and some of the songs called? Mathias: "It's called "Hallucinations" and contains eight songs and one short intro (whole time about 37 min.). Some titles are "Deep In Your Subconscious", "Fatal Step", "Defeated Intellect" and "Last Temptation"."

RH: What was your impression of Florida? Mathias: "I really can't say too much because most of the time I was in the studio or in hotel, I also have seen so many things in the last three-four months and I can't digest everything. But I must say it was a great time and all people were very friendly to me, thanx and hello (esp. Mike Browning!) But the climate would be too hot to live there but it's cool for holidays."

RH: How was your tour with Carcass and Disharmonic Orchestra? Mathias: "I think this was the most stressing and the best time in my life, it's been so fantastic and at the end of tour we were one big family."

RH: What was the best show? Mathias: "I think there were a few good days, Paris was great for us and Bern was the best stage, imagine a big hill of dirt and on the top was the drumkit and we've describe your music? stood about five meters below and two other big hills with the PA! A very impressing picture! In Ostrava (CSFR) there were and fast. If you know our 2000 people, a whole hall 7" the album is the same full of maniacs! On the whole tour there were about 10000 people which is very good! (more than 400 in average)."

RH: What bands have you played with so far? Mathias: "We played so far with a whole bunch of bands like Carcass (of course), Disharmonic, Pungent Stench. Disasterous Murmur, Pestilence, Autopsy, Wehrmacht, Entombed, Erosion, Rostok Vampires, Massacra and some more. RH: What are the subjects of some of yours songs? Mathais: "We did a concept album about a girl who ends her life through drug abuse, it starts with "Deep In Your Subconscious" and the lyrics are about this young girl, nearly still a baby gets raped by her father and this will always stay in her subconsious and so this story goes on and on, how Mathias: "Oh, I don't

she dies. It's a fiction but I think it could : happen, it's very realistic. We don't give a message to anybody that we say: be straight, don't take drugs, we just thought this is a very interesting theme and I don't know another band who does a concept album and I hope it's an original idea (only the lyrics are concept, but we tried that all lyrics fit to the songs and melodies)."

RH: How would you Mathias: "Oh that's a very hard question. I think it's death metal but still very technical style but as every band we progressed and I think we did a lot, watch out you'll like it! Imagine a mixture between Morbid

A., Carcass, Watchtower, Nasty Savage."

RH: What are your hobbies? Mathias: "My hobbies are playing music of course, sleeping (alone or...), meeting my friends, partying, playing with my dog, masturbating, getting mail." (I hope not at the same time!-Ed.)

RH: What do you think of pornos? Mathias: "I'm not a sexist but sometimes it's funny especially watching with your parents and grandparents and neighbors and the pope..."

RH: What will the cover art for the LP be? she came to drugs and how know that exactly because



we still try to get another cover as we have at the moment, one of Giger perhaps (it looks like a picture of Dali), it should fit to the title of the album, but it'll be no gory or satanic cover, only a weird one!
"Hallucinations"."

RH: What is your opinion of fanzines?

Mathias: "Great invention! There would be no underground without zines which support the music, thanx to every zine we were able to make to do an interview!"

RH: What are your fave bands at the moment?

Mathias: "Some are Nocturnus, King Diamond, Bangles, Faith No More, Mr. Bungle, Carcass, Nasty Savage, The Cure, Laibach, Suzanne Vega, Black Box, Snab..."

RH: Did you know that
Poison from W. Germany
have reformed and are now
called R.U. Dead? Did you
ever meet those guys or
see them live?
Mathias: "I know their
music but I've never met
them, I think they used

to be one of the best German bands some years ago but if they are the same now, I won't like it."

RH: What's the weirdest thing that has happened to you lately?

Mathias: "Seeing our drummer drinking his piss together with Harald from Disasterous Murmur and dreaming a shitty dream twice!"

RH: What's the best show you saw?

Mathias: "I've seen some shows which I liked the same, for example Laibach, Anal Cunt, ENT, the German guitar ensemble, Youth Of Today, Victims Family, Slayer on the RIB tour, Carcass, Autopsy."

RH: Any future plans, also what merchandise do you have?

Mathias: "Oh yeah, we've a lot of plans, doing new songs, touring again in Europe and America, doing the album of the century, trying to be as original as possible, getting not conceited! Nuclear Blast has some merchandise like one black shirt with a

picture on the front an the logo, we also do not shirts of the LP cover, but if you want them, you're also able to get them at our address, I don't know a price yet because I don't know how expensive the pressing gets, probably about \$8-10 each!"

RH: Last comments?
Thanks!
Mathias: "Thank Bryan for doing an interview with us, hope it's not too boring, buy our album, write us, support the underground, it'll be out in the US too on Important!"





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
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


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
